Passengers from these ports not, however, allowed to land unless they bring certificates that they have not been in continental Italy or other places declared infected by previous notifications, for 21 days before embarkation."

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome, enclosing the following copy of the

Ordinance of Maritime Health, concerning quarantine regulations which have been instituted in consequence of the outbreak of cholera at Cagliari, Sardinia:—

Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 18, A

The Minister of the Interior, in consequence of the appearance of some cases of cholera at Cagliari, decrees:

ART. 1. In Sardinia and the small adjacent islands, except Asinara, the quarantine fixed by Ordinance No. 17 of the 12th instant, will be in force from this date for ships arriving from any other part of the kingdom. Similar treatment will be applied in all parts of the kingdom to vessels arriving from thence, excepting those bound for Sicily and her small islands, which must undergo seven days of observation at Augusta.

ART. 2. The Island of Asinara will be from this moment absolutely isolated from the rest of the kingdom, excepting Sicily. It will be victualled under quarantine regulations as an infected place.

ART. 3. Italian ships now in quarantine in the Golfo Aranei, if bound for Sardinia and her islands, will be given pratique after undergoing the necessary disinfections, and if bound for Sicily they may complete the period of observation, but the Sanitary Authorities will take care that they shall land the guards in isolation, and shall depart without communicating with the shore, leaving their attestation of having undergone quarantine and sailed without communication with the hand.

ART. 4. The parcels post service between Sardinia and her islands, and Sicily and her islands, will be suspended from this date, except for parcels containing disinfectants; medicines; and surgical instruments. It is also forbidden to import into Sicily rags, unwashed old clothes for sale, used bedding, and manures from Sardinia and her small adjacent islands, where the regulations decreed on August 21st last will be enforced respecting the commerce in such articles.
