#### By the QUEEN. A PROCLAMATION, In order to the Electing a Peer of Scotland. VICTORIA, R.

HEREAS the Right Honourable Walter Henry, Earl of Mar and Kellie, was duly elected and returned to be one of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland to sit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and is since deceased: In order to the Electing another Peer of Scotland to sit in his room, We do, by the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to and commanding an the receipt of beentand to assemble and meet at Holyrood House, at Edin-burgh, on Thursday, the tenth day of January next ensuing, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and choose another Peer of Scotland to sit and vote in the House of Peers in this present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in the room of the said Walter Henry, Earl of Mar and Kellie, deceased, by open election and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the proxies of such as shall be absent (such proxies being Peers and producing a mandate in writing duly signed before witnesses, and both the constituent and proxy being qualified according to law): and the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such meeting, and to administer the oaths required by law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their votes; and immediately after such election made and duly examined, to certify the name of the Peer so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers, the electors, and return such certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain : and We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, ten days at least before the time hereby appointed for the meeting

of the said Peers to proceed on such election. Given at Our Court at Windsor, this seventeenth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and in the fifty-second year of Our reign,

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as THE PLEURO-PNEUMONIA (INFECTED CIRCLES) ORDER of 1888.

#### Extent.

2. This Order extends to England and Wales and Scotland.

#### Commencement.

3. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

#### Interpretati n.

4. In this Order-

The Act of 1878 means The Contagions Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

The Act of 1886 mcans The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1886:

Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle means a Circle for the time being an Infected Circle under the Act of 1886 and this Order :

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.

## Pleura-Pneumonia Infected Circle. Application

of Act of 1886. 5.-(1.) Section two (Provisions as to Infected Circle) of the Act of 1886 is hereby declared to apply in the case of pleuro pneumonia.

(2.) Where a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle is constituted by virtue of Section two of the Act of 1886 and this Order the Inspector of the Local Authority shall forthwith serve or cause to be served a notice of his declaration of disease under the provisions of Section sixteen of the Act of 1878, signed by him, unless in the circumstances this appears to him not to be expedient, on the occupiers of all lands and buildings any part whereof in his judgment is situate within half a apply to or affect the movement of-

ford, Castle Cary, in the occupation of John mile from the Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place in respect of which such Circle is constituted.

> (3.) The Inspector shall, with all practicable speed, inform the Local Authority of every District within which any part of the Infected Circle is situate of his declaration and notice, and shall send his declaration and a copy of his notice to each of such Local Authorities.

> (4.) A Local Authority may at any time, and from time to time, by order contract the limits of a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle within their District, or of so much as is within their District, and, where an Infected Circle has been contracted as aforesaid, they may contract, extend, or otherwise alter the limits thereof or of so much as is within their District, provided that no lands or buildings shall be included within an Infected Circle that are not situate within half a mile of a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place, and any Infected Circle so contracted, extended, or altered shall thenceforth be the Infected Circle for the purposes of this Order.

> (5.) A Local Authority may at any time by order dissolve a Pleuro - Pnéumonia Infected Circle within their District, or such part as is within their District, and thereupon such Infected Circle or such part, as the case may be, shall cease to exist.

> (6.) Where the Privy Council at any time by Order declare a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Area and any part of such Area is at the date of the Order situate within a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle, such part shall thereupon cease to be part of an Infected Circle.

> 7.) The Local Authority of every District in which a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle or part of a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle under this Order is situate shall give such notice of the existence of the Infected Circle or of that part by placards or otherwise in and about the Infected Circle, or in such other manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to insure publicity for the same, and shall give notice of the existence of such Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle or such part to every Railway Company having a railway or railway station in the same.

> (8.) Where two or more Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circles adjoin or overlap each other, the whole of such Infected Circles shall be deemed for the purpose of the movement of cattle under this Order to be one Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle.

#### Movement in or into or out of Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle.

-(1.) No cattle shall be moved in or into or 6.out of a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(2). Cattle may be moved in or into or out of a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle in accordance with the regulations contained in Article 17 of The Animals Order of 1886 relating to the movement in or into or out of Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Areas, and the Forms of Movement Licence referred to in the said Article and set forth in the Schedule to that Order, and the said Forms may be used, so far as the same are applicable, for such movement. The said are applicable, for such movement. regulations and Forms shall for such purposes be read and have effect as if the words circle and circles were respectively inserted therein in lieu of the words area and areas.

