By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act, 1869," it is (among other things) enacted, that where the Legislature of any British Possession provides for the examination of, and grant of Certificates of Competency to, persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers on board British ships, and the Board of Trade reports to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that the examinations are so conducted as to be equally efficient as the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping, and that the certificates are granted on such principles as to show the like qualification and competency as those granted under the said Acts, and are liable to be forfeited for the like reasons, and in the like manner, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council :—

1. To declare that the said certificates shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts.
2. To declare that all or any of the provisions of the said Acts which relate to Certificates of Competency granted under those Acts shall apply to the certificates referred to in the said Order.
3. To impose such conditions and to make such regulations with respect to the said certificates, and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension thereof, as to Her Majesty may seem fit, and to impose penalties not exceeding fifty pounds for the breach of such conditions and regulations.

And that upon the publication in the London Gazette of any such Order in Council as last aforesaid, the provisions therein contained shall, from a date to be mentioned for the purpose in such Order, take effect as if they had been contained in the Act, and that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to revoke any Order made as aforesaid.

And whereas the Legislature of the British Possession of the Straits Settlements has by Ordinance No. II of 1882, intituled, an Ordinance to repeal and to re-enact, with alterations, the Steam Vessels Ordinance of 1873, provided for the examination in the said possession of persons intending to act as First Class Engineers and Second Class Engineers on board British Ships, and for the grant to such persons by the Governor of the said possession of Certificates of Competency as First Class Engineers and Second Class Engineers for sea-going British Ships, which certificates are hereinafter also denominated Colonial Certificates of Competency, and the Board of Trade have reported to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that the said examinations are so conducted as to be equally efficient as the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping, and that the Certificates are granted on such principles as to show the like qualifications and competency as those granted under the said Acts to First and Second Class Engineers, and

be liable to be forfeited for the like reasons, and in like manner.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the first recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased—

1. To declare that the said Colonial Certificates of Competency granted by the Governor of the Possession of the Straits Settlements on and after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to persons intending to act as First Class Engineers and Second Class Engineers of sea-going British Ships shall be of the same force as if they had been Certificates of Competency granted under the said Acts to First or Second Class Engineers.
2. To declare that all the provisions of the said Acts which relate to Certificates of Competency for the foreign trade granted under those Acts, except so much of the one hundred and thirty-ninth section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," and the tenth section of "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," as requires the delivery by the Board of Trade to any master, mate, or engineer of a copy of any certificate to which he appears to be entitled as therein mentioned, so much of the third paragraph of the twenty-third section of the said last-mentioned Act as requires at the conclusion of a case relating to the cancelling or suspending of a certificate, such certificate if cancelled or suspended, to be forwarded to the Board of Trade, and the whole of the provisions of the fourth paragraph of the same section shall apply to such Colonial Certificates of Competency.
3. To impose and make the conditions and regulations set out in the Schedule hereto, numbered one to ten respectively, with respect to the said Colonial Certificates of Competency, and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension thereof, and to impose for the breach of such conditions and regulations the penalties therein mentioned.

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS and REGULATIONS with respect to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension of Colonial Certificates of Competency.

Interpretation Clause.

In the construction and for the purposes of these conditions and regulations, the following terms shall have the respective meanings hereinafter assigned to them, that is to say :—

"Colonial Certificate of Competency" shall mean a certificate of Competency authorized to be granted by the Legislative authority of a British Possession to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers of British ships on similar principles and conditions as those granted under the Imperial Acts relating to Merchant Shipping.

"Authority" shall mean the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, Administrator, Head of the Government, Minister, Board, Body, or Corporation of or in any British Possession for the time being authorized by the Legislature of such Possession to grant Colonial Certificates of Competency.

REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS.

Form of Certificate.

1. A Colonial Certificate of Competency shall

be on parchment, and as nearly as possible similar in shape and form to the corresponding Certificate of Competency for the Foreign Trade granted by the Board of Trade under the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping.

