THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome, enclosing the following copy of the

Ordinance of Maritime Health, concerning quarantine regulations which have been instituted in consequence of the outbreak of cholera at Cagliari, Sardinia:—

Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 18.

THE Minister of the Interior, in consequence of the appearance of some cases of cholera at Cagliari, decrees:

ART. 1. In Sardinia and the small adjacent islands, except Asinara, the quarantine fixed by Ordinance No. 17 of the 12th instant, will be in force from this date for ships arriving from any other part of the kingdom. Similar treatment will be applied in all parts of the kingdom to vessels arriving from thence, excepting those bound for Sicily and her small islands, which must undergo seven days of observation at Augusta.

ART. 2. The Island of Asinara will be from this moment absolutely isolated from the rest of the kingdom, excepting Sicily. It will be situated under quarantine regulations as an infected place.

ART. 3. Italian ships now in quarantine in the Golfo Aranci, if bound for Sardinia and her islands, will be given pratique after undergoing the necessary disinfections, and if bound for Sicily they may complete the period of observation, but the Sanitary Authorities will take care that they shall land the guards in isolation, and shall depart without communicating with the shore, leaving their attestation of having undergone quarantine and sailed without communication with the land.

ART. 4. The parcels post service between Sardinia and her islands, and Sicily and her islands, will be suspended from this date, except for parcels containing disinfectants, medicines, and surgical instruments. It is also forbidden to import into Sicily rags, unwashed old clothes for sale, used bedding, and manures from Sardinia and her small adjacent islands, where the regulations decreed on August 21st last will be enforced respecting the commerce in such articles.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Repre-

sentative at Rome, enclosing the following copy of the Instructions of the Ordinance of Maritime Health relating to quarantine regulations respecting Sardinia and the adjacent islands :—

Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 19.

THE Minister of the Interior, in view of the Law of March 20th, 1865, Appendix C., on the the Public Health, and of the Ministerial Instructions of December 26th, 1871, in consequence of the petitions received from the Communal Councils of the small islands adjacent to Sardinia which are still uninfected, and at the same time with a view to making sure that the public health of their populations and that of the main island shall not be endangered by the arrivals of large bodies of working men coming from the continent and proceeding to communes hitherto free from cholera, decrees as follows :—

ART. 1. Vessels proceeding from the Island of Sardinia directly to the lesser islands adjacent thereto, shall from to-day be subjected to a quarantine of observation of seven days, which they shall undergo at the lazaretto at Asinara.

If during the passage, cases even of mere suspicion of cholera shall occur among the persons on board, they shall be subjected to a rigorous quarantine, for a period to be determined by the Interior Department, according to circumstances.

ART. 2. Vessels conveying bodies or associations of agricultural labourers or artisans from the continent to Sardinia and the adjacent islands, or vice versa, shall, besides having to provide themselves with a physician, in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 7, of the 19th of April, be subjected to special observation both in the ports of departure and destination.

At the former, the Sanitary Authorities shall require the embarkation of the labourers or artisans to take place twenty-four hours previous to sailing, and shall during that time provide for a strict medical examination of the passengers, so as to order the landing of such as may exhibit symptoms of choleraic disease, and shall carry out a close inspection of their baggage, in order to secure the immediate washing of effects found soiled, and the rejection of any which may be found in too great a state of dirt to admit of their being cleansed.

The operation of cleansing soiled effects thus initiated by the Sanitary Authorities of the port of departure shall be continued throughout the voyage, under the supervision of the physician on board, and completed by the Sanitary Authorities at the port of arrival during a period of twenty-four hours, during which the vessels with labourers on board shall be kept isolated, and not admitted to pratique, while the passengers shall be subjected to a fresh medical visit.

Should any suspicion of choleraic disease in any of the persons on board result from this visit, the vessel shall be sent to Asinara, and the Ministry of the Interior referred to for further instructions respecting its treatment.

ART. 3. Until further orders, all vessels conveying passengers between the Island of Sardinia and other places on the coasts of the realm, or vice versa shall be limited to the number of passengers fixed for the winter season by the regulations for carrying out the "Codice della Marina Mercantile."

ART. 4. So long as the present sanitary condition of the Island of Sardinia continues, the mail line between Cagliari and Palermo shall be suspended, and the other one between Cagliari and Naples shall not be accelerated (represtinata.)

The Prefects of the Coast Provinces of the

Realm, the Port Captaincies and officer, and the Director of the Lazaretto of La Asinara, are charged with the execution of the present Decree.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Amending Regulations with respect to Remuneration of Vaccination Officer:—
Totnes Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Totnes Union, in the county of Devon;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order bearing date the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, made rules and regulations relating to the appointment of Vaccination Officers and Assistants to Vaccination Officers by Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the said Totnes Union; and by Article 9 of that Order it was provided as follows:—

"The Guardians shall pay to any Vaccination

"Officer such salary or remuneration, and

"such only, as the Local Government Board

"may direct or approve, whether for ordi-

"nary duties or for occasional services; and

"such salary or remuneration may be in-

"creased or reduced as that Board may from

"time to time direct or approve."

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order as hereinafter mentioned, so far as regards the said Totnes Union:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order that with respect to the said Totnes Union, the above-cited Article shall be amended by the addition of the following proviso:—

Provided that the Guardians, with the approval of the Local Government Board, may pay to any Vaccination Officer or Assistant Vaccination Officer a reasonable compensation on account of extraordinary services, or other unforeseen circumstances connected with his duties or the necessities of the said Union.
