PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS under a Convention lately entered into between the Postmaster-General of the United Kingdom and the Imperial German Postal Administration, each party guarantees the right of transit for Parcels over their territory, to or from any country with which they respectively have Parcel Post communication, subject to the stipulations in the said Convention contained.

And whereas the Imperial German Postal Administration has a Parcel Post communication with Switzerland, and the said Postal Administration has agreed with Her Majesty's Postmaster-General to effect the exchange of Parcels transmitted by post by way of Germany between the United Kingdom and Switzerland upon the terms in the said Convention mentioned.

And whereas the Postal Administration of Switzerland has agreed to accept from the Postal Administration of Germany Parcels posted in England and addressed to places in Switzerland, and to deliver such Parcels and also to allow Parcels addressed to England to be posted in Switzerland and to hand such Parcels to the Postal Administration of Germany for transmission to England.

And whereas it is expedient for the due carrying out of the said arrangement that certain rates of postage to be charged in respect of Parcels should be fixed as hereinafter appears, and that Parcels should be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered, subject to the regulations, conditions, prohibitions, and restrictions hereinafter appearing.

Now, We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :--

Interpretation Clause.

1.—(1.) The expressions "Parcels" and "Parcel" in this Warrant respectively mean any postal packet, which is posted as a parcel, in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same. (2.) The expression "United Kingdom" in-

(2.) The expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

(3.) The expression "Lord Lieutenant" means the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland for the time being.

(4.) The expression "arms" includes any cannon, gun, revolver, pistol, and any description of fire-arms, also any sword, cutlass, pike, and bayonet, also any part of any arms as so defined.

(5.) The expression "ammunition" includes bullets, gunpowder, nitro-glycerine, dynamite, guncotton, and every other explosive substance, whether fitted for use with any arms or otherwise.

(6.) The expression "prohibited district in Ireland" means any place in Ireland in respect of which the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council in Ireland, may have made or may make orders for prohibiting or regulating therein the sale or importation of arms and ammunition.

Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

2. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by * post between the United Kingdom and Switzerland.

Maximum Dimensions and Weight.

3. There shall not be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by post under this Warrant from the United Kingdom any Parcel the dimensions of which shall exceed in any direction two feet, or which shall exceed in weight seven pounds.

Rates of Postage.

4. On all Parcels transmitted by post under this Warrant from the United Kingdom to Switzerland there shall be charged and paid the following rates of postage (that is to say):---

- If such Parcels are sent by way of Hamburg:
 - On every Parcel not exceeding three pounds in weight, one shilling and five pence.
 - On every Parcel exceeding three pounds and not exceeding seven pounds in weight, two shillings.

- If such Parcels are sent by way of Belgium : On every Parcel not exceeding three pounds
 - in weight, one shilling and nine pence. On every Parcel exceeding three pounds and not exceeding seven pounds in weight, two shillings and two pence.

Prepayment.

5. The postage on Parcels posted in the United Kingdom shall in all cases (except as otherwise provided in this Warrant) be prepaid at the time of posting by means of adhesive postage stamps.

Times of Posting.

6. Parcels intended to be transmitted by post may, in the United Kingdom, be posted on any day of the week except Sunday, but shall not be posted on Sundays, or in England or Ireland, on Christmas Day or Good Friday, and in Scotland on either of the two Sacramental Fast Days, except in the cases next hereinafter mentioned, that is to say :--

Where the delivery of Parcels on Sundays, or any of the other days aforesaid, at certain Post Offices, to addressees calling for the same, may hereafter be specially authorized by the Postmaster-General, the posting of Parcels on Sundays, or such other days as aforesaid, at such offices respectively, shall also be permitted within such times and in such manner as may be directed ' by the Postmaster-General.

Mode of Posting.

7. Except as otherwise provided in this Warrant, all Parcels shall in the United Kingdom be posted by being handed in at a Post Office in the manner hereinafter provided, within the hours during which such office shall be open to the public for the posting of Parcels.

Posting at Post Offices.