Name of Possession to be inserted.

2. A Colonial Certificate of Competency shall have the name of the British Possession in which the same is granted, inserted prominently on its face and back.

Certificates to be numbered consecutively.

3. The Colonial Certificates of Competency granted in each British Possession shall be numbered in consecutive order.

Lists of Certificates granted, cancelled, &c., to be sent to Registrar-General of Seamen.

4. The Authority in each British possession shall furnish the Registrar-General of Seamen in London, from time to time, with accurate lists of all such Colonial Certificates of Competency as may be granted therein or as may for any cause whatsoever be cancelled, suspended, renewed, or re-issued; and shall also furnish him with duplicates of the applications for examination made by the persons to whom such Certificates are granted.

Certificates to be granted only upon proof of service at sea.

5. A Colonial Certificate of Competency shall be granted only upon proof that the previous service at sea of the person applying for the same has been such as is required by the regulations for the time being in force in the United Kingdom with respect to certificates of the like grade.

Certificates of Competency granted contrary to this regulation, or upon any false, incorrect or insufficient proof, certificate, or report of service, qualification, conduct, or character shall be regarded as improperly granted.

Certificates not to be granted when former are cancelled.

6. A Colonial Certificate of Competency shall not be granted to any person who may have had a certificate, whether granted by the Board of Trade or by the Government of a British Possession, cancelled or suspended under the provisions of the said Acts or of any Act or Ordinance for the time being in force in any part of Her Majesty's dominions, unless the same is a certificate of a lower grade than the one so cancelled or suspended and is issued upon the recommendation of the court or authority which cancelled or suspended the original certificate, or unless the period of suspension has expired, or unless intimation has been received from the Board of Trade, or the authority by whom the cancelled or suspended certificate was originally granted, to the effect that no objection to the grant of such Colonial Certificate is known to exist, or unless a new certificate has been granted to him by such board or authority; and in the last-named event no such Colonial Certificate of Competency shall be for a higher grade than the certificate so last granted as aforesaid.

Colonial Certificates of Competency granted contrary to this regulation shall be regarded as improperly granted.

Certificates improperly granted may be cancelled without formal investigation.

7. A Colonial Certificate of Competency which appears from information subsequently acquired, or otherwise, to have been improperly granted, whether in the above or in any other respect, may be cancelled by the authority by which the same was granted, or by the Board of Trade in the United Kingdom, without any formal investigation

under "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," and the holder of such certificate shall thereupon deliver it to the Board of Trade or such authority or as they or either of them may direct, and in default thereof shall incur a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, which shall be recoverable in the same manner as penalties imposed by the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping are thereby made recoverable.

Cancellation, &c., of a Certificate shall involve cancellation of all the other Certificates possessed by its Owner.

8. Every decision with respect to the cancellation or suspension of a certificate pronounced by any board, court, or tribunal under the provisions of the said Acts, shall unless otherwise directed, extend equally to all the Colonial Certificates at the time possessed by the person in respect of whom the decision is made, as well as to all Certificates granted to him under any of the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping, and whether such Certificates be specified in such decisions or not.

Certificates believed to be fraudulent may be demanded.

9. Any officer of the Board of Trade, or the Registrar-General of Seamen, or any of his Officers, or a Superintendent of a Mercantile Marine Office, or a Consular Officer, or duly appointed Shipping Officer in a British Possession, may demand the delivery to him of any Colonial Certificate of Competency which he has reason to believe has been improperly issued, or is forged, altered, cancelled, or suspended, or to which the person using it is not justly entitled, and may detain such Certificate for a reasonable period for the purpose of making inquiries respecting such issue, forgery, alteration, cancellation, suspension or possession, and any person who, without reasonable cause, neglects or refuses to comply with such demand shall incur a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds or its equivalent in local currency, which shall be recoverable in the same manner as penalties imposed by the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping are thereby made recoverable.

