Privy Council Office, August 3, 1885.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the existing Corporation of Sutton Coldfield, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882.

"WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Act 1882, it is enacted that where a petition for a Charter of incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Act named and containing such provisions as are in the said Act particularised:

"And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the parish of Sutton Coldfield in the county of Warwick have petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for the grant of a Charter of incorporation:

"And whereas the said petition for a Charter has been referred to the Committee of Council and it is proposed to create the said district a Municipal Borough and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, and by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter:

"And whereas Sutton Coldfield is a place named in the schedule to the Municipal Corporations Act 1883 and the area of the said place is co-extensive with the area of the Municipal Borough proposed to be created by the said Charter:

"And whereas by the Municipal Corporations Act 1883 it is enacted that nothing in that Act shall prevent the application to any place of any Charter applying the Municipal Corporations Acts which Her Majesty may be pleased to grant or affect anything done in pursuance of those Acts or any scheme thereunder, and shall not affect the operation of any such Charter thing or scheme save that nothing in the said Acts or scheme shall authorize the establishment or continuance of any court for the trial of civil actions, and that nothing in that Act shall affect the right to the benefit of any charity or shall alter or confer any power of altering the defined charitable purposes (if any) to which any property was by law applicable at the passing of that Act:

"And whereas the Warden and Society of the

Royal Town of Sutton Coldfield is a local authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882:

"And whereas the parish of Sutton Coldfield is within the district of the Guardians of the Aston Union as the Rural Sanitary Authority of the said Union. And whereas the said Guardians as such Rural Sanitary Authority are a local authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and it is expedient that all property and liabilities vested in or attaching to the said Rural Sanitary Authority so far as the same relate to the said parish should be transferred to the new Corporation in manner provided by this scheme:

"And whereas it is expedient right and just that a scheme should be settled pursuant to Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 containing the provisions hereinafter contained:

"Now therefore the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein and do hereby order and declare as follows:—

"1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Sutton Coldfield Scheme 1885.

"2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the Charter above referred to or at the date of its confirmation by Parliament or Order in Council whichever is later. This date is herein mentioned as the 'commencement of this Scheme.'

"3. The Warden and Society of the Royal Town of Sutton Coldfield is herein referred to as the 'Old Corporation.' The Corporation of the Municipal Borough created by the Charter above-mentioned is herein referred to as the 'New Corporation.'

"4. The Municipal Borough created by the Charter above referred to shall be and is hereby placed immediately on from and after the commencement of this Scheme within the jurisdiction of the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Sutton Coldfield acting by the Council of the said Borough as the Sanitary Authority, and shall no longer be within the jurisdiction authority or district of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Aston Union.

"5. Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the Old Corporation shall be and the same is hereby abolished and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist together with all the franchises rights privileges powers jurisdiction authority and exemptions of the Old

Corporation and its members and officers as such of what kind soever they may be which have no pecuniary value.

"6. All property of any kind whatsoever (other than the property dealt with by paragraph 7 hereof) possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation, or any of its members as such, which property is within the meaning of the second subsection of Section 4 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, applicable to charity, or applicable to defined charitable purposes at the passing of that Act, shall immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme vest in the Rev. William Campbell Riland Bedford, of Broomie Close, Allen Lepard Crockford, of the Limes, Doe Bank, Esq., Henry Duncalfe, of Tudor Hill, Esq., Thomas Hayward, of the Manor House, Sutton Coldfield, Esq., George Lowe, of 2, Wellington-terrace, Sutton Coldfield, Esq., the Rev. Albert Smith, of the Grammar School, Sutton Coldfield, Samuel Allen Taylor, of the Hollies, Four Oaks, Esq., and the Rev. Montagu Webster, of Hill Vicarage, Sutton Coldfield (who are hereby designated collectively as the "Trustees of Municipal Charities in the Borough of Sutton Coldfield") jointly to be by them applied in the manner in which and for the purposes for which such property, or the income thereof, was before and at the passing of that Act applicable.

"7. All property other than that in paragraph 6 hereof referred to, possessed by, or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation, or any of its members as such, being the property referred to in the schedule hereto and the whole right thereto and interest therein shall vest in the New Corporation, and (save as is hereinafter expressly directed) shall by the New Corporation be held and applied exclusively for the Municipal purposes of the Municipal Borough created as aforesaid, and the public benefit of the inhabitants of the said Borough.

"8. All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Old Corporation or the property thereof shall attach to and be enforceable against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 7 may extend to satisfy such liabilities, and no further.