8. The following provisions shall apply to the posting of Parcels at any Post Office in the United Kingdom, that is to say :---

- (1.) It shall be the duty of the person bringing a Parcel to hand it to an officer on duty at the counter in such office.
- (2.) Such Parcel must bear the name and address of the sender and the exact direction of the addressee, and must be packed in a manner adequate for the length of the journey, and for the protection of the contents. The Parcel must also be so packed as to prevent any tampering with its contents without leaving an obvious trace of its violation, and must be sealed by means of sealing wax, lead, or otherwise, with some impress or mark of the sender. Such Parcel must also be accompanied by or have affixed to it a declaration of such kind, and stating the contents of the Parcel in such manner and form and with such other particulars as the Commissioners of Customs and the Postmaster-General may prescribe.
- (3.) Such Parcel shall be measured and weighed by such officer, and (if such Parcel do not exceed the limits of measurement or weight hereinbefore mentioned) the postage thereof according to the rates hereinbefore respectively mentioned shall be paid by means of postage stamps affixed to such Parcel, and shall be verified by such officer, and no such Parcel shall be forwarded by the post without the before-mentioned requirements being complied with; and if any such Parcel shall be left at a Post Office without such requirements being complied with, such Parcel shall, except as hereinafter mentioned, be detained and may be returned or given up to the sender thereof or otherwise

dealt with or disposed of in any manner authorized by this Warrant.

9. Any packet transmissible by Parcel Post from the United Kingdom which from any words or marks thereon, or other external evidence, appears to have been intended for transmission as a Parcel, but which has not been tendered for transmission as a Parcel, but has been posted in a Post Office Letter-box or otherwise than according to the manner hereinbefore prescribed for the posting of Parcels may, in the discretion of the Postmaster-General, either be detained and returned or given up to the sender, or if the said Packet is fully prepaid with the Letter or Book Packet rate of postage and otherwise conforms to the Regulations as to the Letter or Book Post may be forwarded as a Letter or Book Packet (as the case may be).

Collection of Parcels.

10. The Postmaster-General may, if he think fit, from time to time authorize such of his officers as he may direct to receive Parcels for the Post under such regulations and conditions as he may from time to time prescribe.

Retention of Parcels at Postes Restantes.

11. Any Parcel addressed to a Post Office in the United Kingdom "to be called for" shall, if not called for, remain in such office for a period of one week after the date of the arrival of such Parcel thereat, and shall then be dealt with as provided in this Warrant.

Parcels for Places beyond limits of free Delivery. 12. If the place of address in the United Kingdom of any Parcel be beyond the limits of the free postal delivery of any town or district to which the same may be forwarded by post, such Parcel shall be detained at the nearest Post Office until an opportunity of delivering the same shall occur, or in default of any such opportunity until a period of one week shall have elapsed from the time of the receipt of the Parcel at such Post Office. Upon the expiration of such period without such Parcel having been called for, such Parcel shall be dealt with as provided in this Warrant.

Parcels addressed to Ships.

13. Any Parcel addressed to a ship at any port in the United Kingdom shall, if from any cause such Parcel cannot be delivered at such ship, be detained at the Post Office at such port for a period of one calendar month, and if not delivered at the expiration of that time such Parcel shall be dealt with as provided in this Warrant.

Return and Disposal of Undelivered Parcels.

14. With regard to

- (a.) Parcels which are addressed to a Post Office in the United Kingdom to be called for, or to a place in the United Kingdom beyond the limits of the free postal delivery of any town or district, or to a ship at any port of the United Kingdom, and which are not called for or delivered within the respective times in this Warrant specified in that behalf; and
- (b.) Parcels which cannot be delivered in the United Kingdom for want of a true direction, or by reason that the addressee is dead, or cannot be found, or has refused the same, or has refused to pay any charges thereon, or for any other sufficient reason;

The following provisions shall apply, that is to say:-

(1.) The Parcel shall, as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct, be place as the Postmaster-General may from time to time appoint, and may, if necessary, be there opened and examined.

