REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOMS AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing

them to the Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladics of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the session of Parliament, holden in the 7th and 8th years of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled "An Act to amend "the Law respecting the office of County Coro-"ner," it was amongst other things enacted that when and as often as it should seem expedient to the Justices of any county, that such county should be divided into two or more districts for the purposes of that Act, it should be lawful for the said Justices, in General or Quarter Sessions assembled, to resolve that a petition should be presented to Her Majesty praying that such division be made and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such petition until notice thereof should be given to the Coroner or Coroners of such county as thereinafter provided.

And whereas it was, by the same Act, also enacted that the Clerk of the Peace should give notice of any such resolution to every Coroner for such county, and of the time when the petition would be taken by the said Justices into consideration, and the Justices should confer with every such Coroner who should attend the meeting of the Justices for that purpose, touching such petition, having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of the inhabitants, the nature of their employments and such other circumstances as should appear to the Justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of that Act: and such petition,

with a description of the several proposed districts, several parishes and places hereinafter called and of the boundaries thereof with the reasons upon which the petition is founded, should be certified to Her Majesty under the hands and seals of two or more of the Justices present when such petition should be agreed to, and the Clerk of the Peace for such county should forthwith give or send a true copy of such petition, certified under his hand to every Coroner for such county.

And whereas it was by the same Act also enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, if she should think fit, with the advice of Her Privy Council, after taking into consideration any such petition, and also any petition which might be presented to Her, by any Coroner of the same county concerning any such proposed division, or whenever it should seem fit to Her Majesty to direct the issue of a writ "De Coronatore Eligendo," for the purpose of authorizing the election of an additional Coroner above the number of those who had been theretofore customarily elected in such county, to order that such county should be divided into such and so many districts, for the purposes of that Act, as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and to determine at what place within each district, the Court for the election of Coroner for such district should be holden as thereinafter provided, and every such Order should be published in the London Gazette.

And whereas a petition has been presented to Her Majesty by the Justices for the county of

Monmouth, which petition sets forth:

"That the county of Monmouth (exclusive of the manor of Chepstow) for which coroners are elected under Writs de Coronatore Eligendo has been customarily divided into two districts for the purpose of holding inquests during the space of seven years and upwards before the passing of the Act of the 7th and 8th 'years of Your Majesty's reign chapter 92 entitled 'An Act to amend the Law respecting the office of County Coroner' but the said county has not been divided into districts for the purposes of the said Act.

"That one of such customary districts comprises the several parishes and places hereinafter called 'the late Mr. Brewer's District' and the other of such customary districts comprises the thereof:-

'Mr. Batt's District.'

"That it seems expedient to your petitioners that the said county (exclusive of the manor of Chepstow) should be divided into three districts under and for the purposes of the said Act instead of into two customary districts as heretofore.

"That at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said county held on the 16th day of October, 1883 it was resolved that a petition should be presented to Her Majesty praying that such division should be made and the further consideration of such petition was adjourned to the next General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said county appointed to be held on the 1st day of January, 1884.

"That notice of such resolution was given by the Clerk of the Peace for the said county to the said Mr. Batt the sole surviving Coroner and of the time when the petition would be taken by the

said Justices into consideration.

"That on the 24th day of December 1883 Mr. Batt conferred with the Finance Committee of the said Justices and authorized such Committee to report that he assented to the scheme of the petition and that in consequence he did not attend the meeting of the said Justices at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held on the 1st day of January 1884.

"That a true copy of such petition certified under the hand of the said Clerk of the Peace was sent to the said Mr. Batt previously to such

meeting.

"That such three districts should be respectively named 'The Abergavenny District' 'The Monmouth District' and 'The Newport District' and that the Courts for the election of Coroners for such districts should be respectively held in the following places that is to say :- The Court for the election of a Coroner for the Abergavenny District at Abergavenny in the same district the Court for the election of a Coroner for the Monmouth District at Monmouth in the same district and the Court for the election of a Coroner for the Newport District at Newport in the same district.

"3. The population in the late Mr. Brewer's District has materially increased during the rapid and continuous development of the minerals in the county and is disproportionate to that of the remainder of the county.

in relation to the said petition.

And whereas no petition has been presented to Her Majesty by Mr. Edgar Batt the only Coroner of the said county concerning such proposed division.

And whereas Her Majesty has with the advice of Her Privy Council taken into consideration the hereinbefore recited petition.
