THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following copy of a Decree from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome, respecting quarantine regulations in Italy :-

(Translation.)

1887.—Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 3.
The Minister of the Interior,—

In view of the Law of 20th March, 1885, &c., and of the Ordinance No. 2, of the 8th instant;

Considering also the fact that certain small islands of the Sicilian Sea from their position, their special interests, and requirements are obliged to have direct and immediate communications with the mother island-

Decrees:

ART. 1. With the exception of the Eolian Islands, in which the quarantine treatment established by Ordinance No. 2, of the 8th instant, is continued in force, all the little islands coming within the territorial circumscription of Sicily

will be able from to-day to reopen free communications with the mother island, excepting in the case-according to the provisions of the abovementioned Ordinance—of ships leaving an infected port, when they will have to undergo quarantine at Augusta.

ART. 2. From the same date the above-mentioned islands, being thus placed in communica-tion with Sicily, will be subjected to quarantine with the mainland and with all the islands of the kingdom, in which the quarantine treatment against Sicily is enforced, and they will be treated accordingly.

INSTRUMENT substituting the New Church of Saint Lawrence, situate at Ecchinswell, in the Parish of Ecchinswell-with-Sydmonton, for the Old Church thereof, in the county of Southampton, and Diocese of Winchester.

To all to whom these presents shall come, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send greeting:

WHEREAS, a new church has lately been built at Ecchinswell, within the parish or chapelry of Ecchinswell, forming part of the benefice of Ecchinswell-with-Sydmonton, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester, and the said church has been consecrated and dedicated to Saint Lawrence.

And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Harold, Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, and the Reverend Richard Nelson Barnes, Clerk in Holy Orders, Vicar of the parish of Kingsclere, in the said county and diocese, and as such Vicar the patron of the said benefice of Ecchinswellwith-Sydmonton, and the Reverend Wilfrid Anderdon Boyce, Clerk in Holy Orders, Vicar or Incumbent of the same benefice, have, by an instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the twenty-ninth day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said parish or chapelry of Ecchinswell forming part of the said benefice of Ecchinswell-with-Sydmonton as aforesaid, that the said new church of Saint Lawrence, situate at Ecchinswell, should be substituted for the old church, situate at Ecchinswell, and also dedicated to Saint Lawrence.

Now, therefore, we the said Eecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her present Majesty, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do by this instrument under our common seal, with the consents (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said Edward Harold, Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, and of the said Richard Nelson Barnes, and of the said Wilfrid Anderdon Boyce, hereby declare that the said new church of Saint Lawrence, situate at Ecchinswell, within the said parish or chapelry of Ecchinswell, and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be, and the same is hereby, substituted for the said old church (dedicated to Saint Lawrence as aforesaid) in the same parish or chapelry, and that such new church shall henceforth be the church of the said parish or chapelry of Ecchinswell, forming parts of the said benefice of Ecchinswell-with-Sydmon. ton as aforesaid, in lieu of the said old church of Saint Lawrence, as fully in all respects as if the said new church of Saint Lawrence so hereby substituted had been originally the church of the same parish or chapelry.

And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old church dedicated to Saint Lawrence, and situate at Ecchinswell, in the said parish or chapelry of Ecchinswell as aforesaid, or of or belonging to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of Saint Lawrence (now being by virtue of these presents the church of the said parish or chapelry of Ecchinswell, forming part of the said benefice of Ecchinswell-with-Sydmonton as aforesaid), and to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, and his successors for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have set our common seal, and the said Edward Harold, Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal, and the said Richard Nelson Barnes and Wilfrid Anderdon Boyce have respectively set their hands and affixed their seals this twenty-fourth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

Borough of Dewsbury.

The Tramways Act, 1870, Sections 46 and 47. OTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Dewsbury, acting by the Council as the Local Authority under the above-mentioned Act, at a meeting of the said Council, duly convened and held, on the 10th day of March, 1887, made the following Bye-laws and Regulations with respect to Tramways within the said Borough of Dewsbury, namely :-

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any engine or carriage using any tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of an engine or car.

2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed of not less than four miles

an hour on the average, and not exceeding eight miles an hour.

3. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than: 100 yards along any portion of the line of tramway.

4. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 3 and 5, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made, provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 foot in 25 feet.

5. Except at a passing place or terminus no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets, or roads, or upon or over the crossings of the road, or where prevented by the regulations of the police, nor within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

6. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall with reasonable despatch cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

7. No person shall in any way, wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

8. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

9. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the

21st day of May, 1887.
