WHEREAS by an Order of the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, dated the 30th of December, 1869, made by virtue of the powers vested in the said Lord High Chancellor by the Bankruptcy Act, 1869, and of every other power then vested in him, after providing for the transfer of a certain specified part of the business which on the said date was pending in the Liverpool District Court of Bankruptcy to certain Courts mentioned in the said Order, it was, amongst other things, ordered that as to the residue of such business such part as could be disposed of by the Registrar of the Liverpool District Court

of Bankruptcy should be disposed of by him, and all such part of the residue of the business of the said Court as could not be disposed of by the said Registrar thereof should be, and the same thereby was, transferred to the County Court of Lancashire, holden at Liverpool:

And whereas, by an Order of the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, dated the 30th of December, 1869, made by virtue of the said recited powers, it was, amongst other things, ordered that such part of the business of the Liverpool District Court of Bankruptcy as was pending on the 31st December, 1869, and was not transferred to any County Court by the said recited Order of the 30th of December, 1869, should, if undisposed of by the Registrar of the said Court by the 30th of December, 1870, be transferred on and from that day to the County Court of Lancashire, holden at Liverpool, and all property in any bankruptcy the business of which was pending on the 31st December, 1869, and which by the said Order of the 30th of December, 1869, or the Order now in recital, was transferred to any County Court, and which on the said 31st of December, 1869, was vested in Charles Turner, Official Assignee of the said Liverpool District Court of Bankruptcy by virtue of an Order of the said Lord High Chancellor of the 29th December, 1869, should, on and after the said 31st of December, 1870, be divested out of the said Charles Turner, and vest in the Registrar or Registrars for the time being of the said County Court holden at Liverpool, and all books, papers, documents, and money in the custody or control on the 31st of December, 1870, of any person who was an Officer of the said Liverpool District Court of Bankruptcy on the 31st of December, 1869, should be transferred to the said Registrar or Registrars of the said County Court:

And whereas under and pursuant to the said Orders the business of certain bankruptcies under Acts prior to the Bankruptcy Act, 1869, became transferred to the said County Court of Lancashire, holden at Liverpool, and is now pending therein, and certain properties in such bank-ruptcies which, at the date of the said Order of the 31st of December, 1869, were vested in the said Charles Turner, as Official Assignee as aforesaid, are now vested in the existing Registrars of the said County Court, and it is expedient that the duties and functions not of a judicial character which relate to such bankruptcies which at the time of the passing of the Bankruptcy Act, 1883, were performed or exercised by the Registrars of the said County Court, should devolve upon and be performed by the Official Receiver of the District of the said County Court, and that all powers and authorities, and all estates, rights, and effects of and in relation to such bankruptcies, which are now vested in the said Registrars, should be vested in the said Official Receiver.

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered by the Board of Trade, with the approval of the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, pursuant to section 153 of the Bankruptcy Act, 1883, that all duties and functions not of a judicial character relating to the bankruptcies which by virtue of the said Orders of the 30th of December, 1869, and the 31st of December, 1870, were transferred to the County Court of Lancashire, holden at Liverpool, or any of such bankruptcies, and which at the time of the passing of the Bankruptcy Act, 1883, and at the date hereof, were and are performed or exercised by the Registrars of the said County Court, or either of them, shall devolve on and be performed by the Official Receiver of the District of the County Court of Lancashire, holden at Liverpool.

The illuminating apparatus of each of these lights is dioptric, or by lenses, of the third order.

The lighthouses, constructed of iron and painted black, consist of four main pillars, with square shaped tower above, which decreases in size towards the top. The high lighthouse, 113 feet high, has a black lantern; the low lighthouse, 69 feet high, has a white lantern.

(2.) Fixed and Flashing Light on Meyers Legde.
The light on Meyers Legde, serving for the navigation of Dwars Gat, is visible from N. $82\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., through east, to S. $64\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., and shows fixed white in the fairway of the gat from S. $70\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. to S. $76\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E.; flashing white with two flashes in succession followed by an eclipse of about four seconds' duration from S. 70% E. to S. $64\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E.; flashing white with two flashes in succession followed by an eclipse of about four seconds' duration from S. $76\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. to S. $87\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E.; and again fixed white from S. $87\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. to N. $82\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E.

The light is elevated 61 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 8 to 10 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses of the fourth order.

The lighthouse, 79 feet high, constructed of iron and painted black (lantern red), consists of four main pillars, with square shaped tower above, which decreases in size towards the top.

Position, lat. 53° 43′ 30" N., long. 8° 24′ 30" E.

(3.) Fixed Light at Salzhörn.

The light at Salzhörn is a fixed light, visible from S. $77\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., through east, to N. $57\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., and shows white from S. $89\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. to N. $70\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E.; red from S. $77\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. to S. $89\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E.; and again red from N. $70\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. to N. $57\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. It is elevated 48 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 to 8 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by

lenses, of the fifth order.

The lighthouse, 59 feet high, consists of a wooden beacon, painted red.

Position, lat. 53° 41′ 5" N., long. 8° 29′ 5" E. Note.—Salzhörn Light serves for the channel from the course indicated by Eversand leading lights into that indicated by Bremerhaven leading lights.

(2.) Shoal reported in Fairway of Gulf. Information has been received from the Siamese Government, that in the year 1886 the master of the British barque "Billy Simpson," reported having passed (on the passage from Hong Kongto Bangkok) over a shoal lying in the Fairway of the Gulf of Siam :-

This shoal (Simpson Shoal) is stated to have: been plainly seen, but that before the lead could be got ready, the vessel had passed over it, a sounding of 18 fathoms was then obtained.

Position as given, latitude 11° 26' N., longitude 101° 18' E.

3.) Shoal reported South-West of Koh Samit. Also, that a shoal (Victory Shoal), composed of coral, was reported by the vessel "Victory," in the year 1879, as being situated in latitude 12° 18' N., longitude 101° 17' E. From this position the south extreme of Koh Samit bears N.N.E. 3 E., distant 16 miles.
