*Buckingham Palace, January 21, 1886.*

**T**HIS day Her Majesty proceeded in state from Buckingham Palace to the House of Peers, where she arrived soon after two o'clock; and was received on alighting from Her state carriage, by the Lord Chancellor, the Lord President, the Lord Privy Seal, the Deputy Lord Great Chamberlain (Lord Aveland), the Earl Marshal, Garter King of Arms, and Black Rod, and proceeded into the House in the usual order:—The Crown was borne by the Duke of Portland, the Sword of State by the Marquess of Salisbury, K.G., and the Cap of Maintenance by the Marquess of Winchester.

Her Majesty being seated on the Throne, and the Great Officers of State and others standing in their respective places on the right and left, Black Rod was sent with a message from Her Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their immediate attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, Her Majesty was pleased to deliver to the Lord Chancellor the following most gracious Speech to both Houses of Parliament, which Her Majesty commanded his Lordship to read, and which he accordingly did:

*My Lords and Gentlemen,*

My relations with other Powers continue to be of a friendly character.

The difference which existed, when I last addressed you, between my Government and that of Russia, on the subject of the boundaries of Afghanistan, has been satisfactorily adjusted. In pursuance of a Convention which will be laid before you, the English and Russian Commissioners, with the full concurrence of my ally, the Amir of Afghanistan, have been engaged in demarcating the frontier of that country. I trust that their work, which is already far advanced, may tend to secure the continuance of peace in Central Asia.

A rising in Eastern Roumelia has given expression to the desire of the inhabitants for a change in the political arrangements under which they were placed by the Treaty of Berlin. My object, in the negotiations which have followed, has been to bring them, according to their wish, under the rule of the Prince of Bulgaria, while maintaining unimpaired the essential rights of His Imperial Majesty the Sultan.

Under a Convention which has been concluded with the Ottoman Porte, Commissioners have been appointed on behalf of England and Turkey to

confer with His Highness the Khedive, and to report upon the measures required for securing the defence of Egypt and the stability and efficiency of the Government in that country.

Greatly to my regret, I was compelled in the month of November to declare war against Theebaw, the King of Ava. Acts of hostility on his part against my subjects and the interests of my Empire had, since his accession, been deliberate and continuous. These had necessitated the withdrawal of my Representative from his Court; and my demands for redress were systematically evaded and disregarded. An attempt to confiscate the property of my subjects trading under agreement in his dominions, and a refusal to settle the dispute by arbitration, convinced me that the protection of British life and property, and the cessation of dangerous anarchy in Upper Burmah, could only be effected by force of arms. The gallantry of my European and Indian Forces, under Lieutenant-General Sir Harry Prendergast, rapidly brought the country under my power; and I have decided that the most certain method of insuring peace and order in those regions is to be found in the permanent incorporation of the Kingdom of Ava with my Empire. Papers on this subject will be immediately laid before you.

The time which has elapsed since I assumed the direct Government of India makes it desirable that the operation of the Statutes by which that change was effected should be carefully investigated. I commend this important matter to your earnest attention.

A protracted negotiation respecting the rights of the Republic of France on the coasts of Newfoundland, under the Treaty of Utrecht, has been brought to a satisfactory conclusion by an Agreement, which will be laid before you and before the Legislature of Newfoundland as soon as it assembles. An Agreement has also been made with Spain, securing to this country all commercial rights granted to Germany in the Caroline Islands.

Your consent will be asked to legislative measures rendered necessary by a Convention on the subject of International Copyright to which I have agreed.

*Gentlemen of the House of Commons,*

The Estimates for the expenditure of the ensuing year, which have been framed with a due regard to efficiency and economy, will be submitted to you.

*My Lords and Gentlemen,*

I regret to say that no material improvement can be noted in the condition of trade or agriculture. I feel the deepest sympathy for the great number of persons, in many vocations of life, who are suffering under a pressure which I trust will prove to be transient.

I have seen with deep sorrow the renewal, since I last addressed you, of the attempt to excite the people of Ireland to hostility against the Legislative Union between that country and Great Britain. I am resolutely opposed to any disturbance of that fundamental law, and in resisting it I am convinced that I shall be heartily supported by my Parliament and my people.

The social no less than the material condition of that country engages my anxious attention. Although there has been during the last year no marked increase of serious crime, there is in many places a concerted resistance to the enforcement of legal obligations; and I regret that the practice of organized intimidation continues to exist. I have caused every exertion to be used for the detection and punishment of these crimes; and no effort will be spared on the part of my Government to protect my Irish subjects in the exercise of their legal rights and the enjoyment of individual liberty. If, as my information leads me to apprehend, the existing provisions of the law should prove to be inadequate to cope with these growing evils, I look with confidence to your willingness to invest my Government with all necessary powers.