"9. Any investigation legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any debt liability right penalty or forfeiture due or belonging to or incurred by or on behalf of the Old Corporation before the commencement of this scheme (save only such proceedings of every kind as may have been or might be commenced or taken against the Old Corporation in respect of the administration of its charitable property or funds in paragraph 6 hereof referred to) may be continued prosecuted or enforced by the New Corporation or against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 7 may extend to satisfy such liabilities and no further.

"10. Any sewers drains culverts pipes or other sanitary works situate within the parish of Sutton Coldfield being the property of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Aston Union and used by them solely for the purpose of the drainage water supply cleansing or sanitary purposes of the said parish and all liabilities attaching to the said Rural

Sanitary Authority incurred solely for the purposes of the said parish and such proportion of the liabilities attaching to the said Rural Authority incurred for the purposes of the said parish and the rest of the district of the said Authority jointly as is hereinafter mentioned shall immediately from and after the commencement of this scheme vest in and attach to the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the said Municipal Borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough in lieu of the said Rural Sanitary Authority and the said liabilities shall be defrayed out of and shall be a charge upon the district fund and general district rate of the said Municipal Borough. The proportion above-mentioned is such part of the said liabilities incurred for the purposes of the said parish and district jointly as bears the same proportion to the whole of such liabilities that the rateable value of the property within the said parish for the purposes of a General District rate bears at the commencement of this Scheme to the rateable value of the property within the whole of the said district for the purposes of a separate rate for special expenses.

"11. The term property in this Scheme means and includes all property real and personal and all things in action and all rights of common or commonable rights and rights to toll and all franchises privileges and rights which have any pecuniary value and all charters records deeds books and documents and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

"12. Every officer of the Old Corporation who shall be in an office of profit at the time of the commencement of this Scheme, whose office is abolished or who shall be removed from his office by reason of the grant of the new Charter and the operation of this Scheme and who in the opinion of the Local Government Board does not obtain an equally profitable office under the New Corporation, may apply to the Local Government Board, and that Board if satisfied that under all the circumstances of the case he ought to receive compensation may order that he shall receive such compensation as the Board may think just and such compensation shall be paid out of the Borough Fund of the New Corporation. The decision of the Local Government Board shall be in all respects final and conclusive."

SCHEDULE.

THE CHASE OR PARK PROPERTY.

The Manor or Lordship of Sutton Coldfield (which description shall not include lands or monies produced by the sale of lands), the Chase and Park of Sutton Coldfield, all and singular the messuages, with lands, tenements, woods, underwoods, rents, reversions, services, pools, streams, water-courses, and all other hereditaments whatsoever within the said Chase or Park, and all other rights, liberties, franchises, privileges, emoluments, and appurtenances to the said Manor or Lordship and to the said Chase or Park, under and by virtue of any Royal or other Charters, or otherwise belonging or appertaining.

THE MOOT HALL PROPERTY.

All those several pieces or parcels of land, situate in the said parish of Sutton Coldfield, fronting the street there called Mill-street, adjoining at the lower or south end thereof to certain buildings called the Almshouses, at the upper or north end to a road leading to the parish

church, and at the back thereof to a certain public road. And also all the Town Hall, with a building adjoining, used as a police station, and also a dwelling-house and premises, now and for many years past occupied by Charles Beech, an officer of the Old Corporation of Sutton Coldfield, erected and built on the said land, or on some part thereof.

