(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 28th day of March, 1884.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the farm called The Haceby Lodge Farm, in the parish of Haceby, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, together with so much of Hacebylane (being the public highway from the Bridge End-road to the village of Haceby) as passes through such farm,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the fifteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.