Bills will be submitted to you for transferring to representative Councils in the counties of Great Britain local business which is now transacted by the Courts of Quarter Sessions and other authorities. A measure for the reform of county government in Ireland is also in preparation. These measures will involve the consideration of the present incidence of local burdens.

A Bill for facilitating the sale of glebe lands, in a manner adapted to the wants of the rural population, will also be submitted to you; as also Bills for removing the difficulties which prevent the easy and cheap transfer of land; for mitigating the distressed condition of the poorer classes in the Western Highlands and Islands of Scotland; for the more effectual prevention of accidents in mines; for extending the powers of the Railway Commission in respect to the regulation of rates; and for the codification of the criminal law.

I trust that results beneficial to the cause of education may issue from a Royal Commission, which I have appointed to inquire into the working of the Education Acts.

The prompt and effective dispatch of the important business which, in an ever-growing proportion, falls to you to transact, will, I doubt not, occupy your attention.

In these and in all other matters pertaining to your high functions, I earnestly commend you to the keeping and guidance of Almighty God.

A PROCLAMATION,

In order to the Electing a Peer of Scotland.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Cunningham, Baron Borthwick, was duly elected and returned to be one of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland to sit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and is since deceased: In

order to the Electing another Peer of Scotland to sit in his room, We do, by the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood House, at Edinburgh, on Thursday, the fourth day of February next ensuing, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and choose another Peer of Scotland to sit and vote in the House of Peers in this present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in the room of the said Cunningham, Baron Borthwick, deceased, by open election and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the proxies of such as shall be absent (such proxies being Peers and producing a mandate in writing duly signed before witnesses, and both the constituent and proxy being qualified according to law): and the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such meeting, and to administer the oaths required by law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their votes; and immediately after such election made and duly examined, to certify the name of the Peer so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the electors, and return such certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: and We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, ten days at least before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed on such election.

Given at Our Court at *Osborne House, Isle of Wight*, this nineteenth day of *January*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in the forty-ninth year of Our reign.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Article 1987 clause 2 of Your Majesty's Regulations of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine for the Government of the Royal Navy, it is provided that Naval and Greenwich Hospital Pensions for Officers shall not be held in addition to any other pension, unless it be

a pension conferred for wounds or injuries received in the Service; and whereas we are of opinion that this provision should not apply to Officers who are in receipt of any pension or annuity granted with the Victoria Cross or the Conspicuous Gallantry Medal, we beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to cancel the above mentioned clause of Article 1987, and substitute the following, viz.:—

“2. These pensions shall not be held in addition to any other pension unless it be either a pension or an annuity conferred for wounds or injuries received in the Service, or with the Victoria Cross and its additional bars, or with the Conspicuous Gallantry Medal.”

Her Majesty having taken the said memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the third day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty chapter seventy of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-seven of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-two, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints situate in the parish of Leyton in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans.

“Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Leyton and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint James Walthamstow in the county and diocese aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and new parish respectively.

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of Leyton and of the said new parish of Saint James Walthamstow should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of All Saints situate in the parish of Leyton as aforesaid.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas Legh Bishop of the said

diocese of Saint Albans as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his See of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint James Walthamstow, and with the consent of the Reverend Edward Jones Brewster Clerk in Holy Orders of the National Club No. 1 Whitehall-gardens in the county of Middlesex the patron of the vicarage of the said parish of Leyton (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Leyton and of the said new parish of Saint James Walthamstow which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of All Saints situate in the parish of Leyton as aforesaid and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints Leyton.’

“We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints Leyton being:—

“All that portion of the parish of Leyton in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans, together with all that portion of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Saint James Walthamstow in the same county and diocese (the said latter portion being a part of the territory called or known as ‘The Walthamstow Slip’ and being detached from the said new parish of Saint James Walthamstow) all which said portions of the two cures aforesaid are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Leyton from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Stephen Walthamstow in the county and diocese aforesaid at the northern point of Knotts Green where Lea Bridge-road is joined by the road called or known as Chestnut-walk and by the road which leads along the eastern side of Knotts Green aforesaid and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road which leads to Leyton Green and extending thence first southward and then south-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road which leads along the eastern side of Leyton Green, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with High-street Leyton, and continuing thence still southward along the middle of the said street for a distance of eight and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Skelton's-lane and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to its junction with King-street and with Burchill-road and continuing thence still south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Vicarage-road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance

of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Park-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to its junction with Church-lane and with Marsh-lane and continuing thence still south-westward for a distance of forty-three chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-described lane and along the middle of the public footpath which leads in continuation of the same lane to the River Lea, (thereby passing under the Cambridge Line of the Great-Eastern Railway) to the point where the same footpath strikes the northern bank of the said river, and extending thence southward and in a direct line to a point in the middle of the same river upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Leyton from the consolidated chapelry of All Souls Clapton Park in the county of Middlesex, and the diocese of London and extending thence alternately westward, southward, eastward, southward and finally westward along the last-named boundary and also in part along the boundary which divides the said detached portion of the new parish of Saint James Walthamstow from the consolidated chapelry of All Souls Clapton Park aforesaid for a distance of fifty-seven and a half chains or thereabouts thereby following the middle of the said river, to the point where the same river is joined by the Hackney Cut, and where the boundary which divides the said parish of Leyton from the consolidated chapelry of All Souls Clapton Park as aforesaid joins the boundary which divides the said parish of Leyton from the new parish of Saint James Clapton in the said county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London aforesaid and extending thence first north-westward then north-eastward and then again north-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts, thereby following, in part, the middle of the River Lea aforesaid, to the point where the same boundary again strikes the said River Lea, and joins the boundary dividing the said parish of Leyton from the new parish of Saint Matthew Upper Clapton in the said county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London aforesaid, and extending thence first north-eastward and then north-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts thereby following the middle of the River Lea aforesaid, to the point where the same boundary joins the boundary dividing the said parish of Leyton from the main body of the new parish of Saint James Walthamstow aforesaid and extending thence north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of one mile and thirty-one chains or thereabouts (thereby recrossing the Cambridge Line of the Great Eastern Railway aforesaid, and passing in part along the south-eastern side of Boundary-road) to the point where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said parish of Leyton from the parish of Walthamstow in the said county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans aforesaid and continuing thence still north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts (thereby continuing to pass along the south-eastern side of Boundary-road aforesaid), to the point at the junction of the last-named road with Hoe-street where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said parish of Leyton from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Stephen Walthamstow aforesaid, and extending thence first, south-eastward and then north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of

thirty-one and a-half chains or thereabouts (thereby passing along the middle of Hoe-street aforesaid and along the middle of Lea Bridge-road aforesaid) to the first-described point, at Knott's Green aforesaid, where the last-named road joins the road culled or known as Chestnut-walk as aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of St. Albans.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the tenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to a certain benefice namely the church and cure (being a rectory) of Saint Martin (otherwise and commonly called Carfax) in the city of Oxford and in the diocese of Oxford, by way of exchange for the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to a certain other benefice namely the church and cure (being a rectory) of Scotton; with the chapelry of East Ferry annexed (hereinafter called the benefice of Scotton with East Ferry) in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Martin, otherwise Carfax, in the city of Oxford, is vested in Your Majesty Your heirs and successors, in right of the Crown, and the yearly value of the said benefice in the King's Book is, as we believe, less than twenty pounds, and the patronage thereof is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Scotton with East Ferry is vested in the Warden Council and Scholars of Keble College in the University of Oxford and in their successors.

"And whereas the Right Honourable Hardinge Stanley Baron Halsbury, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain and the Reverend Edward Stuart Talbot Clerk in Holy Orders Warden of the said College, and the Council and Scholars of the same College, have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said two benefices may be assigned and transferred by way of exchange in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said benefices and patronage and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty that the circumstances and present values of the said benefices respectively are as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Hardinge Stanley Baron Halsbury, acting as Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain (in testimony whereof he has affixed his signature and seal to this scheme) and with the consent of the said Edward Stuart Talbot the Warden, and of the Council and Scholars of Keble College aforesaid (in testimony whereof the said Warden Council and Scholars have affixed their common or corporate seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of

patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Martin otherwise Carfax in the city of Oxford now vested in Your Majesty Your heirs and successors as aforesaid and exercised on Your Majesty's behalf by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain as aforesaid, shall be transferred from Your Majesty Your heirs and successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Warden Council and Scholars of Keble College aforesaid in the University of Oxford, and their successors for ever: and that, in exchange for the same, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Scotton with East Ferry in the county and diocese of Lincoln now vested as aforesaid in the said Warden Council and Scholars of Keble College aforesaid, shall thereupon and thenceforth be transferred from them the said Warden Council and Scholars and from their successors, and shall be absolutely vested in Your Majesty Your heirs and successors and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Hardinge Stanley, Baron Halsbury, or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, for the time being, acting on behalf of Your Majesty in right of the Crown.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a rectory) of Bingham in the county of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell, between that benefice and two other benefices namely the benefice (being a vicarage) of Shelford and the benefice (being a vicarage) of Burton Joyce with the chapelry of Bulcote annexed which said two last-named benefices are also situate in the said county of Nottingham and in the said diocese of Southwell.