- (2.) Notice shall be given to the sender through the Post Office of Switzerland that the Parcel will, in default of any claim on the part of the addressee, be given up to the sender's agent upon personal application at such place as aforesaid, or at the request of the sender will be returned to him by post upon payment of such charges as are hereinafter mentioned.
- (3.) The notice shall state that in default of the receipt by the Postmaster-General of an application for the parcel, during a period to be specified in such notice from some person who, in the Postmaster-General's judgment, is entitled to receive the Parcel, it will be disposed of in such manner as the Postmaster-General may direct.
- (4.) The Postmaster-General may, in his discretion, specify in any such notice, or otherwise, the periods during which Parcels may be returned to the senders thereof, and in so doing may have regard to the nature and contents of Parcels.
- (5.) A Parcel shall not be given up or returned by post to the sender except upon payment by him of any charge for redirection or other charge to which the Parcel has become liable under the provisions of this Warrant, or of any such Regulations as are referred to in section 14 of the "Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882."
- (6.) Where the sender requests a Parcel to be returned to him by post, such Parcel shall not be returned to the sender except upon payment by him of a new and distinct rate of postage, according to the rates fixed by this Warrant, and all other charges to which the Parcel has become liable.
- (7.) The Postmaster-General may require proof to his satisfaction that an applicant for a Parcel is entitled to receive the same.
- (8.) Where no application is made for a Parcel within the period specified in any such notice as aforesaid, or an applicant fails to prove to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General that he is entitled to receive the Parcel, or refuses or fails to pay the charges to which the Parcel has become liable under this Warrant, the Parcel may be dealt with or disposed of in such manner as the Postmaster-General may direct or authorize.
- (9.) If at any time while a Parcel remains in the possession of the Postmaster-General it becomes offensive or injurious to any officer of the Post Office, or other person, or to other Parcels, it may forthwith be dealt with or disposed of in such manner as the Postmaster-General may in his discretion direct or authorize, notwithstanding that the provisions of this Warrant as to the return of such Parcel, have not been or have only partially been complied with.

Re-direction of Parcels.

15. Any Parcel may be re-directed from its original address, or any substituted address, within the United Kingdom, to any country or place with which a Parcel Post to or from the United Kingdom or Switzerland is established, and in every case of such rc-direction there shall be charged on such Parcel in respect of such re-direction a new and distinct rate of postage according to the rates for the time being payable in respect of the transmission of a like Parcel from the retained at or forthwith forwarded to such I United Kingdom to the country or place to which

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it may be re-directed, and such postage, if not paid at the time of such re-direction, shall be collected on the delivery of the Parcel to the addressee.

16. Any Parcel may be re-directed from its original address, or any substituted address, within the United Kingdom to any other address within the United Kingdom, and in every case of such re-direction there shall be charged on such Parcel in respect of each such re-direction, and paid by the addressee thereof in money upon the delivery of such Parcel, a new and distinct rate of postage, equal in amount to the rate of postage which would have been originally chargeable on such Parcel as an Inland parcel.

Remission of Re-direction Rates.

17. The Postmaster-General may wholly remit the rate of postage for re-direction on any Parcel addressed to the United Kingdom which may, on the request of the addressee thereof, be redirected by an Officer of the Post Office and again forwarded by post to the same person at any address within the limits of the same free postal delivery as the address from which such Parcel was so re-directed.

Prohibitions.

18. There shall not be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by post any Parcel consisting of or containing any indecent or obscene picture, painting, photograph, lithograph, engraving, print, book or card, or any indecent or obscene article or thing of any other kind or any Parcel having thereon, or on the cover thereof any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, libellous, or grossly offensive character, and if any Parcel shall be posted or tendered for conveyance by post which primâ facie appears to be, or which any Officer of the Post Office may have reasonable cause to suspect to be, a Parcel within the description aforesaid, the same shall be detained, opened, and examined, and if on such examination it be found to infringe this or any other of the Regulations contained in this or any other Treasury Warrant relating to the Post Office, it may be dealt with and disposed of in any manner which may be authorized by the Postmaster-General.

19. There shall not be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by post :---

- (1.) Any Parcel containing or bearing any letter or communication in the nature of a letter, or any article or thing not authorized by the Customs or other laws of Switzerland.
- (2.) Any Parcel containing any substance, material, article, or thing of any kind whatsoever, which might, in the course of transmission through the post, be or become, or be rendered injurious to any officer of the Post Office, or any other person who may deal with such Parcel, or to any bag, basket, box, or other receptacle in or by which such Parcel may be conveyed by post, or to any other Parcel or other contents of any such receptacle.
- (3.) Any Parcel consisting of or enclosing any bladder or other membraneous substance containing a liquid of any kind.
- (4.) Any Parcel containing a live animal of any kind whatsoever.
- (5.) Any Parcel which either from the nature of the contents thereof, or from the absence of proper packing or covering, is, in the opinion of the Postmaster-General or his officers, likely to injure any person in the course of the conveyance of the Parcel through the post, or any receptacle in or by which such Parcel may be conveyed by post,

or any other Parcel or any other contents of such receptacle.

