THE Earl of Rosebery has received a Despatch from Lord Lyons, Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, forwarding an extract from the French Journal Officiel of the 20th of March, relating to claims arising out of the recent military operations in Madagascar, of which the following is a translation:—

Journal Officiel, March 20, 1886. "NOTICE

"TO persons who may have claims to advance on account of losses sustained in Madagascar during the recent conflict between the French and Hova Governments.

"According to the terms of Article 8 of the Treaty concluded on the 17th of December, 1885, between the French Republic and the Government of Her Majesty the Queen of Madagascar, the Government of the Queen has agreed to pay ten million francs, applicable both to the settle ment of French claims liquidated before the conflict which took place between the two parties, and to compensation for all damages caused to private persons of all nationalities by the fact of that conflict. The examination and settlement of these indemnities have devolved upon the French Government.

"Persons having claims to advance on account of the above-mentioned damages are warned that they must address their applications, accompanied by documentary proofs, either to the Foreign Office in Paris before the 15th of May, or to the French Resident at Tamatave before the 15th of July next.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

(No. 64.)—Gulf of St. Lawrence.—Prince Edward Island.

 East Point—Alteration in Position of Lighthouse, Alterations in Light, and Establishment of Fog-Signal.

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, dated 19th January, 1886, that during the past season the lighthouse and dwellings on East Point, Prince Edward Island, were moved eastward from the positions they previously occupied a distance of about 533 yards:—

The light is, as heretofore, a revolving white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every three minutes; it is now visible between the bearings of S.E. by S., through west, and E. by N. ½ N. (2.) Cove Head Outer Leading Light—Alteration in Colour.

Also, that in the month of September, 1885, the colour of the outer leading light at Cove Head Harbour was changed from blue to green. In other respects the leading lights are unaltered.

Note.—As this harbour has only about four feet on the bar at low water, it is used only by fishing boats of light draught, and should not be approached when there is a strong breeze onshore, as the sea then breaks completely across the entrance.