Suspended Certificates to be re-issued only by Colony by which originally granted.

10. A Colonial Certificate of Competency which has from any cause been cancelled or suspended, shall be renewed or re-issued only by the authority by which the same was originally granted.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the twenty-third day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second

and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four; have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton and of the new parish of Whitechapel both in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-seventh day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-two and published in the London Gazette upon the twelfth day of July following a part of the parish of Birstal in the said county of York and in the diocese of Ripon aforesaid was assigned as a chapelry district to the consecrated church of Saint John situate within the limits of such parish and the same was called 'The Chapelry District of Saint John Cleckheaton.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-second day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-seventh day of the same month the boundaries of the said chapelry district of Saint John Cleckheaton were altered.

"And whereas by the authority of the last-mentioned Order of Your Majesty in Council another part of the said parish of Birstal was assigned as a chapelry district to the consecrated church at Whitechapel situate within the limits of such parish and the same was called 'The Chapelry District of Whitechapel.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the sixth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight and published in the London Gazette on the seventh day of May following the boundaries of the said chapelry district of Whitechapel were altered so as to include within such district a certain specified portion of the chapelry district of Saint John Cleckheaton aforesaid.

"And whereas the said chapelry district of Saint John Cleckheaton has, and the said chapelry district of Whitechapel also has, under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries both of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton and of the said new parish of Whitechapel should be further altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend William Boyd Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries both of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton and of the said new parish of Whitechapel shall be altered so that there shall be dissevered from the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton and shall be annexed to the said new parish of Whitechapel all that

Cleckheaton which is described in the first schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink; and that from and after the day last aforesaid, and without any assurance in law other than such duly gazetted Order as aforesaid, the said portion of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton so to be dissevered from such new parish shall be included within and shall become and be and form part of the said new parish of Whitechapel: And also, that from and after the day last aforesaid, the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton and of the said new parish of Whitechapel shall be further altered so that there shall be dissevered from the said new parish of Whitechapel and shall be annexed to the new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton all that portion of the said new parish of Whitechapel which is described in the second schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured green, and that from and after the day last aforesaid, and without any assurance in law other than such duly gazetted Order as aforesaid, the said portion of the new parish of Whitechapel aforesaid so to be dissevered from such new parish shall be included within and shall become and be and form part of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton and to be annexed to the new parish of Whitechapel both in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon, being:—

"All that portion of the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton which is bounded upon part of the east by the chapelry district or new parish of Birkenshaw-cum-Hunsworth in the county and diocese aforesaid upon the north-west by the new parish of Whitechapel aforesaid and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the south and upon the remaining part of the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton from the new parish of Whitechapel aforesaid at the point where such boundary crosses the middle of Wickliff-lane, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of twenty-four chains or thereabouts thereby passing over the line of the Cleckheaton Branch of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway to the point on the eastern side of the said branch line of railway where the said lane joins Mount-street, and extending thence first north-westward then northward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of nineteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the High-road leading from Bradford to Cleckheaton and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of half a chain or thereabouts to its junction with Law's-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of six chains and a half or thereabouts to its present north-eastern extremity at Balm Mill Beck, that

is to say, to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton from the chapelry district or new parish of Birkenshaw-cum-Hunsworth aforesaid.

"The SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said new parish of Whitechapel and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton aforesaid, being :—

"All that triangular portion of the said new parish of Whitechapel which is bounded upon the south-east by the new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton and upon all other sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the last-named new parish from the new parish of Whitechapel aforesaid at the hereinbefore described point where such boundary crosses the middle of Wickliff-lane aforesaid and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as South-parade and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Whitechapel from the new parish of Saint John Cleckheaton aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Richard Rawle (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said George Howard Bishop of the said diocese of Truro (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Juliot now vested in him the said Richard Rawle, and his heirs and assigns as aforesaid, shall be transferred from him and them to the said George Howard, Bishop of the said diocese of Truro and his successors Bishops of the same diocese, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said George Howard, Bishop of the said diocese of Truro and by his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"Whereas the new parish of Christ Church, Ore, being the new parish in respect of which the vicar of the said benefice of Christ Church, Ore, has cure of souls, was created by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the fifteenth day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-seventh day of the same month, and the same new parish was created as a district chapelry and was taken wholly out of the parish of Ore aforesaid.

