Foreign Office, October 18, 1887. NOTIFICATION.

THE BRITISH PROTECTORATE OF THE NIGER DISTRICTS.

IT is hereby notified for public information that, under and by virtue of certain Treaties concluded between the month of July, 1884, and the present date, and by other lawful means, the territories in West Africa, hereinafter referred to as the Niger Districts, are under the Protectorate of Her Majesty the Queen.

The British Protectorate of the Niger Districts comprises the territories on the line of coast between the British Protectorate of Lagos and the right or western river bank of the mouth of the Rio del Rey. It further comprises all territories in the basin of the Niger and its affluents, which are or may be for the time being subject to the Government of the National African Company Limited (now called the Royal Niger Company), in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the said Company, dated the 10th July, 1886.

The measures in course of preparation for the administration of justice and the maintenance of peace and good order in the Niger Districts will be duly notified and published.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch, dated 15th instant, from Her Majesty's Representative at St. Petersburg, enclosing the following translation of a notice published in the official organ of Odessa, relative to quarantine on vessels arriving at Black Sea ports from infected localities:—

Viedomosti, Odesskago, Gradonachalstva, 26-8th October, 1887. Notification.

In consequence of repeated requests having lately been made with a view to obtaining the exemption from a quarantine of observation of such vessels as arrive at our Black Sea ports from cholera infected localities, and which have already undergone quarantine in a foreign country, the office of the Temporary Odessa Governor-General,

in accordance to instructions received from His Excellency, hereby gives notice that, in the strict sense of the existing Black Sea quarantine laws, as also in accordance to instructions issued by the Minister of the Interior, all vessels which arrive from cholera infected localities, or have been in communication with such localities, are, without exception, to be subjected to a six days' quarantine of observation, and any quarantine performed at a foreign port is not to be taken into account. A reduction of the term of observation from six to three days can only be permitted in the case that vessels have had a medical man on board (from the time they sailed from a cholera infected locality, or from the time they have had communication with such locality), who can certify to the health of the crew during the whole time. the vessel has taken to perform the voyage.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Surveyor of Buildings in the Public Works Office, Ireland.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 30 and 35. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the competitive examination.

II. Candidates will be required to show what preliminary training or technical education they have undergone to qualify themselves for a situa-tion of this nature.
