(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 6th day of May, 1884.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Areas (namely),—(1.) the whole of the parish of Newton-on-Trent, in the petty sessional division of Lincoln, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, and (2.) the whole of the parish of Stickford, in the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire,—which were declared by Orders of Council to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the seventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

THE following Areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the abovementioned Act (except the lines of railway within those Areas so far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those Areas, without untrucking):—

Essex.—The whole of the parish of Bradwell-near-the-Sea, in the county of Essex.
