WHEREAS by Section 9 of the "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," it is enacted to the following effect as to Great Britain, that it shall be lawful for one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, where it shall appear desirable from time to time upon the application of the Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled in any county, to exempt any such county, or part or parts thereof, as to all or any wild birds from the operation of this Act:

And whereas the Justices of the county of Devon, in Quarter Sessions assembled, have applied to me to the effect that an Order should be made to exempt that part of the county of Devon which is comprised within the limits of the Fishery District of the River Exe from the operation of the Act as to "Cormorants" and "Shags":

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the said Act, and on such application as aforesaid, hereby order as follows:—

That part of the county of Devon which is comprised within the limits of the River Exe Fishery District shall be exempted, as to Cormorants and Shags, from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as from the date of this Order.

(No. 89.)—SOUTH AMERICA—EAST COAST.  
BRAZIL.

*Fixed Light on San João Islands.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 269 (1), of 8th September, 1883, on the intended exhibition of a light on San João Islands:—

The Brazilian Government has given notice, that on 1st May, 1884, the light would be exhibited from a lighthouse erected near the north-east extreme of the islands:—

The light is a fixed white light, visible seaward through an arc of 200°; it is elevated 78 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 14 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the third order.

The lighthouse, constructed of iron, and hexagonal in shape (Mitchell system—spiral supports and columns), is painted red. The keeper's dwelling is painted white.

Position approximate on Admiralty Charts, lat. 1° 17½' S., long. 44° 55' W.

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 90.)—BLACK SEA DNIESTR ESTUARY.

(1.) *Tsarigrad Mouth—Re-Exhibition of Beacon Lights and Discontinuance of Fixed Light.*

THE Russian Government has given notice, that towards the end of April, 1884, leading lights would be re-exhibited from two beacons (constructed of wood and painted black), situated on the northern side of Tsarigrad Mouth, Dniestr Estuary.

The western light is a fixed white light, elevated 35 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 7 miles. The eastern light is a fixed red light, elevated 16 feet above the sea, and should be visible from a distance of 5 miles. These lights at present bear from each other N. 50° W. and S. 50° E.

In April, the least depth on the bar of Tsarigrad Mouth, was 6 feet—vessels entering should be guided by the beacons being kept in line, and by the buoys in the channel. Should changes in the channel (which are frequent), prevent the beacons in line being used as a leading mark, the lights will not be exhibited from them, and the only light then shown will be a fixed white light on the south-west side of the channel, near the pilots' house. On the beacon lights being re-exhibited, the fixed white light will be discontinued.

(2.) SEA OF AZOV.

*Berdiansk Point—Permanent Light Re-Exhibited.*  
Also, with Notice to Mariners, No. 4 (2.), of 24th January, 1884, on the electric light, at the southern extremity of Berdiansk Point, being

temporarily shown as a fixed light, pending repairs to the apparatus of the flashing light:—

Further notice has been given, that the light now shown as formerly, a flashing white light at intervals of five seconds.

INNER ROUTE.

(1.) *Reef Reported South-west of Halfway Island.*

THE Government of Queensland has given notice of the reported existence of a reef lying near the course recommended for the Inner Route, and about two-thirds of a mile north-westward of Pearn Reef:—

This reef (Pioneer Reef), of mushroom coral, is stated to be small in extent, awash at low water, and to lie with the following approximate bearings:—

Halfway Island, N.E. ½ N.

South-west Boydong Cay, S.E. ½ E.

Position approximate, lat. 11° 24' 40" S., long. 142° 57' E.

NEW ZEALAND—MIDDLE ISLAND.—EAST COAST.

(2.) *Oamaru—Harbour Light on North Mole.*

The Government of New Zealand has given notice, that on 1st April, 1884, a harbour light would be exhibited from the eastern end of the North Mole at Oamaru:—

The light is a fixed red light, elevated about 14 feet above high water.

On the above date, this light was distant from the green light on the breakwater 800 feet, the lights bearing from each other E.N.E. and W.S.W.; between which is the harbour entrance.

NOTE.—Vessels entering the harbour should give the extremity of the breakwater a berth of at least 30 fathoms, keeping the two red buoys (north and north-west of the breakwater) on the starboard hand, distant 10 to 20 fathoms.

This mole is being daily extended towards the breakwater, and the mole light will gradually tend more southerly from the breakwater light, until the mole is completed, the lights will then bear from each other about N.E. ½ E. and S.W. ½ W.
