GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order: Minutes of Proceedings of Guardians:-

Wandsworth and Clapham Union. To the Guardians of the Poor of the Wandsworth and Clapham Union, in the County of London ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Wandsworth and Clapham Union, amongst others, the Poor Law Commissioners prescribed Rules and Regulations as to the Meetings and Proceedings of the said Guardians, and by Article 41 (Firstly), and Article 202 (No. 1) of the said Order provision is made with regard to keeping Minutes of the proceedings at the Meetings of the said Guardians, entering the said Minutes in a book, submitting the same so entered for authentication by the signature of the presiding Chairman, and as to reading such Minutes; and it is expedient that, so far as regards the said Wandsworth and Clapham Union, further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby, so far as regards the said Wandsworth and Clapham Union, alter the said Order, and Direct as follows :-

Any such Resolution shall be entered upon the Minutes in lieu of an entry to the effect that the Minutes have been read.