Any such Parcel, if posted or tendered for conveyance by post, may be detained, and either returned or given up to the sender thereof or dealt with or disposed of in such other manner as may be authorized by the Postmaster-General.

20. There shall not be posted or tendered for conveyance by post any Parcel consisting of or containing more than one Parcel or other Postal Packet, where any one of such Packets is intended for delivery to a person other than the addressee of such Parcel, and any such Parcel if posted or tendered for conveyance by post may be detained and either returned or given up to the sender thereof, or dealt with or disposed of as the Postmaster-General may authorize.

21. There shall not be conveyed or tendered or delivered for conveyance by post in or to any prohibited district in Ireland any Parcel containing arms or ammunition, and any such Parcel, if posted or tendered or delivered for conveyance by post as aforesaid, may be detained and opened and returned to the sender thereof, or otherwise dealt with according to law.

Non-compliance with Regulations.

22. In any case not hereinbefore expressly provided for, where any Parcel shall be posted or tendered for conveyance by post which in any respect infringes or fails to comply with the regulations in this Warrant contained, or any of them, such Parcel may, at the option of the Postmaster-General, either be dealt with as in this Warrant provided, with reference to Parcels which cannot be delivered, or be dealt with or disposed of in such manner as the Postmaster-General may in his discretion direct or authorize.

Provision for safety of Parcels.

23. In any case where any officer of the Post Office may find it necessary or expedient for the safety or protection of Parcels that any Parcel should be forwarded or delivered by some later despatch or delivery than that for which the same was posted or despatched, or intended to be posted or despatched respectively, he may delay the despatch or delivery of such Parcel, or make such other and special arrangements as to the despatch or delivery thereof, not, however, involving a greater delay than 24 hours in the whole, as may be deemed by such officer necessary or expedient in the circumstances of the case.

Parcels not to interfere with Letter Post.

24. Where the despatch or delivery from a Post Office in the United Kingdom of letters would be delayed by the despatch or delivery therefrom at the same time of Parcels, such Parcels, or any 'of them, may be detained in the Post Office until the despatch or delivery next following that hy which they would ordinarily be despatched or delivered.

Postmaster-General not liable for Loss or Damage. 25. Nothing contained in or done under or in pursuance of this Warrant shall render the Postmaster-General liable, either personally or in his official capacity, to any action or other legal proceeding in respect or in consequence of any loss of or damage to any Parcel, whether such loss or damage be occasioned by or arise from any act or neglect of any officer of the Post Office or any other person.

Customs Regulations.

26. Parcels intended to be transmitted by post under the provisions of this Warrant shall not be posted, forwarded, conveyed, or delivered, except subject to such Regulations as are referred to in section 14 of the "Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882."

Remission of Postage.

27. The Postmaster-General may, in any case in which he may consider it just or reasonable so to do, remit any postage or any sum made payable under this Warrant.

Commencement of Warrant.

28. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

OTICE is hereby given, that the Conserva-tors of the River Thames propose to make the following Bye-laws :-

BYE-LAWS for the Regulation of the River, Thames and the Navigation thereof, and the Lands apportaining thereto, between the town of Cricklade, in the county of Wilts, and Teddington Lock, in the county of Middlesex, and Persons using the same.

The Conservators of the River Thames, in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in them by the "Thames Acts, 1857 to 1883," and the "Thames Preservation Act, 1885," and of every other power and authority them thereunto in anywise enabling, do order and direct as follows, that is to say :-

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The Thames Bye-laws, 1886."

2. These Bye-laws shall come into operation the day after the same are allowed by Her Ma-jesty in Council.

B 2

3. These Bye-laws shall extend and apply to any and every part of the River Thames between the town of Cricklade and Teddington Lock, and to all towing-paths, piers, landing-places, locks, and banks thereof, and to all land acquired by the Conservators under and by virtue of the provisions of the "Thames Preservation Act, 1885."

4. (1.) In these Bye-laws, unless there is something inconsistent in the context, the words and expressions hereinafter mentioned, shall have respectively the meanings hereby assigned to them,

whether corporate or not. "Vessel" shall mean any ship, lighter, barge, launch, house-boat, boat, sailing boat, punt, wherry, randan, skiff, dingey, shallop, cance, raft, or craft.

"Pleasure vessel" shall mean any vessel used for pleasure navigation upon the River Thames, whether private or for hire.

