GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order as to Instruction of Children:—

Aylesbury Union.
To the Guardians of the Poor of the Aylesbury
Union, in the county of Buckingham;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Poor Law Commissioners, by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed, among others, to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Aylesbury Union, prescribed Regulations in regard to the government of the Workhouse or Workhouses of that Union, and by Article 114 of that Order provision was made for the instruction of the boys and girls who might be inmates of any such Workhouse:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Article 114 should be rescinded as regards the said Aylesbury Union, and other provisions sub-

stituted in lieu thereof:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby rescind Article 114 of the above-cited General Order so far as regards the said Aylesbury Union, and We Order

that the following provisions shall be substituted in lieu thereof:

ART. 114.-Except when the Guardians shall direct the School to be closed for holidays, the children who have attained the age of five years shall be instructed during at least eighteen hours in every week in reading, writing, and arithmetic, and the principles of the Christian religion, and such other instruction shall be imparted to them as may fit them for service and train them to habits of usefulness, industry, and virtue. regulations in force for the time being prescribing what attendance at a Workhouse School shall be deemed to be an attendance for the purpose of the First Schedule to the Elementary Education Act, 1876, shall apply to the children in the School.

Provided, as follows:

- 1. If the Guardians shall so direct, any child above the age of thirteen years who is in good health, and has been duly certified to have reached the Fourth Standard of the Code of 1876, or any higher Standard may be employed upon works of industry for not more than seven hours in each week day. Anv such child shall, however, be required to attend the classes for intellectual instruction during three half-days in each week, with a view of ensuring that the proficiency which the child has reached is maintained; except that if the Guardians shall so direct, any such child who has been out to service and has returned to the Workhouse may be employed wholly upon works of industry, without being required to attend the classes for intellectual instruction.
- 2. Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to relieve the Guardians or any child from any duty or liability imposed by the Elementary Education Acts, or by any Bye-laws made under those Acts and in force in the School District in which the Workhouse is situate.

NEW ZEALAND.—MIDDLE ISLAND. Otago Harbour—Fixed Lights on Mole.

THE New Zealand Government has given notice, dated 21st March, 1887, that two lights are now exhibited from a mast placed about 100 feet from the outer end of the Mole, in course of construction from north side of entrance to Otago Harbour:—

The lights are fixed white lights, placed vertically, 6 feet apart, and should be visible seaward in clear weather, except where obscured by Taiaroa Head to the eastward, and Hayward Point to the westward, from a distance of about 6 miles.

CHINA—EAST COAST.—GULF OF PE-CHILL.

(1.) Taku Bar Light-Vessel—
Alteration in Character of Light.

THE Chinese Government has given notice, dated 11th March, 1887, that the following alteration has been made in the character of the light exhibited from the Taku Bar Light-vessel, Peiho River Entrance:—

The light is a flashing white light, showing a flash every thirty seconds. It is elevated 35 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors.

Russian Tartary—Kamchatka.—Avatcha Bay.

(2.) Establishment of Permanent Light on Dalni Point.

The Russian Government has given notice, that the occasional light at Dalni Point, east side of entrance to Avatcha Bay, has been discontinued, and that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse, erected 280 yards, E. by N. ½ N., from the position of the old lighthouse.

The light is a fixed white light, visible seaward between the bearings of N. 50° E., through north, and S. 55° W. It is elevated 256 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 23 miles.

The lighthouse, 26 feet high, is octagonal, constructed of wood and painted white, with red roof.

Position on Admiralty Chart, lat. 52° 52′ 50″ N., long. 158° 47′ 0″ E.

(3.) Harbour Light at Petropaulski.

Also, has given notice, that a harbour light is now exhibited on the eastern side of Petropaulski Harbour Entrance, Avatcha Bay:—

The light is a fixed white light, visible between the bearings of N. 54° E., through east, and S. 33° E.

Position, lat. 53° 0′ 10″ N., long. 158° 44′ 0″ E. Note.—Vessels entering Petropaulski Harbour by night should, after passing Ismennai Point, steer N.W., until the above harbour light opens, when it should be steered for, until the Signal Shoal, which is marked by a buoy, is passed.
