

THE Board of Agriculture; by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

I. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

In witness whereof the Board of Agriculture have hereunto set their Official Seal this twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.



SCHEDULE.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1335, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely), — the farm premises and Lodge field at Down Grange Farm, near Basingstoke, in the county of Southampton, in the occupation of Mrs. Portsmouth, — which was declared by Order of the Board dated the twentieth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. The following Area (namely),—in the county of Southampton, comprising the whole of the Petty Sessional Division of Basingstoke together with the municipal borough of Basingstoke, —which was declared by Order of the Board dated the twenty-fifth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.



THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 19 of The Rabies Order of 1887, do hereby license the Local Authority for the West Riding of the county of York to dig up or causé to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence, the carcase of a certain dog which was recently destroyed and buried at Otley, in the West Riding of the county of York, subject to the following conditions :—

- 1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause the carcase to be examined with a view to ascertain whether the dog was affected with true rabies, and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcase to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause it to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick line or other disinfectant.

 2. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, examination, and re-burial of the carcase shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.
- 3. This Licence is revocable by the Board of Agriculture.

. THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury :--

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant Surveyor in the Royal Engineer Department of the War Office.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

J. The limits of age for this situation are 21 and 30, and Cundidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the competitive examination. Persons already serving as Temporary Clerk of Works will be eligible in respect of age if their service commenced when they were under 30, if their age does not at the date of the examination exceed 40, and if their service has been continuous up to the same date.

II. Candidates will be required to show what technical education and practical training they have undergone to qualify themselves for a situation of this nature. They must show (1) that they have served for at least three years in a public or private office under an Architect, Builder, Civil Engineer, or Surveyor ; (2) that the works on which they have been engaged during those years were such as to afford them the opportunity of gaining a satisfactory knowledge of their profession; and (3) that they have fully profited by their practical training, and possess the necessary qualifications and experience. Evidence on these points must be sent in at such times and in such manner as the Civil Service. Commissioners may appoint. If such evidence Commissioners may appoint. If such evidence should prove prima facie satisfactory, the Candidate will be admitted to examination, subject, in the case of his being successful in the competition, to such further inquiry, and the production of such further evidence as may be necessary.

III. The examination will consist of two parts, and will be in the following subjects, viz. :--

- PART J.—PRELIMINARY.
- 1. Handwriting and Orthography.
- 2. English Composition, as tested by writing letters from rough notes.
- 3. Arithmetic (including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).
- (The examination in subjects 1 and 3 will include tests of rapidity as well as of neatness and accuracy.) *** No Candidate who fails to show satis-
 - *** No Čandidate who fails to show satisfactory proficiency in any of the subjects specified above will be admitted to the competitive part of the examination.
 - PART II. Competitive.
 - 1. One of the following (at the option of the Candidate): --
 - (a.) Architectural Drawing.
 - (b.) Engineering Drawing.
 - (c.) Preparation of Working Drawings for details of Builders' work.

- 2. Theory of Construction.
- 3. Strength and quality of materials, and description of workmanship, tools, and plant.
- 4. Analysis of prices.
- 5. Measurement and estimate of Builders' work, including taking off quantities from Drawings and preparing the Abstracts and Bills of Quantities.

6. Sanitary Engineering.

- In addition to the above six subjects a Candidate may take up any of the following optional subjects : —
 - A. Euclid (the first three Books).
 - B. Algebra, including quadratic equations.
 - C. Plane Trigonometry.
 - D. Geometrical Drawing and Freehand Sketches in Outline.
 - E. Chemistry and Mineralogy relating to Building Materials.

IV. A fee of $\pounds l$ will be required from every Candidate attending the Preliminary Examination, and a further fee of $\pounds 4$ from every Candidate admitted to the Competitive Examination.

V. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Commissioners may appoint.

* Candidates must be ready to serve at any station at home or abroad.

Candidates will be expected to be familiar with the English system of building nomenclature and with English methods of building and pricing.
