

Special Provisions for Movement of Cattle affected with Pleuro-Pneumonia for Slaughter.

1. Cattle affected with pleuro-pneumonia may be moved out of a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place within the parishes of St. Cuthberts, Cramond, Corstorphine, Colinton, Liberton, Duddingstone, North Leith, and South Leith, situate in the county of Edinburgh, for slaughter in manner and under the conditions following, and not otherwise:

- (i.) The cattle shall be moved, with a licence of the Local Authority of the county of Edinburgh, to the slaughter-house erected for the purpose situate at the south-west corner of the Public Slaughter-Houses in Fountainbridge, in the parish of St. Cuthberts, in the burgh of Edinburgh, or to the slaughter-house erected for the purpose situate at Salamander-street, in the parish of South Leith, in the burgh of Leith, in a float or cattle-van properly constructed so as to prevent contact of the diseased cattle with any other cattle during the movement.
- (ii.) The cattle shall be moved to the slaughter-house accompanied by and in charge of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority of the county of Edinburgh.
- (iii.) The cattle on arrival at the slaughter-house shall be forthwith slaughtered there in the presence and under the superintendence of the same Inspector or other officer, who shall forthwith report the fact of the slaughter to the Local Authority of the county of Edinburgh.
- (iv.) The slaughter-house shall be specially appropriated for the slaughter of cattle under the provisions of this Order and shall not be used for the slaughter of any other cattle.
- (v.) The cattle after they are moved out of the Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place shall not at any time be permitted to come in contact with any other cattle.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Float or Cattle-Van.

2.—(1.) The float or cattle-van shall immediately after each occasion of use under this Order be cleansed and disinfected, by or under the superintendence of the Inspector or other officer aforesaid, as follows:

- (i.) The floor of the float or cattle-van and all other parts thereof with which the cattle, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom: then
 - (ii.) The same parts of the float or cattle-van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water: then
 - (iii.) The same parts of the float or cattle-van shall have applied to them a coating of lime-wash.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings of the float or cattle-van, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed therefrom, shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with animals.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place means a Place for the time being a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia under the Act of 1878:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area declared by Order of Council dated the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be an Area infected with swine-fever (namely),—the whole of the parish of Kenilworth and the whole of the parish of Leek-Wootton, both in the county of Warwick,—is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in Article 2 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. The following Area namely,—the whole of the parish of Kenilworth, in the county of Warwick,—shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.