"Pleasure navigation" shall mean navigation for any purpose or object other than the mere conveyance of goods, wares, and merchandize. "Pleasure vessel for hire" shall mean any

pleasure vessel let for hire or used, or intended to be used, for any purpose of profit.

"Private pleasure vessel" shall mean any pleasure vessel other than a vessel for hire.

"The River Thames," or "the River," or "the said River," or "the Thames" shall mean and include all and every part of the River Thames through which Thames water flows between the town of Cricklade and Teddington Lock, including all such backwaters, creeks, side-channels, bays, and inlets connected therewith, as form parts of the said River within the limits aforesaid, but excepting the cuts, inlets, and channels specified in section 2 of the "Thames Preservation Act, 1885."

"Conservators" shall mean the Conservators of the River Thames.

"Secretary" shall mean the person for the time being acting as Secretary to the Conservators. "Due notice" shall mean a notice in writing

given by the Conservators, or by any person duly authorized in writing by them to act in their behalf.

"Consent" or "Consent of the Conservators" shall mean consent in writing signed by the Secretary.

"Certificate" shall mean certificate in writing signed by the Secretary.

"License" shall mean license in writing under a dated stamp used by the Conservators, or a license plate issued by the Conservators.

"Officer" shall mean any officer of the Conservators, or any person employed by them, and authorised by writing, under their Common Seal, to carry out the provisions of these Bye-laws, or of the "Thames Preservation Act, 1885."

"Writing" shall include print, and where any document or instrument is referred to as being, or is required to be, in writing, the same may be either in writing or in print, or partly in writing and partly in print.

"The Register" shall mean the general register kept by the Conservators in pursuance of section 7 of the "Thames Preservation Act, 1885."

(2.) In these Bye-laws, unless there is something inconsistent in the context, words importing the masculine gender only shall include females, and words importing the singular only shall include the plural.

5. (1.) Every pleasure vessel used, or intended to be used, upon the River Thames, shall be

registered and marked as in these Bye-laws provided.

(2.) No person shall knowingly use, or assist, or be concerned in using, or cause or suffer to be used, upon the River Thames any vessel for pleasure navigation, unless such vessel shall be registered and marked as in these Bye-laws provided.

(3.) No person shall knowingly hire or let for hire, or hold out or offer for hiring, or suffer or permit to be let for hire, for pleasure navigation, any vessel to be used upon the River Thames, or ply for hire with any vessel for pleasure! navigation upon the River Thames, unless the same shall be registered and marked as in these Byelaws provided.

(4.) This Bye-law shall not apply to steam launches required to be registered under or by virtue of the "Thames Act, 1883," nor to any vessel required to be registered under or by virtue of the "Thames Fishery Bye-laws, 1883."

House-Boats.

6. (1.) Every person applying to the Conservators for registration of a house-boat shall furnish to the Conservators in writing, upon a form to be obtained at the office of the Conservators, 41, Trinity-square, Tower Hill, London, or from such of the officers or servants of the Conservators as may be from time to time supplied with such forms, correct information as to the particulars following, that is to say :--

(a.) The length from head to stern of such house-boat.

(b.) The true name and usual residence of the owner thereof.

(2.) At the time of making such application for registration, the applicant shall pay to the Conservators the sums following, that is to say :--

(a.) For every house-boat not exceeding 30 feet in length the sum of five pounds.

(b.) For every house-boat exceeding 30 feet in length the sum of five pounds, and in addition thereto the further sum of two shillings for every complete six inches of length by which such house-boat shall exceed 30 feet in length.

3. The Secretary may, if he shall think fit, before accepting any such application for registration of any house-boat, require such house-boat to be measured by such person in the employment of the Conservators as he shall think fit.

(4.) Upon registration a number shall be appropriated by the Conservators to each house-boat, and such number, together with the length of such house-boat, and the full name and address of the owner thereof, and the date of registration, shall be entered in the Register.

(5.) Upon registration of any house-boat there shall be furnished to the person registering the same a license containing the name in full and the residence of the owner, the register number, and the date of such registration, and such other psr ticulars as the Conservators shall think fit.

(6.) The registration of and license for every house-boat shall become void immediately upon the expiration of twelve calendar months from the date of registration.

