(SWINE-FEVER.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 13th day of September, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),— in the borough of Morley, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at the point in Ackroyd-street at the western extremity of the premises occupied by Messrs. Wilson and Swallow, thence along the north side of Ackroyd-street to Marshall-street, thence along the eastern side of Mars' all-street to the end of that street, and thence along the fence at the northern side of the field occupied by Mr. R. Barron and along the line of the said fence and the fence at the western side of the property occupied by Mr. C. Dixon and Messrs. Wilson and Swallow to the point of commencement,— which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-second day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.