"And whereas the Reverend William Carus, of Merton, Bournemouth, in the county of Southampton, Clerk in Holy Orders, late Canon Residentiary of the Cathedral Church of the Holy Trinity, in the city of Winchester, the Reverend William Cadman, Clerk in Holy Orders, the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the parish of the Holy Trinity Marylebone in the county of Middlesex and Canon of the Cathedral Church of Canterbury, the Reverend George Edward Tate, Clerk in Holy Orders the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Mary Kippington in the county of Kent and Prebendary of Wells, the Very Reverend Robert Payne Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders, Dean of the said Cathedral Church of Canterbury, and the Venerable John Richardson, Clerk in Holy Orders Archdeacon of Southwark, the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of Camden,

in the county of Surrey, are the patrons of the said benefice of Ore, and also of the said benefice of Christ Church Ore.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said benefice of Christ Church, Ore, is at present insufficiently endowed and that the said benefice of Ore has endowments of such an amount that after the apportionment thereof hereinafter recommended and proposed shall have been effected and shall have come into operation, the said benefice of Ore will notwithstanding such apportionment be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Richard, now Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester, is of opinion, and we also are of opinion that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the new parish of Christ Church Ore aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Ore which is hereinbefore mentioned and is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Ore is now full of a Clerk, the Reverend David Alfred Doudney, Clerk in Holy Orders, being the rector or incumbent thereof, and the said David Doudney, as such rector or incumbent, is willing and desirous that the apportionment hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed shall be made accordingly and shall take effect immediately.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Richard, Bishop of the diocese of Chichester, acting as such Bishop, with the consent of the said William Carus, William Cadman, George Edward Tate, Robert Payne Smith, and John Richardson, acting as such patrons as aforesaid of the said benefice of Ore, and also of the said benefice of Christ Church, Ore, and with the consent of the said David Alfred Doudney acting as such rector or incumbent as aforesaid of the said benefice of Ore (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed this scheme and sealed the same with their several seals, the seal of the said Richard, Bishop of Chichester being his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and such duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same as aforesaid all those the apportioned tithe commutation rent-charges amounting together to one hundred and ninety-nine pounds eighteen shillings and sixpence which now belong to the said benefice of Ore and are particularly set out in the schedule to this scheme appended shall be severed from the said benefice of Ore and shall be annexed to and belong to and form part of the endowments of the said benefice of Christ Church, Ore.

"And we further recommend and propose that the vicar or incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Christ Church, Ore, shall as to all the tithe commutation rent-charges to be annexed to his benefice as hereinbefore mentioned, have all such rights and powers of ownership in respect of the same as are now enjoyed by the rector or incumbent of the said benefice of Ore.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty, chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Barnabas, situate in Irwell-road, in the township of Pendleton, and within the limits of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint George, Charlestown in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester.

“Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Barnabas situate as aforesaid.

“Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint George

Charlestown, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Barnabas, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The District Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Pendleton.’