(7.) Every house-boat registered under these Bye-laws shall have painted upon each bow and upon each quarter thereof the register number thereof, which shall be in figures three inches in length and proportionately thick and of a block character, which figures shall be painted in black, unless the parts of such house-boat whereon such figures shall be, shall be of a dark colour, in which case such figures shall be painted in white.

Private Pleasure Vessels other than House-Boats and Steam Launches.

7. (1.) Every person applying to the Conservators for registration of any private pleasure vessel other than a house-boat or steam launch, shall furnish to the Conservators in writing, upon a form to be obtained as in the first sub-section of the last preceding Bye-law mentioned, correct information as to the particulars following, that is to say :--

(a.) The true name and usual residence of the owner thereof.

(b.) The number of such private pleasure vessels belonging to such owner.

(c.) The class to which each of such private pleasure vessels belongs, as, for example, skiff or sculling boat, pair-oar, four-oar, eight-oar, canoe, or punt, or otherwise, as the case may be.

(2.) At the time of making such application for registration the applicant shall pay to the Conservators the sum of two shillings and sixpence for every such vessel.

(3.) Upon registration there shall be appropriated by the Conservators to the owner of every such vessel a number, to be called the owner's number, and such number shall be entered in the Register, together with the date of registration, and shall be appropriated to such person in respect of every such vessel which shall be registered in his name.

(4.) Upon registration of every such vessel there shall be furnished to the person registering the same a certificate, containing the name in full and residence of the registered owner, and the owner's number and the date of such registration, and such other particulars as the Conservators shall think fit.

(5.) The registration of and certificate for every such vessel shall become void immediately upon the expiration of thirty-six calendar months from the date of registration.

(6.) Every such vessel registered under these Bye-laws shall have painted upon each bow a dark blue burgee, having thereon the owner's number in figures of a block character, of at least two inches in length, and proportionately thick, legibly painted in white. No person shall place, or caused to be placed, such burgee or such number upon any such vessel unless such vessel shall have been registered as in this Bye-law is provided.

Pleasure Vessels for Hire other than House-Boats and Steam Launches.

8. (1.) Every person applying to the Conservators for registration of any pleasure vessel for hire, other than a house-boat or steam launch, shall furnish to the Conservators in writing, upon a form to be obtained as in the first sub-section of Bye-law 7 mentioned, correct information as to the particulars following, that is to say :--

(a.) The true name and usual residence of the owner thereof.

(b.) The number of such pleasure vessels for hire belonging to such owner.

(c.) The class to which each of such vessels belongs, as, for example, skiff or sculling boat, pair-oar, four-oar, eight-oar, canoe or punt, or otherwise, as the case may be.

(2.) At the time of making such application for registration, the applicant shall pay to the Conservators the sum of two shillings and sixpence for every such vessel.

(3.) Upon registration there shall be appropriated by the Conservators to the owner of every such vessel a number, to be called the owner's number, and such number shall be entered in the

Register, together with the date of registration, and shall be appropriated to such person in respect of every such vessel which shall be registered in his name.

(4.) There shall also at such time be appropriated by the Conservators to every such vessel a number, to be called the vessel's number, and a separate number shall be appropriated to every such vessel and shall be entered in the Register.

(5.) Upon registration of any such vessel there shall be furnished to the person registering the same, a license containing the name in full and the residence of the owner, the owner's number, the vessel's number, and the date of such registration, and such other particulars as the Conservators shall think fit, and there shall also be furnished to such person a plate, to be called the license plate, whereon shall be stated the vessel's number.

(6.) The registration of and license for every such vessel for hire, shall become void immediately upon the expiration of thirty-six calendar months from the date of registration.

(7.) Every such vessel shall have upon each bow thereof the owner's number, with immediately thereunder the vessel's number, which numbers shall be in black figures, two-and-a-half inches in length, and proportionately thick, of a block character, and shall be upon a white square of such a size as shall leave a clear margin of at least one inch in width outside the numbers on every side thereof, and such numbers shall be so placed on such square, that there shall be a space of at least one inch wide between the owner's number and the vessel's number, thus :--



and shall also have fixed in a conspicuous place inside such vessel the license plate, and shall also have visibly and legibly painted in a conspicuous place inside such vessel, in letters of not less than one inch in length, the full Christian and surname, and the place of residence of the owner of such vessel, as, for example, "Kingston," "Maidenhead," or otherwise as the case may be.

Sailing Boats belonging to Members of Sailing Clubs.