#### Limitation.

7. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to

- (a.) Cattle in or into or out of a Cattle-Plague Ínfected Place; or
- (b.) Cattle in or into or out of a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place or Arca; or
- (c.) Cattle in or into or out of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or Arca; or
- (d.) Cattle affected with pleuro-pneumonia; or
- (e.) Cattle in or into or out of a Foreign Animals Wharf or a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station or a Landing-Place for foreign animals.

#### Exception of Railways from Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle.

8. Where a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle has been constituted under this Order, there shall be deemed to be excepted from that Circle the lines of railway within that Circle, so far as those lines are used or required for the transit of cattle through that Circle, without untrucking, and nothing in this Order respecting movement of cattle in or into or out of such Circle shall be deemed to interfere with that transit,

#### Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

9.-(1.) Every person in charge of cattle being moved, where, under this Order, a movement licence may be necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a Constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the movement licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as a foresaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or Constable, or Inspector or other officer.

#### Offences.

10.-(1.) If a head of cattle is moved in contravention of this Order, or of any licence there-under, the owner of the head of cattle and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignce or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(2.) If a person in charge of a head of cattle being moved, where under this Order a movement licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of C. L. Peel. 1878.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Notice, dated 14th ultimo, framed by the Board of Health of Escambia County, Florida, the following being an Extract :-

1st. That between the 15th of November, 1888, and the 15th of May, 1889, no vessel from Rio or Havana, or any other point infected with yellow fever, or having on board any contagious or infectious disease, or on which such disease may have existed within thirty days, shall be permitted to discharge cargo or ballast within the Harbour of Pensacola, except at the quarantine station in Santa Rosa Sound : Provided that if the port physician or inspector shall report that such cargo or ballast may, without prejudice or danger to the public health, he discharged at any other point, and the President of this Board shall endorse and approve such report, then such cargo or ballast may be discharged at any point in the said harbour in such manner as the President of this Board shall direct.

4th. That no vessel coming into the Port of Pensacola in ballast between the above mentioned dates shall discharge the same, except at quarantine station, if the port inspector shall report that her ballast is of a character to endanger the public health.

- LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1888. First Election of County Councillors : Certain Proceedings in Boroughs :-
- To the Returning Officers for the First Election of County Councillors for the several Administrative Counties in England and Wales other than the County of London ;-
- To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the several Boroughs in England and Wales, other than County Boroughs ;-

And to all others whom it may concern. WHEREAS the Local Government Act, 1888, after enacting that a County Council shall be established in every Administrative County, makes provision for the Election of County Councillors in each such County, and for the conduct of such Elections ;

And whereas a difficulty has arisen as to the person by whom, prior to the taking of the Poll at an Election of a County Councillor in any Electoral Division which is either co-extensive with or wholly comprised in a Borough, the proceedings to be taken and things to be done in relation to such Election should respectively be taken and done

And whereas by Section 108 of the said Act, in the case of any difficulty arising as respects the holding of the First Election of County Councillors, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to do, by Order, any matter or thing which appears to Us necessary for the proper holding of such Election, and it is enacted that any such Order may modify the provisions of the said Act, and the enactments applied by the said Act, so far as may appear to Us necessary for the purpose aforesaid :

And whereas it appears to Us necessary for the proper holding of such Election to make the provisions contained in this Order, and so far as those provisions modify the said Act or the enactments applied by the said Act, to modify the same :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows :-

ARTICLE I .- For the purposes of the First Election of a County Councillor for an Electoral Division which is either co-extensive with or wholly comprised in a Borough, the Mayor and Town Clerk of the Borough, respectively, subject as regards the Mayor to the revision by the County Returning Officer of any decision of an objection,

shall, in relation to the said Election, have, with regard to all matters provided for in Parts Two and Three of the Third Schedule to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and all other matters prior to the day of the Poll, the same powers and duties as they respectively have in relation to the Election of Councillors of the Borough, and that although no Writ has been directed to them or either of them from the County Returning Officer.

ARTICLE II. The Local Government Act, 1888, and the enactments thereby applied, shall be modified, so far as is necessary for the purpose of giving effect to this Order.

ARTICLE III. In this Order the expression "the Mayor" shall include any Alderman chosen in pursuance of Section 67 (1.) of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as applied by Section 75 of the Local Government Act, 1888, to execute the powers and duties of the Mayor. Any other expressions in this Order shall have the same meaning as in the said Local Government Act.

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