“And with the like consent of the said James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified as aforesaid) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Barnabas, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend Samuel David Rees Clerk in Holy Orders the present vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint George Charlestown shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication solemnization or performance at the said church of Saint Barnabas situate as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Samuel David Rees and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

“We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The District Chapelry of Saint Barnabas Pendleton being:—

“All that part of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint George Charlestown in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, which is bounded upon the east by the new parish of Lower Broughton, or in other words by the River Irwell upon the south by the new parish of Saint Philip Salford, upon the west and upon the south-west partly by the new parish of Paddington and partly by the district chapelry of Saint Thomas, Pendleton, or in other words wholly by the Preston Bolton and Manchester Line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway (all the said abutting cures being in the county and diocese aforesaid); and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the north-west

and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said district chapelry of Saint Thomas Pendleton from the new parish of Saint George Charlestown aforesaid at the centre of the bridge which carries Broughton-road over the said line of railway and extending thence first north-eastward then south-eastward along the middle of the said Broughton-road for a distance of twenty-nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ford-lane and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of fifteen and a half chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-named lane to its junction with Gerald-road and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of six and a half chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the centre of the Suspension Bridge which carries the said last-named road over the River Irwell aforesaid, which boundary divides the said new parish of Saint George Charlestown from the new parish of Lower Broughton aforesaid."

"BOROUGH OF READING.

"THE READING CORPORATION ACT, 1887.

"New Wards Scheme.

"*Election of Councillors and Aldermen, 1887.*

"WHEREAS by the Reading Corporation Act, 1887, it was provided that the extended borough of Reading should be divided into wards, and the number, names or distinguishing numbers, and boundaries of such wards should be fixed and determined by a scheme to be made by a Commissioner to be for that purpose appointed by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department. And whereas on the twelfth day of August last the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Counsel learned in the Law, and Secretary of State for the Home Department, did duly appoint me, Alfred Chichele Plowden, Barrister-at-Law, to act as such Commissioner aforesaid, and did on the thirtieth day of August last fix the fourteenth day of September one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven as the day for the completion of the said scheme.

"Now I the said Alfred Chichele Plowden in pursuance of the powers given me by virtue of the said appointment under the said Act, do hereby fix and determine that the borough of Reading as extended shall be divided into ten

wards, the names and boundaries of which shall be as follows:—

"Names.

"Abbey Ward, Battle Ward, West Ward, Castle Ward, Minster Ward, Katesgrove Ward, Church Ward, Victoria Ward, Redlands Ward, East Ward.

"Boundaries.

"And I do hereby determine that Abbey Ward shall comprise the whole of the parish of Saint Lawrence Reading.

"And I do hereby determine that Battle Ward shall comprise so much of the parish of Saint Mary Reading, as is bounded on the east north and west sides thereof by the boundary of the said parish, and on the south side thereof, by the middle of so much of Oxford-road in the said parish, as lies between the boundary of the parish of Tilehurst, and the boundaries of the parish of Saint Lawrence Reading, where such boundaries meet at a point opposite the middle of the road in Thorn-street.

"And I do hereby determine that West Ward shall comprise all that part of the parish of Tilehurst which is described in the Second Schedule to the Reading Corporation Act, 1887; the whole of the tithing of Southcot in the parish of Saint Mary Reading; and so much of the parish of Saint Mary Reading, as is bounded on the north by the middle of Oxford-road from a point in the middle of the said road at the eastern end of the Great Western Railway Bridge over such road to a point where such road crosses the boundary between the parish of Saint Mary Reading and the parish of Tilehurst from such point in southerly westerly and easterly directions by such boundary, and by the boundary between the parish of Saint Mary Reading and the tithing of Southcot to the point in the last-mentioned boundary which is in the middle of the Holy Brook (being the easternmost point of the boundary between the parish of Saint Mary Reading and the tithing of Southcot) and from thence eastwards by the middle of the Holy Brook as far as to the middle of the bridge which carries the road from Coley-avenue over the Holy Brook near to and on the western side of Coley Farm, and which said ward is bounded on the south-east, and east by the middle of the last-mentioned road, and by the middle of the road in Coley-avenue to a point in the middle of the road called Bath-road, at the eastern end thereof, on further part of the north and on the north-east by the middle of Tilehurst-road as far as to the eastern side of the railroad of the Great Western Railway Company, and on the remaining part of the east by the eastern side of the said railroad to the point first-mentioned in this description of West Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Castle Ward shall comprise all that part of the parish of Saint Mary Reading which is bounded on the north from a point on the boundary between the said parish and the parish of Saint Lawrence Reading opposite the middle of the northern end of Saint Mary's Butts to the eastern side of the railway bridge carrying the railroad of the Great Western Railway Company over Oxford-road by the middle of Oxford-road, on the west by the eastern side of the said railroad, on the south and south-west by the middle of Tilehurst-road to the aforesaid point in the middle of the road called Bath-road at the eastern end thereof, on the south-east from the last-mentioned point by the middle of Castle-street to a point opposite the middle of Bridge-street, and on the east from the last-mentioned point northwards along the road in Saint