All and singular the several closes, pieces, or parcels of land, and land covered with water, containing in the whole 17 acres and 8 perches, situate in the parish of Sutton Coldfield, in the county of Warwick, part thereof being within Sutton Park aforesaid, and known as Keeper's Pool, and the other part thereof adjoining to Sutton Park aforesaid, comprised in a certain indenture, dated the 21st day of May, 1879, and made between Ralph Smyth, Henry Lannoy Hunter, Robert Edward Henry, and George Cecil Henry of the first part, Charles Stuart Henry and the Honourable Louisa Harriet Henry, his wife, of the second part, the Reverend James Joseph Myrton Cunynghame, Charles William Paulett, and George Nevitt Bennett, of the third part, the Reverend Thomas Bond Bird Robinson, and the Honourable Emily Charlotte Robinson, his wife, of the fourth part, Sir William Biddulph Parker, Sir George Thomas Francis Shuckburgh, Francis Compton, and Thomas William Lloyd, of the fifth part, Sir Theophilus William Biddulph and the Honourable Dame Mary Agnes Biddulph, his wife, of the sixth part, Edward John Ward Ashton, Charles Pole Stuart, and Francis Travers Longworth Dames the younger, of the seventh part, the said Ralph Smyth and the Honourable Selina Constance Smyth, his wife, of the eighth part, Sir Arthur Edward Middleton, Bart., Charles Edward Stephen Cooke Bevil Granville, and the said Francis Compton, of the ninth part, Edward William Blackett and the Honourable Julia Francis Blackett, his wife, of the tenth part, and the Warden and Society of Sutton Coldfield, in the county of Warwick, of the eleventh part, being a conveyance to the said Warden and Society, which premises are more particularly described in in a tabulated schedule to the said indenture, and in a plan thereon indorsed; and also all that the sum of £2,546 13s. 3d. Consols, standing in the name of the Accountant-General, being stock purchased with the balance of the sum of £6,000 paid by the Midland Railway Company in respect of lands in Sutton Park aforesaid, taken, purchased, or acquired from the said Warden and Society of Sutton Coldfield, by the said Railway Company.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following Translation of a Decree of the King of Sweden in respect of quarantine:—

H.M. Gracious Decree relating to quarantine regulations to be applied in cases of cholera occurring in, or in the vicinity of, a port in Europe. Given at Stockholm, June 12, 1885.

WE, Oscar, by the Grace of God, &c., &c., &c., decreed as follows:—

§ 1.—Sect. 1. As soon as the Board of Commerce have received information that cases of cholera have occurred in, or in the vicinity of, a port in Europe, the Board shall declare such port infected with cholera, as also the adjacent districts, to such extent as may be deemed advisable in consequence of the situation, the spread of the disease, or any other circumstances.

Sect. 2. Any district thus declared to be infected with cholera shall continue to be considered infected until the Board of Commerce has proclaimed that the disease has ceased there.

Sect. 3. Even though the Board of Commerce may not have had time to issue a notice to that effect, any port in Europe shall be considered infected with cholera as soon as reliable information has been received that cases of cholera have occurred there.

Sect. 4. The above-mentioned notices, which are likewise to contain a statement of the districts in Europe, which on the ground of notices previously issued, are still to be considered infected, shall, without delay, be sent, in a requisite number of copies, to the General Customs Administration, to the Pilot Administration, and to our Governors of Provinces, in order to be speedily distributed to all the authorities.

§ 2. Any vessel having sailed from, or during her voyage called at, or in any other way had communication with a district which, conformably to § 1, is to be considered infected with cholera, must call at the quarantine at Kängsö, in order to be inspected by the quarantine physician with regard to the state of health on board; therefore, any such vessel attempting to call at any other port than Kängsö, shall immediately be directed to go there.

§ 3. Any vessel having arrived at Kängsö, in pursuance of the stipulations in § 2, shall there undergo quarantine, together with her crew and passengers.

(α.) In case six days have not elapsed since the vessel sailed from, or called at, or had any other

communication with, a district infected with cholera.

(b.) In case during the voyage of the ship there has been on board any person who has been ill or died of the cholera, or of any illness suspected to be that of cholera, or the vessel during her voyage has had communication with any other vessel on board of which at the time there has been any such sick or dead person; and

(c.) In case, on the arrival of the vessel at Kängsö, there should be on board any person who is ill or has died of cholera, or any other illness suspected to be cholera, or if any one on board the vessel during her detention at Kängsö, fall ill or die of such disease,

The quarantine to continue until six days have elapsed, reckoned in the case referred to under (a), from the day the vessel has left or touched at or otherwise had any communication with a district infected with cholera; in the case referred to under (b), from the day of the arrival of the vessel at Kängsö; and in the case referred to under (c) from the day the last sick or dead person was carried away from the vessel.

§ 4. In case it be found on inspection that a vessel is not subject to quarantine in pursuance of § 3, a certificate shall be given to that effect.

§ 5. The regulations enacted in the Gracious Decree of September 5, 1884, relating to an extended application of the present regulations for the hospital for quarantine at Kängsö, shall be applied in pursuance of § 2, when vessels arrive at the place of quarantine.

§ 6. In addition to which the provisions contained in the Ordinance of the 19th March, 1875, relating to measures against the introduction and spreading of contagious diseases amongst the inhabitants of the Kingdom, shall continue to be observed, and in case of instances of cholera occurring in or in the vicinity of a port on the Baltic, we will see whether any special regulations with reference to this question may be required.

And this all whom it may concern shall obediently observe.