"Whereas the Right Honourable Henry Howard Molyneux Earl of Carnarvon is the patron of all the said three benefices, that is to say, of the benefice of Bingham, and of the benefice of Shelford, and of the benefice of Burton Joyce with Bulcote; and he has requested us to recommend to Your Majesty in Council the apportionment hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said two benefices of Shelford and Burton Joyce with Bulcote are at present insufficiently endowed, and that the said benefice of Bingham has endowments of such an amount as that after the two charges hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been placed upon the same endowments, the said benefice of Bingham will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas the Right Reverend George Bishop of the said diocese of Southwell is of opinion, and we are of opinion that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the parish of Shelford and within the parish of Burton Joyce and the chapelry of Bulcote by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Bingham which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Bingham is now full; and the rector thereof the Reverend Percy Howard Droosten Clerk in Holy Orders is willing that the said apportionment shall be made accordingly, and has executed this scheme in token of such his willingness.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Henry Howard Molyneux Earl of Carnarvon, acting as patron of each of the said three benefices as aforesaid and with the consent of the said George Bishop of the said diocese of Southwell acting as such Bishop, and with the consent of the said Percy Howard Droosten acting as such rector or incumbent as aforesaid of the said benefice of Bingham (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed this scheme and sealed the same with their several seals) (the seal of the said George Bishop of Southwell being his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the twenty-fifth day of October one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three all the tithe rent-charges glebe lands and all (if any) other the endowments belonging to the said benefice of Bingham shall stand and be charged and for ever thenceforth be chargeable in favour of the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Shelford, and in favour of the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Burton Joyce with Bulcote

respectively with the annual sums or yearly charges hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly charge of one hundred pounds in favour of the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Shelford and a clear annual sum or yearly charge of one hundred pounds in favour of the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Burton Joyce with Bulcote the same two annual sums or yearly charges of one hundred pounds and one hundred pounds respectively to be as from the day aforesaid due and payable the one of them to the incumbent of the said benefice of Shelford and the other of them to the incumbent of the said benefice of Burton Joyce with Bulcote, and each of the same annual sums or yearly charges to be apportionable between any outgoing incumbent of the benefice in favour of which the same is charged as aforesaid or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same incumbency on the other hand; and to be receivable by the incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year and a proportionate part of such half-yearly payments being due and payable to the said incumbents of the benefices of Shelford and Burton Joyce with Bulcote respectively as from the said twenty-fifth day of October one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three to the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

"And we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further recommend and propose that the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Shelford, and the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Burton Joyce with Bulcote respectively shall have the following powers for recovering the said rent-charge of one hundred pounds per annum and such proportionate parts thereof as aforesaid hereby proposed to be created in favour of the benefice of which he is incumbent as aforesaid (that is to say) power, if and whenever any part of the said rent-charge shall at any time be unpaid for twenty-one days after any of the times appointed for the payment thereof (although there shall not have been any legal demand made therefor) to enter into the receipt of the endowments charged therewith or any part thereof, and to receive and take the same until he shall thereby or otherwise be paid and satisfied the same rent-charge and the arrears thereof due at the time of such entry or afterwards to become due during his being in possession of the same premises together with all costs and expenses occasioned by the non-payment thereof, and for the purpose of collecting receiving and recovering such endowments or any of them to use exercise and enjoy all such powers and remedies for collecting recovering and enforcing payment thereof and of the annual sums payable for or towards the raising or making up the same as may be statutorily exercised or exercisable by him under the law then in force.

"Provided always that if at any time the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Bingham shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him grant convey and annex to the said benefice of Shelford or to the said benefice of Burton Joyce with Bulcote or to each of them respectively, any part or parts of the rectorial endowments belonging to the said benefice of Bingham which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Southwell for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent



for that one of the said two yearly rent-charges of one hundred pounds and one hundred pounds hereby recommended to be created as aforesaid which is so proposed to be created in favour of the benefice to which such part or parts of the same rectorial endowments shall be so granted conveyed and annexed as aforesaid or for both of the same two yearly rent-charges then the same annual sum or yearly charge of one hundred pounds (or, as the case may be, both of the same sums) shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and determine, and be no longer payable as hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwell.

"The District Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist Heatherlands being:—
