THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs Despatches from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris reporting that since the 10th April last, all vessels arriving at French Mediterranean ports from any ports in Spain have been subject to quarantine as arrivals without clean bills of health, and on this ground subject to a quarantine of three to five days, and that the quarantine which had been imposed on vessels from Gibraltar has been done away with.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Wednesday, the 5th proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Act 40 Vic., cap. 2, to the amount of £4,065,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 8th day of August, 1885, and will be payable at three or six months after date (at the option of the persons tendering), viz.:—on the 8th November or 8th February next, respectively.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Thursday, the 6th proximo, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Saturday, the 8th proximo.

6. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
