REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present

themselves at the Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

THE Queen has been graciously pleased to signify Her intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross upon the undermentioned Soldier of Her Majesty's Army, whose claim has been submitted for Her Majesty's approval, for conspicuous bravery at the action of Abu Klea, on the 17th January, 1885, as recorded against his name:—

Regiment.	Name.	Act of Courage for which recommended.
Royal Artillery ...	Gunner Albert Smith	At the Action of Abu Klea, on the 17th January last, when the enemy charged, the square fell back a short distance, leaving Lieutenant Guthrie, Royal Artillery, with his gun, in a comparatively unprotected position. At this moment a native rushed at Lieutenant Guthrie with a spear and would in all probability have killed that officer, who had no weapon in his hand at the time (being engaged in superintending the working of his gun), when Gunner Smith with a gun handspike warded off the thrust, thus giving Lieutenant Guthrie time to draw his sword, and with a blow bring the assailant to his knees, but as the latter fell he made a wild thrust at the Officer with a long knife, which Gunner Smith again warded off, not however before the native had managed to inflict a wound in Lieutenant Guthrie's thigh. Before the Soudani could repeat the thrust Gunner Smith killed him with the handspike and thus for the time saved the life of his Officer, though the latter unfortunately died some days afterwards of his wound.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: (Altering General Accounts Order): Appointment of Stocktaker:—

Rye Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Rye Union, in the Counties of Sussex and Kent;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed (among others) to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Rye Union, it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness, or otherwise, of such Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the said Rye Union may, as and when they shall think fit to do so, appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth.

ARTICLE II.—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations as to the appointment of Officers in force in the said Union for the time being.

ARTICLE III.—The Guardians shall pay to the person or persons appointed under this Order such salary or remuneration as We may from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE IV.—Every person appointed under this Order shall hold office until he shall die, or resign, or be dismissed by the Guardians, subject to Our consent, or be removed by Us, or be proved to be insane by evidence which We may deem sufficient; and the said Guardians shall give notice to Us of every such death or resignation, and state the cause of such resignation, so far as it may be known to them.

Provided nevertheless, that the Guardians may, if they think fit, with Our assent appoint a person or persons to discharge the duties hereby prescribed for the Stocktaker, for a limited period only.

ARTICLE V.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to

do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account."

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

ARTICLE VI.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article V, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form:—

"Submitted to me this _____ day of _____ 188____, and found to be correct as regards the quantities of stock remaining in store.

"(Signed) _____
"Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such addition to the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VII.—The Master of the Workhouse shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article V, submit to him the Stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—The Master of the Workhouse shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE IX.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the above-cited Order dated the fourteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1873," do hereby order that the number of days for the holding of the Fair which has been annually held in the parish of Grantchester, in the county of Cambridge, should be altered, and that the Fair hitherto held in the parish of Grantchester, on the 25th day of July and the two following days in each year, shall in future be held on the 25th day of July only in each year, unless and except the 25th day of July happens to fall on a Saturday or Sunday, in which case the Fair shall be held on the Monday immediately following.

Trinkitat Harbour—Northern Approach.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 35, of 27th February, 1885, on the existence of certain shoals lying in the Approach to Trinkitat Harbour (Taring-hatah) from the northward, the following information—the result of an examination of the locality—has been received from Commander Hon. F. C. Vereker, H.M. surveying vessel "Rambler:"—

SHA'B UL SHUBUK.—A reef extending 6 cables in a north and south direction, and $3\frac{1}{2}$ cables wide, having a small sand cay near the centre, forms the south-east extreme of Sha'b ul Shubuk; this reef is separated from the main reef by a passage 2 cables in width; it may be passed on the eastern side at a distance of about 3 cables.

Position of small sand cay, lat. $18^{\circ} 44' 40''$ N., long. $37^{\circ} 44' 45''$.

A shoal (Rambler Shoal) extending 4 cables in a N.N.W. and S.S.E. direction, and 2 cables wide, with a least depth of 3 fathoms over coral, and $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms around, lies with the sand cay on the south-east extreme of Sha'b ul Shubuk bearing N. 17° E., distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

A circular coral patch (Fairway Patch), 2 cables in diameter, and a least depth of 4 fathoms, lies with the sand cay on the south-east extreme of Sha'b ul Shubuk bearing N. 8° W., distant $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles.

