By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order, bearing date the twelfth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, defining a part of the Port of London as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs information to the effect that the Egyptian Maritime and Sanitary Authority have imposed a quarantine of twenty-four hours observation, with medical visit and disinfection, upon all arrivals from Italy, and have raised the quarantine hitherto imposed upon arrivals from Saigon, Singapore, Colombo, Point de Galle, and Busrah. The restriction against the importations of rags, carpets, &c., from the Persian Gulf being left in force.