9. (1.) The members of any sailing club may apply to the Conservators to register a burgee as the distinctive mark of sailing boats belonging to members of such club, and by these Bye-laws required to be registered.

(2.) Every such application shall be in writing and signed by the secretary of such club, or other person authorized in that behalf, and shall specify particularly :---

(a.) The name and address of every member of such club.

(b.) The name and description of every sailing boat used upon the Thames owned by every such member.

(3.) The Conservators may, if they shall think fit, and subject to such conditions (if any) as they shall think fit, register such burgee.

(4.) The Conservators may, in their absolute discretion, refuse any such application, whether in respect of any particular burgee or in respect of any club generally.

(5.) The Conservators may at any time, if they shall think fit to do so, cancel any such registration.

(6.) Every such registration shall become void immediately after the thirty-first day of December next after the same shall have been made.

(7.) The owner of every such sailing boat shall also cause such sailing boat to be registered under these Bye-laws as a private pleasure vessel, but such sailing boat shall not be required to be marked otherwise than as is hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

(8.) Such sailing boat shall be distinguished by flying the registered burgee of the club, and by having her name painted horizontally across the stern thereof in white or gilt letters of a block character, not less than two-and-balf inches in length and proportionately thick. Provided always, that nothing in this Bye-law contained shall exempt the owner of any sailing boat which shall not be registered and marked in accordance therewith, from having the same registered and marked in accordance with such of the provisions of Byelaws 7 and 8 as may be applicable thereto.

General.

10. (1.) Upon every transfer of the ownership of any vessel registered under these Bye-laws, the person becoming the owner thereof shall forthwith give to the Conservators notice in writing of such transfer, and the Conservators shall thereupon, without charge, grant to him a fresh certificate or license, as the case may be, for the period for which the existing certificate or license shall be unexpired, and shall cause his name to be inserted in the Register in the place of that of the former owner, and until such notice shall have been given, the former owner shall for all the purposes of the "Thames Acts, 1857 to 1883," and the "Thames Preservation Act, 1885," and of these Bye-laws, and of all other bye-laws, rules, orders, and regulations of the Conservators for the time being in force, be deemed to be the owner of such vessel.

(2.) Upon every such transfer of ownership the person previously registered as the owner of such vessel shall return to the Conservators at their office, 41, Trinity-square, Tower Hill, London, the certificate or license, as the case may be, for the time being in force in respect of such vessel.

(3.) Immediately upon the granting of a fresh certificate or license, under the provisions of subsection (1) of this Bye-law, the certificate or license previously in force in respect of the same vessel shall become void.

(4.) From and after the granting of such fresh certificate or license, the person to whom the same is granted shall have the vessel, in respect of which the same is granted, marked as if such fresh certificate or license were the first certificate or license in respect of such vessel.

11. (1.) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing Bye-laws contained, it shall be lawful for the Conservators if, in the case of any particular vessel, they shall think fit by writing under the hand of their Secretary to require or sanction the marking of any vessel in some manner different from that required under the foregoing Bye-laws, and in such case such vessel shall be marked according to such writing.

(2.) All names, numbers, or other distinctive marks or things by these Bye-laws required to be placed or kept in, upon, or about any vessel, shall be placed in a conspicuous position above the water-line, and shall be kept and maintained by the respective owners of every such vessel in a cleanly and plainly distinguishable condition, and to the satisfaction of the Conservators or their officers.

(3.) No person shall knowingly conceal, or cause

or suffer to be concealed, any name, number, or other distinctive mark or thing by these Bye-laws required to be kept in, upon, or about any vessel.

4.) No person shall display, or cause or suffer to be displayed, upon or about any vessel by these Bye-laws required to be registered, any name, number, or mark other than is required by these Bye-laws. Provided always, that nothing in this sub-section contained shall prevent any person from placing upon any vessel the name either of the owner or of the vessel.

(5.) Every license or certificate of registration when issued shall be subject to the condition that the owner or other person in charge of the vessel to which the same relates shall, on demand, produce and show the license plate, or owner's or vessel's number, as the case may be, to any officer of the Conservators, to any Proctor of the University of Oxford, any Marshall, or officer acting under any such Proctor, any officer or constable of the Metropolitan Police, and to any police officer or constable acting for any of the counties of Surrey, Berkshire, Wiltshire, Gloucester, Oxford, Buckingham, or Middlesex, or the city of Oxford, or any other borough, the police jurisdiction of which extends to any place upon the River Thames within the limits aforesaid.