RAS MAKDAH is marked by the most conspicuous of the low sand hills in the vicinity, a ridge 37 feet high. The point is low with three small islets lying northward of it; shoal ground extends $\frac{3}{4}$ to $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles off shore.

MERSA MAKDAH is the bight enclosed between the south-eastern part of Sha'b ul Shubuk and Ras Makdah. Anchorage in 8 to 9 fathoms, sand and mud can be found under the lee of the

reef over the northern portion of the bight; but the southern part is blocked by the shoals extending $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles northward of Ras Makdah.

TRINKITAT HARBOUR.—Off the entrance is an extensive coral reef, named Kat' at Kennashah, which is steep-to and always visible. Between this reef and the harbour entrance is a shoal, extending, within the 5-fathoms line, 2 cables in a north and south direction, and three quarters of a cable in width, with a least depth of 3 fathoms.

The harbour lies 2 miles south-east of Ras Makdah. The entrance is not easily distinguished from seaward, the coast being low and sandy.

Shoal ground extends $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables south-east of the north entrance point of the harbour, and $3\frac{1}{4}$ cables northward of the south entrance point—narrowing the entrance, within the 3-fathoms line, to about half a cable. Two temporary beacons have been erected on the western shore of the harbour, which, kept in line bearing S. 55° W., lead in between the shoals with 24 feet least water. Should the beacons be down, a stranger should buoy the entrance before attempting to enter.

Outside the harbour, there is good anchorage in 6 to 7 fathoms, under shelter of Kat' at Kennashah.

In the vicinity of the harbour, the coast is low and barren, consisting of sand hillocks with scattered scrub. A sandy plain, flooded at times, extends for a considerable distance inland.

Michael Light—Alteration in Arc of Sectors.

Cheduba Strait.

THE following information has been received from the Marine Survey of India, the result of a recent examination of Cheduba Strait and adjacent locality:—

Nerbudda Shoal is a dangerous rocky shoal, extending 5 miles in a N.E. by N. and S.W. by S. direction, lying with its north-east extreme bearing S.E. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., distant 4 miles from Tree or Unguan Island. There are several shoal heads on it, the least water being 9 feet (approximate position, lat. $18^{\circ} 24'$ N., long. $93^{\circ} 59'$ E.) near the north-east extreme. To pass westward of this shoal, do not bring Tree Island westward of north.

Shoals.—A small rocky shoal, with a depth of $2\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, and 7 to 8 fathoms around, lies with Tree Island bearing S. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., distant $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Two small rocky patches of 4 and $5\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms lie (in the vicinity of the breakers reported in 1878) with Beacon Island bearing S.E. by S., distant 8 and 6 miles respectively.

Position of 4-fathoms patch, lat. $19^{\circ} 2'$ N., long. $93^{\circ} 21\frac{1}{2}'$ E.

NOTE.—Vessels navigating the coast outside Cheduba Island should not bring the western shore of that island southward of the bearing S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., to avoid the rocky patches north-west of Beacon Island.

The break in the reefs on the north side of Cheduba Island, locally known as Port Childers, should not be entered.

Cheduba Strait.—Approaching from the northward, vessels should proceed along the coast at the distance of about 3 miles to the entrance of the strait, and when the dome-shaped hillock on the south end of Ramree Hills bears E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., steer for it on that bearing until Sandy Point, Cheduba Island, bears S. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.; the course should then be altered to S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., which will lead through the strait in not less than $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms at low water.

Approaching the strait from the southward, pass eastward of Round Island at the distance of about 2 miles, and when it bears west, steer N.N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. for the west extreme of the land then visible a head. When the summit of Ramree Hills bears E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., alter course to W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., keeping the dome-shaped hillock astern till clear of the strait.

1. CROSBY CHANNEL.

May 4th, 1885, and following days.

West Side. C 1 red conical buoy will be placed N.W. nearly a quarter of a mile from the old station of C 1 red can buoy, and the red conical buoys lettered and numbered C 2, C 3, will be placed in line between it and the Pillar Bell Beacon at Askews Spit, which will be lettered and numbered C 4. Inward from Askews Spit the red conical buoys lettered C, and numbered 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, X, will be placed three-quarters of a mile apart in a line for Rock Lighthouse.

The Rip-Raps Buoy (old C 9 buoy) will be changed to a red conical buoy, bearing the word Rip-Raps in white letters.

