THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Moet Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—comprising all that part of the Duchally Estate, including Duchally Hill, bounded on the north by the road leading from Auchterarder to Glendevon-road, in the parish of Blackford and county of Perth, in the occupation of Mr. John M. Cairns,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Mest Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Areas in the counties of Dorset and Somerset which are declared by Orders of Council to be Areas infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),-(1.) the whole of the parish of Bourton, in the county of Dorset, (2.) round Arthurs Bridge Farm, in the parish of Lamyat, in the county of Somerset, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, from the corner of Evercreech-road through Cuttern-lane to Mr. Perry's and Mr. Welsh's Farms both wholly within the Area, thence to Lamyat crossing through land in the occupation of Mr. Norman, and thence by Brutonroad to Waddon Farm across a field called Mashstone, thence across Simsfield to Looks Orchard and Barber's field, thence by the brook to Long Hill Farm wholly within the Area, thence across Hill's fields to Owley Farm both within the Area, and thence by Evercreech-road to Cuttern-lane aforesaid, (3.) at Ansford, in the county of Somerset, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at the Bridge of the Somerset and Dorset Railway near Cole Station and following the north-westerly fence of the road from Cole Station to Hadspen Village, from Hadspen Village by Hadspen Farm to Cary Hill Gate, thence by the northerly-fence of the road to Smallways, thence by the easterly fence of the road by the Wheatsheaf Inn to South Cary, thence by the north-easterly fence of South Carylane to Bonford's Cross, thence by the northeasterly fence of the main-road to Clanville Gate, thence by the north-easterly fence of the road to Clanville, thence by the easterly fence of five fields through which a footpath runs from Clanville to Sutton in the parish of Ditcheat, thence by the south-easterly fence of the road to Brook House, thence by the southerly fence of East Hill-lane to the Somerset and Dorset Railway, and thence by the Somerset and Dorset Railway to the said Bridge near Cole Station aforesaid, (4.) in the countres of Dorset and Somerset, comprising in the county of Dorset the civil parishes of Buckhorn Weston and Kington Magna, and the portions of the parishes of Gillingham and Silton lying within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at a point in the parish of Gillingham where the north-eastern boundary of the parish of Kington Magna adjoining Gillingham terminates, along the Gillingham parish boundary to the river Stour, along the river direct to Loddon Green Bridge, and continuing by .- the river to Loddon Bridge, then along the south-western and western fences as the case may be of the mainroad commencing at Loddon Bridge through Highstreet, Gillingham, Peacemarsh, and Milton, and along Martin's-lane, passing Bagmore Farm and Fitz Farm to the boundary of the parish of Silton near Bourton Bridge, along the north-west boundary of Silton to the county boundary, and along the county boundary to the north-east boundary of the parish of Buckhorn Weston; and comprising in the county of Somerset the portions of the parishes of Cucklington, Wincanton, and Stoke Trister lying within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at the point where the parish of Buckhorn Weston in the county of Dorset and parishes of Temple Combe and Wincanton in the county of Somerset join, thence along the left bank of the river Cole to a point where it is joined by a stream crossing the road from Wincanton to Buckhorn Weston, thence along the left bank of that stream to a point where it crosses the road from Wincanton to Buckhorn Weston, thence along the southeasterly fence of the road from that point to Clinger, thence along the easterly and northeasterly fences respectively of the road through Cucklington to Clapton, thence along the southeasterly and north-easterly fences of the road from Cucklington to Bourton to the point where it joins the high-road from Wincanton to Bourton in the county of Dorset, and thence along the south-easterly fence of the main-road from Wincanton to Bourton until it strikes the border of the county of Dorset, and (5.) at East Lydford, in the county of Somerset, commencing at the Cross Keys, East Lydford, thence along the northerly fence of Castle Cary-read to the Old Toll Bar, thence along the easterly fence of the high-road to Dairy House, Lower Foldington hamlet, through Foddington to the point where that road joins the road from Babcary to Sparkford, thence along the north-easterly fence of the road to Sparkford as far as Copse-lane, thence along Copse-lane and Bills-lane, both within the Area, to the road from West Camel to Babcary, thence along the westerly fence of the road from West Camel to Babcary to the river Cary at Town-end, thence along the westerly fonce of Lydford Green-lane to Westover-lane, thence along the southerly fence of Westever-lane to the Fesse-Way, and thence along the westerly fence of the Fosse-Way to the Cross Keys, East Ly ford aforesaid, - are hereby extended so as to include the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pueumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.
