INDIA AND UNITED KINGDOM.

Compensation for Loss or Damage of Parcels. TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's ·Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and

under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :-

1. In this Warrant-

- (1.) The expression "Parcel" means a postal packet which is posted as a Parcel in the United Kingdom for transmission to India, or in India for transmission to the United Kingdom in accordance with the provisions of any Warrant regulating the transmission of Parcels by post between the United Kingdom and India.
- (2.) The expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of
- (3.) The expression "India" includes the whole Continent of India, Burmah, Aden, and the Indian Post Offices at places on or near the Persian Gulf and at Zanzibar.
- 2. Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, if any article of pecuniary value enclosed in or forming part of a Parcel be lost or damaged whilst in the custody of the Postmaster-General, the Postmaster-General may pay to any person or persons, who may in the opinion of the Postmaster-General establish a reasonable claim to compensation (having regard to the nature of the article, the care with which it was packed, and other circumstances), such sum in respect of such Parcel as he may think just.

Provided as follows:-

- (a.) If in addition to the postage payable in respect of such Parcel the sum of six pence has been paid by the sender in respect of such Parcel the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the sum of five pounds.
- (b.) If in addition to the postage as aforcaid the sum of one shilling has been paid by the sender in respect of such Parcel, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not ex-

ceed the sum of ten pounds.

(c.). And in respect of every additional sum of six pence up to five shillings paid by the sender on a Parcel over and above the postage as aforesaid, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the sum of five pounds, and the amount of compensation payable in respect of any one Parcel shall in no case exceed the sum of fifty pounds.

- 3. The Postmaster-General may give effect to the provisions of this Warrant as to the loss or damage of articles enclosed in or forming part of Parcels out of such aids or supplies as may be from time to time provided by Parliament for that purpose, but nothing contained in or done under or in pursuance of this Warrant shall render him liable either personally or in his official capacity to any action or other legal procoeding in respect of or in consequence of any such loss or damage. And the decision of the Postmaster-General on all questions arising between him and any person claiming payment in respect of the loss or damage of any article enclosed in or forming part of a Parcel shall be
- 4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)
By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Areas (namely),—(1.) in the burgh of Perth comprising the whole of the South Inch of Perth, including both divisions thereof; (2.) in the burgh of Perth comprising the cowsheds, yard and other premises at the Edinburghroad, occupied by Mrs. Margaret McFarlane, dairykeeper; (3.) in the burgh of Perth comprising the byres, sheds and other premises at Craigie Haugh, occupied by Andrew Thomson, dairyman; (4.) in the burgh of Perth comprising the stable, byre, and other premises in Nelsonstreet, occupied by William Burns Thomson, wine merchant; (5.) in the burgh of Perth comprising that part of the town of Perth bounded by York-place and Glasgow-road on the north, by King-street on the east, by a straight line drawn from the east end of Kings-place to the lines of Railway passing through the General Railway Station at Perth on the south, and by the said lines of Railway on the west parts; (6.) in the burgh of Perth comprising the whole of the south side of the South-street to Canal-street; and (7.) in the burgh of Perth comprising the cowsheds and stables at No. 11, St. Paul's-square, occupied by Mrs. Jean Robertson, cowfeeder, and William Robertson, potato dealer;—which were declared by Order of the Privy Council dated the twenty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be Areas infected with pleuro-pneumonia, are hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

PYE-LAWS and Regulations made by the Bradford and Shelf Tramway Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Company"), under the powers conferred by the Tramways

WHEREAS the Bradford and Shelf Tramway Company Limited, acting by its Board of Directors at a meeting held on Monday, the 14th day of October instant, did in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Company by the Tramways Act, 1870, make the undermentioned bye-laws and regulations for preventing the commission of any nuisance in or upon any carriage used upon the tramways leased by the Company, and for regulating the travelling in or upon any carriage used upon the tramways leased by the Company, that is to say:

1. The bye-laws and regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company used upon the tramways, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make bye-laws or regulations.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall smoke in the saloon or

lower compartment of any carriage.
4. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

5. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against auy carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of

any passenger.
6. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws and regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of

any damage done.

7. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of a conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of a carriage or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from mounting any carriage, and shall not mount any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found upon any

carriage shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the carriage upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned.

8. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly-authorised officer of the Company the fare legally demandable for

9. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly-authorised servant of the Company, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

10. A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use, or attempt to use, any ticket intended only for such artisans,

mechanics, or daily labourers.

11. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front platform of the car, and not in the interior or on the roof of any

carriage.

12. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Company, shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the upper compartment or saloon, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

13. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, not being an official of the Company, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold, or hang on by or to, any part of any carriage, or travel therein, otherwise than on a

seat provided for passengers.

14. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person, not being an official of the Company, shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

15. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter, or mount, or remain in or upon any part of a car-

16. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage

whilst in motion.

17. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage. Any dog or other animal found in or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and, in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

18. No person shall travel in or on any carriage

of the Company with loaded firearms.

19. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company.

20. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these bye-laws and regulations to the best of his ability.