East Side. The black can buoy C 1 will be the second buoy inward from Formby Light-vessel, off the edge of Taylor Bank, and nine other black can buoys, lettered C and numbered 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, X, will be placed in 18 feet at low water off the edge of Taylor Bank, and along the Crosby shore to Waterloo. Off Seaforth a similar buoy will be placed on the same line N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. one-third of a mile from the new battery on the end of the North Wall, and will be lettered North Wall.

At the same period as the change of Crosby Channel Buoys, the undermentioned will also be changed:—

SPHERICAL BUOYS.

1. In lieu of the black nun buoy R 9, a spherical buoy, black with two white horizontal bands surmounted with a staff and triangle, will be moored off the south-east end of Brazil Bank, at the entrance to Rock Gut, lettered Brazil.

2. In lieu of the red can buoy F 5, a spherical buoy, black with two white horizontal bands, surmounted with a staff and triangle, will be moored at the junction of Formby and Crosby Channels, off the south end of Jordan Bank, lettered Fy. S.W.

3. A spherical buoy, black with two white horizontal bands, surmounted with a staff and diamond, lettered Knoll, will take the place of the buoy at present moored on Newcome Knoll.

PILLAR BUOYS.

1. Helbre Swash fairway pillar buoy will be painted black and be lettered H-E Fy.

2. A pillar buoy, black with two white horizontal bands, lettered Fy. N.W. will take the place of the black nun buoy now in line with the leading marks for Formby Pool.

2. ROCK CHANNEL.

May 11th, 1885, and following days.

North Side.—From Spencer's Spit inward, the

present black nun buoys will be withdrawn, and eight black can buoys, lettered R and numbered 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, will be placed off the south side of Spencer's Spit, the north bank, and Brazil Bank.

South Side.—The present red can buoys H 5 and R 1 and R 2 will be replaced by red conical buoys, lettered and numbered R 1, 2, 3, number 2 lying with Dove beacons in line.

3. HORSE CHANNEL.

June 1st, 1885, and following days.

West Side.—The buoy known as N.W. buoy of East Hoyle will be altered to a red conical buoy, surmounted with a staff and globe, lettered H 1. Inward from H 1, red conical buoys lettered H and numbered 2, 3, 4, will be placed off the edge of East Hoyle Bank, the latter to occupy the station of the present H 3 at the Elbow of East Hoyle, and a red conical buoy marked H 5 will take the place of the buoy now moored in the Bight of Hoyle.

East Side.—The buoy of the Flats will be changed to a black can buoy with staff and cage, lettered H 1, and a black can buoy lettered H 2, will be placed off the west end of Spencer's Spit, in lieu of, and one-eighth of a mile southward of, the present nun buoy H 2.

4. QUEEN CHANNEL.

June 8th, 1885, and following days.

South Side.—The can buoy now in this channel will be replaced by red conical buoys, lettered Q and numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, occupying the positions of the buoys at present bearing similar numbers.

North Side.—The nun buoys now in the channel will be replaced by the black can buoys, lettered Q and numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, making an additional buoy between the N.W. spit of Jordan Flat and the Bar.

The South Bar Buoy Q 1, red conical, will be surmounted with a staff and globe; and the North Bar Buoy, Q 1 black can, will carry a staff and cage.

5. FORMBY CHANNEL.

June 15th, 1885, and following days.

The Formby Fairway Buoy will be removed, and in lieu thereof a buoy will be moored at each side of the channel, abreast of the present station of the Fairway Buoy, viz.:—On the starboard hand inward, a red conical buoy, lettered F 1, and on the port hand, a black buoy can, lettered F 1, off the west end of Formby Spit, each in 12 feet at low water. Inward on the starboard hand, a red conical buoy F 2, will take the place of the present buoy at the N.E. elbow of Jordan Flats, followed by four similar buoys, lettered and numbered F 3, 4, 5, 6, to be stationed along the margin of the channel, off the east edge of Jordan Bank.

East Side.—A black can buoy, lettered F 2, will be moored in the bight opposite the elbow of Jordan Flats, and on the same side in succession, black can buoys, lettered and numbered F 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, leading into Formby Deep.

HELBRE SWASH.

The black nun buoys will be changed to black can buoys, and the red can buoys to red conical buoys, lettered and numbered as at present.
