THIS day Mr. Frank H. Collier, of Chicago, waited upon Her Majesty to present the following Address :-

To Her Most Gracious Majesty VICTORIA, QUEEN of Great Britain and Ireland, and Empress of India.

THE people of Chicago of British birth or parentage tender to Your Majesty our heartiest congratulations on the completion of the Fiftieth Year of Your Majesty's Reign.

Though outside the dominion of England's Throne, and most of us citizens and loyal citizens of the United States, we cannot forget the honour of our British birth or parentage and the dignity and privileges we owe to our native land.

With extreme satisfaction and humble gratitude to Almighty God, we hail the Jubilee of Your Majesty's accession to the Throne, and rejoice with the people the world over, that Your Majesty has been so long spared to reign on the Throne of England and in the hearts of your subjects.

We review with great pleasure the prosperity our mother land has enjoyed under Your benign sovereignty, and the rapid strides science, arts, and manufacturing industries have made under Your Majesty's fostering hand.

The progress of the world in liberty, knowledge, and education during the last half century we cannot but recognize as owing to a great extent to Your Majesty's personal interest, not only in the well being of your subjects and the encouragement you have ever given to the development of the noblest and best in the lives and surroundings of Your own people, but also in the growth of this and other nations of the world, and especially in the welfare of the people once bound by the oppressive yoke of slavery.

As members of the great Anglo-Saxon race, whose destiny would seem to be to stamp the peaceful impress of its language and its laws upon the nations, we derive our highest pride, especially while living under a Republican Government, from the reflection that in celebrating with our kindred the world over this unique season of Jubilee, it is our inestimable privilege to be able to point to a Throne as the pure fountain from which spring those domestic virtues which are the safest bonds of family life, and on the prevalence and multiplication of which depends a nation's stability.

Your Majesty's expressed sympathy with the

American people in times of great bereavement, as evidenced by the wreaths you sent to adorn the tombs of Lincoln, Garfield, and Grant; Your personal interest in the City of Chicago at the time of its great fire, and the impetus Your gifts gave to the formation of its Public Library, and the sympathy shown by our President and people with Your Majesty in seasons of affliction, have been great factors in welding the mother and daughter nations into one harmonious people, and the peace and prosperity encircling Your Majesty's Dominions and these United States lend assurance to the hope that the Anglo-Saxon nations may continue hand in hand in the onward march of the centuries.

We heartily congratulate Your Majesty at this happy time, and together with Your faithful subjects at home and abroad, we pray that Your life may be spared to Your loving people many years, and Your reign continue to shed its illustrious light and beneficent influence until the Great Creator calls You to an eternal inheritance of the Crown of Glory that fadeth not away.

#### THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1887, No. 3.

T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 25th day of August, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

#### PRESENT:

Marquis of Lothian. Lord John Manners.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection of Places used for Temporary Detention of Swine.

1.—(1.) Any Local Authority may, with the view of preventing the spreading of swine-fever, make, from time to time, such Regulations as they think fit for the following purposes, or any of them:

(a.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any building, shed, outhouse, yard, sty, field, orchard, or other place (not being a lair or other place mentioned in Article 115 (Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection of Markets &c.) of The Animals Order of 1886) used for the temporary keeping or detention of swine and partly in the county of Stirling comprising prior to their being exposed for sale in or at the premises at Raploch occupied by Robert

a market, fair, sale-yard, place of exhibition, or other public or private place where swine are commonly exposed for sale, to cleanse such building, shed, outhouse, yard, sty, field, orchard, or other place from time to time at his own expense:

(b.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of such building, shed, outhouse, yard, sty, field, orchard, or other place to disinfect the same, or any specified part thereof, from time to time, at his own expense, where, in the judgment of the Local Authority, the circumstances are such as to allow of such disinfection being reasonably required:

(c.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and such disinfection are to be

effected.

(2.) If the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such building, shed, outhouse, yard, sty, field, orchard, or other place fails in any respect to observe any such Regulation he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878, and where the owner, lessee, or occupier of such building, shed, outhouse, yard, sty, field, orchard, or other place fails to cleanse and disinfect in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause the same to be cleansed and disinfected, and to recover the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such owner, lessee, or occupier in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Amendment of Article 180 (Ascertainment of Value for Compensation) of The Animals Order

of 1886.

2. Article 180 of The Animals Order of 1886 shall be read and have effect as if fourteen days instead of six days were prescribed by the first paragraph of the said Article as the period after the slaughter within which the Local Authority shall give to the owner of the animal notice in writing of the valuation thereof made by them.

### Interpretation.

3. In this Order-

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1887, No. 3.

#### Commencement.

5. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and C. L. Peel. eighty-seven.

1. The following Place (namely),—a Place truste partly in the burgh of Stirling situate

Stewart, dairyman, Raploch, also the fields on the lands of Raploch belonging to the estate of Craigforth lying to the south of the Forth and Clyde Junction Railway, the Raploch public-road between the Clay Tollhouse and the Kildean Tollhouse, also that small field lying to the east of the village of Raploch between the road from Raploch to Fisher Row and the road from Raploch to Ballengeich, and the parts of the said two lastmentioned roads so far as between Raploch and the east boundary of the said small field, and also all premises on the east side of the Raploch publicroad which enter from the said last-mentioned -which was declared by Order of road, -Council dated the twenty-fifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fifth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch, dated 20th instant, from Her Majesty's Representative in Paris, enclosing an extract from the "Journal Officiel," stating that arrivals from Sardinia and Italy are no longer subjected in Tunis to more than a simple observation of twenty-four hours and a medical inspection, with the exception, however, of those from ports of the province of Naples inclusive, from the isles of the gulf of that name, from South Italy as far as Cape Santa Maria de Leuca, from Sicily, and from Pantellaria, which shall continue to undergo a quarantine of eight days.
