THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The-Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this

Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected

with pleuro-pneumonia.
2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

### SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising such portions of the parishes of Bursledon, Hamble, Hound, Saint Mary Extra, and South Stoneham, in the county of Southampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the road commencing at the centre of the Northam Bridge, thence by way of Lancès Hill past the Bitterne Police Station and the Elephant and Castle Inn to Bursledon Bridge, thence on the east, west, and south-west by the Hamble River, the Southampton Water, and the river Itchen respectively, and back to the centre of the Northam Bridge aforesaid.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely), — in the county of Dorset, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at the Sea by Chapmans Pool, along the highway direct to Kingsion to the Lake forming the southern boundary of Corfe Common, along the said Lake meetward and northward forming said Lake westward and northward forming

the boundary of the said Common direct to West Mill Bridge on the western side of Corfe Castle, continuing from the said Bridge direct to the south-east fence of Knowl Hill and continuing the said fence in a westerly direction to the Grange-road in the parish of Steeple, and from the last-mentioned road along the highway north of Steeple Church leading to Blackmanston Farm, and continuing the said highway direct to Kimmeridge and terminating at the Sea by the Kimmeridge Coast Guard Station,-which was declared by Order of Council dated the seventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eightysix, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-seventh day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

### TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of

us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Definitions.

1. In this Warrant-

(1.) The expression "Parcel" means a postal packet which is posted as a parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.

Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

2. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by Post between Malta and Italy and any country or place viâ Italy to which the Italian Post Office may forward parcels.

Rates of Postage.

3. On all parcels transmitted by Post under this Warrant from Malta to Italy not exceeding seven pounds in weight there shall be charged and paid in Malta a postage of one shilling and

five pence halfpenny.

4. On all parcels transmitted by Post under this Warrant from Malta to any country or place via Italy not exceeding seven pounds in weight there shall be charged and paid in Malta a postage of one shilling and five pence halfpenny in addition to the postage (less the sum of ten pence) for the time being payable in Italy on like parcels posted in Italy addressed to the country or place to which the said parcels shall be addressed.

Maximum Dimensions and Weight.