Mary's Butts to the point first-mentioned in this description of Castle Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Minster Ward shall comprise all that part of the parish of Saint Mary Reading which is bounded on the north by the parish boundary along the middle of Broad-street, from a point opposite the middle of the road in Saint Mary's Butts at the northern end thereof to the eastern end of Broad-street, and is also bounded by the parish boundary from the point where such boundary leaves the eastern end of Broad-street to the easternmost point of the boundary between the parish of Saint Mary Reading and the tithing of Southcot in the middle of the Holy Brook and from the last-mentioned point eastwards by the middle of the Holy Brook to the middle of the bridge which carries the road from Coley-avenue over the Holy Brook, near to and on the western side of Coley Farm, and is bounded on the westerly and north-westerly sides by the middle of the same road, and by the middle of the road in Coley-avenue, to a point in the middle of the road called Bath-road, at the eastern end thereof, and from that point on the north and north-west by the middle of the road in Castle-street, to a point opposite the middle of the road in Bridge-street, and on the west by the eastern boundary of Castle Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Katesgrove Ward shall comprise all that part of the parish of Saint Giles Reading, which is bounded on part of the east by the middle of Bridge-street, Southampton-street, Whitley-street and Basingstoke-road, to the point on the eastern side of Basingstoke-road where the boundary between the said parish and the hamlet of Whitley begins to run along the eastern side of the said Basingstoke-road, thence on further part of the east and on the south by the said boundary between the said parish and the hamlet of Whitley, and on the west north-west and north by the boundary between the said parish and the parish of Saint Mary Reading.

"And I do hereby determine that Church Ward shall comprise all that part of the parish of Saint Giles Reading which is bounded on part of the north by the River Kennet and the Kennet Navigation Cut, from a point on the said river in the boundary between the said parish and the parish of Saint Lawrence Reading opposite to the eastern end of Crane Wharf, along the middle of the said river and the middle of the Kennet Navigation Cut to a point in the said cut opposite the middle of the north end of Sidmouth-street, on the east side from the last-mentioned point by a straight line to the middle of Sidmouth-street and by the middle of such street to a point in the middle of London-road, on a further part of the north by the middle of London-road as far as to a point opposite the middle of Redlands-road, on further part of the east from the point last aforesaid by the middle of Redlands-road to the point where the boundary between the said parish of Saint Giles Reading and the hamlet of Whitley crosses Redlands-road, and from that point by the same boundary as far as to the point on the east side of Basingstoke-road where such boundary begins to run along the eastern side of the same road, and on the west from the last-named point partly by a line drawn to the middle of the road in Whitley-street and partly by the middle of the roads in Whitley-street, Southampton-street, and Bridge-street respectively, as far as to the point where the boundary of the said parish of Saint Giles Reading joins the boundary of the parish of Saint Mary Reading, on further part of the north by the boundary between those parishes,

and on the remaining part of the north by the boundary between the parishes of Saint Giles Reading and Saint Lawrence Reading to the point first-mentioned in this description of the boundaries of the said Church Ward. All that part of the hamlet of Whitley in the parish of Saint Giles Reading which lies west of the middle of the roads called respectively Redlands-road and Shinfield-road. And all those parts of the parishes of Burghfield and Shinfield which are respectively described in the second schedule to the Reading Corporation Act, 1887.

