THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 27th ultimo, from Her Majesty's Representative at Malaga, intimating that precautionary measures will be taken as regards all ships coming from the Chinese Empire, Persian Gulf, Tonkin and ports of the Red Sea in Asia: Tampa, Guayaquil, Florida, Mississippi, and Alabama, Pinta, Trufillo, and Corumba in America, Lamboanga, Tariac, Nulla Eceja, Panipanga, Pangasinan, Jayabas, Morong, and Lambales in Oceania. The ports of Brazil lying to the north of Paraguay are considered as suspected.

These steps are considered necessary in consequence of the alleged existence of cholera, yellow

fever, and plague in those parts.