(6.) The owner or other person in charge of every vessel on the Thames, shall obey and conform to the directions of every officer of the Conservators, and of every person for the time being in the employ of the Conservators, who shall have been sworn in as a police constable under section 25 of the "Thames Preservation Act, 1885."

(7.) No house-boat or steam launch shall lie or loiter in any part of the River Thames from time to time marked off by the Conservators, or defined by notice boards set up by them as being a part of the river in which no house-boat or steam launch shall lie or loiter: Provided always, that nothing in this sub-section shall prevent any vessel from remaining during any regatta, boatrace, procession, or other special occasion, at such place, and for such a length of time as may be sanctioned by the Conservators, or any of their officers.

12. (1.) No person shall, while using, or while in, upon, or about the River Thames, or the banks or towpaths thereof, or any land acquired by the Conservators, by virtue of the "Thames Preserva-tion Act, 1885," do, or cause, or incite any other person to do, any of the acts specified in the following sub-sections of this Bye-law.

(2.) Commit any offence against decency, or be otherwise disorderly.

(3.) Use obscene, scandalous, abusive, indecent, or improper language, to the annoyance of any person who shall lawfully be using, or who shall lawfully be in, upon, or about the River Thames, or the banks or towpaths thereof, or any land belonging to or acquired by the Conservators.

(4.) Bathe without proper bathing dress or drawers.

(5.) Bathe or prepare to bathe at any place where or between any hours when bathing is for the time being prohibited by the Conservators.

(6.) Do any act which may cause danger to any person or property, or occasion a nuisance, obstruction, or annoyance to the public or to any person.

(7.) Commit any trespass upon any dwellinghouse bordering upon or near to the river, or in anywise coming within the description of a riparian dwelling-house, or upon any curtilage or garden belonging to such dwelling-house.

(8.) Navigate or be concerned in navigating, or

be in, upon, or about any of the places specified in sub-section 1 of this Bye-law, whilst in a state of intoxication.

(9.) Cast or throw into, or upon, or place, or cause or suffer to fall or flow into or upon any of the places specified in sub-section 1 of this Byelaw, any rubbish or any offensive matter or thing.

(10.) Destroy or injure any flowering or other plant, or any shrub, vegetation, tree, wood, or underwood.

(11.) Light, maintain, throw down, place or leave any fire, or any flaming, smouldering or burning substance, matter or thing, in any place where the same may cause any danger or damage to property of any kind or reasonable annoyance to any person. (12.) Kill, injure, take, catch or trap, or attempt

to kill, injure, take, catch or trap any bird, or the young of any bird or animal: Provided always, that this sub-section shall not extend to prevent any person employed by the Conservators, or acting under the consent of the Conservators, from killing vermin, or shall affect any right of fowling, shooting, hunting, or sporting, existing on the fourteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

(13.) Take, destroy, search for, or disturb the nest of any bird.

(14.) Destroy, injure, disturb, or take out of, or remove from the nest, whether permanently or temporarily, the egg of any bird.

(15.) Move, injure, or deface any notice, notice board, work, or thing whatsoever, the property or in charge of the Conservators, or set up by them or with their consent.

(16.) Do any act injuriously affecting the safety or amenity of the river.

13. Any person guilty of any act or default in contravention of any of these bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty of, and shall forfeit a sum not exceeding, forty shillings, and any person who shall after due notice repeat or continue any such act or default, shall be liable to a penalty of, and shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.

14. Provided always, that nothing in these Bye-laws shall be construed to in anywise prejudice or prejudicially affect any remedy of the Conservators now existing, or shall interfere with or diminish any powers of the Conservators, or shall be construed to deprive any riparian owner of any legal rights in the soil or bed of the river which he may at the time of the passing of the "Thames Preservation Act, 1885," have possessed, or of any legal remedies which he may then have had for preventing the anchoring, mooring, loitering or delay of any vessel, or to give any riparian owner any right as against the public which he did not possess before the passing of the said Act, to exclude any person from entering upon or navigating any back-water, creek, channel, bay, inlet, or other water, whether deemed to be part of the River Thames, as in the said Act defined or not, or shall be construed to render dispunishable or punishable, in any less manner or degree, any act or default now by law punishable.