"And I do hereby determine that Victoria Ward shall comprise all that part of the parish of Saint Giles Reading, which is bounded on the east from a point in the middle of London-road by the parish or liberty of Earley. On the south, from the point aforesaid by the middle of London-road to a point opposite the middle of Sidmouth-street, on part of the west by the middle of Sidmouth-street to the north end of that street, and by a straight line extending therefrom to a point in the middle of the Kennet Navigation Cut, on part of the south or south-west from the last-mentioned point along the middle of the said cut and the middle of the River Kennet to a point on the said river in the boundary between the said parish and the parish of Saint Lawrence Reading opposite the eastern end of Crane Wharf, on the remaining part of the west and on the north by the boundary between the said parishes of Saint Giles Reading and Saint Lawrence Reading.

"And I do hereby determine that Redlands Ward shall comprise all that part of the parish of Saint Giles Reading, which is bounded on the east by the parish or liberty of Earley from a point in the middle of London-road to the boundary of the hamlet of Whitley, on the south by the boundary of the hamlet of Whitley, as far as to the middle of the road called Redlands-road, from thence on the west side by the middle of the said road to a point in the middle of London-road, and on the north by the middle of London-road; and all that part of the hamlet of Whitley in the parish of Saint Giles Reading which lies east of the middle of the roads called respectively Redlands-road and Shinfield-road and which is not comprised within the boundaries of Church Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that East Ward shall comprise all that part of the parish or liberty of Earley which is described in the second schedule to the Reading Corporation Act 1887.

"And I do hereby declare that the wards hereinbefore determined are shown upon the plan hereunto annexed and signed by me, and their boundaries set forth as appears thereon.

"And I do hereby determine that the number of Aldermen of the said borough as so extended shall be ten, and that the number of Councillors of the said borough as so extended shall be thirty.

"And I do hereby apportion all the existing Councillors among the new wards of the extended borough as follows:—

"To Abbey Ward:—Councillors: Frank Attwells, Blackall Simonds, and Stephen Gould.

"To Battle Ward:—Councillors: John Forrest Euerby, John Thomas Dodd, and John Weightman.

"To West Ward:—Councillor: Owen Ridley.

"To Castle Ward:—Councillors: James King and Charles Gynningham Field.

"To Minster Ward:—Councillors: John Wessley Martin, William Berkeley Monck, and Daniel Heelas.

"To Katesgrove Ward:—Councillors: Isaiah Birt Nicholson and George Philbrick.

"To Church Ward:—Councillor: James Dymore Brown.

"To Victoria Ward:—Councillors: John Messer and Arthur Hill.

"To Redlands Ward:—Councillor: George William Palmer.

"And I do hereby determine as a provision necessary in consequence of the extension of the borough and of the alterations of wards and of the number of councillors that on the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven being the ordinary day of elections of councillors in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882, there shall be elected in addition to the councillors to be elected in place of those whose term of office expires on that day councillors for the undermentioned seven wards as follows:—

"For West Ward—Two councillors.

"For Castle Ward—One councillor.

"For Katesgrove Ward—One councillor.

"For Church Ward—Two councillors.

"For Victoria Ward—One councillor.

"For Redlands Ward—Two councillors.

"For East Ward—Three councillors.

"And I do hereby declare that the councillors to be elected for the said seven wards on the said first day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven including the councillors to be elected in place of those who go out of office on that day shall respectively retire or go out of office as follows, that is to say:—

"As respects West Ward, Victoria Ward, and Redlands Ward, the councillor who shall be elected by the smaller number of votes shall go out of office on the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and the councillor who shall be elected by the larger number of votes shall go out of office on the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

"As respects Castle Ward, Katesgrove Ward and Church Ward, the councillor who shall be elected by the smaller number of votes shall go out of office on the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and the councillor who shall be elected by the larger number of votes shall go out of office on the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

"As respects East Ward the councillor who shall be elected by the smallest number of votes shall go out of office on the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, the councillor who shall be elected by the next smallest number of votes shall go out of office on the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine and the councillor who shall be elected by the largest number of votes shall go out of office on the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

"And I do hereby declare that if at any election of councillors for any of the said seven wards to be held on the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, there shall not be a contest, or if in the event of there being a contest the number of votes given for any of the councillors elected, shall be equal, the order in which the councillors shall go out of office in any such case shall be determined by the Council of the borough.

"And I do hereby determine that the undermentioned persons, namely:—Charles James Andrewes, John Wells Hounslow, and William Silver Darter being the three aldermen assigned

by the Council on the ninth of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six to act as returning officers, shall act as returning officers respectively for the following new wards, namely:—

"For Abbey Ward—Charles James Andrewes.

"For Castle Ward—John Wells Hounslow.

"For Church Ward—William Silver Darter.

"And I also declare that the undermentioned aldermen of the borough, namely:—Alexander Beale, Henry Bilson Blandy, and George William Colebrook shall act as returning officers respectively for the following new wards, namely:—

"For Victoria Ward—Alexander Beale.

"For Redlands Ward—Henry Bilson Blandy.

"For Katesgrove Ward—George William Colebrook.

"And as a provision necessary in consequence of the extension of the borough and of the alteration of wards and of the number of councillors and aldermen, I do hereby declare that at the elections on the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, the returning officer for each of the four remaining new wards namely:—Battle Ward, West Ward, Minster Ward and East Ward shall be the mayor of the borough or a person to be by him appointed.

"And as a further provision necessary in consequence of the extension of the borough and of the alterations of the numbers of councillors and aldermen, I do hereby declare that on the ninth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven the Council of the borough immediately after the election of the mayor shall elect in the manner provided by the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 four fit persons to be aldermen of the said borough as extended by the Reading Corporation Act 1887.

"And I do hereby declare that two of the aldermen to be so elected shall go out of office on the ninth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine together with the three existing aldermen who go out of office on that day by rotation, and that the other two aldermen to be so elected shall go out of office on the ninth day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, together with the three existing aldermen who go out of office on that day by rotation. And I do hereby declare that of the four aldermen so to be elected as aforesaid the two who shall receive the smaller number of votes shall go out of office on the ninth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

"And I do hereby declare that if the said four aldermen shall be elected by an equal number of votes the Council of the borough shall determine which two of the said four aldermen shall go out of office on the ninth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and that if for any other reason in consequence of an equality of the number of the votes given for the said four aldermen or for any three or two of them any doubt shall arise as to any alderman who shall go out of office on the ninth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, any such doubt shall be determined by the Council of the borough.

ARTICLE I.—The several Orders above mentioned shall, so far as they are applicable to the said temporary Workhouse, and subject as hereinafter mentioned, apply to such Workhouse accordingly.

ARTICLE II.—Article 178 of the said Order of the 8th day of June, 1867, relating to the remuneration of Officers or Assistants, and Article 196 of that Order and Article 1 of the said Order of the 12th day of February, 1879, relating to the continuance in office of Officers or Assistants, are hereby suspended with respect to the said temporary Workhouse.

ARTICLE III.—Every Officer or Assistant at the said temporary Workhouse shall be appointed for such term and at such salary or remuneration as the said Guardians may determine ; but the particulars of every such appointment, including the name of the Officer or Assistant, the term for

which he is appointed, and the salary or remuneration assigned to him, shall be reported to us by the Clerk to the said Guardians as early as practicable.

ARTICLE IV.—Every such Officer or Assistant may be dismissed by the said Guardians at their discretion.

ARTICLE V.—The provisions contained in the above-mentioned Orders, and which are by Article I. of this Order made applicable to the said temporary Workhouse, shall, as regards such Workhouse, be subject to any modification thereof or departure therefrom which we may assent to on the application of the said Guardians.
