REGULATIONS
TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOMS.

By Her Majesty's Command,
The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty; when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will

observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

Whereas we have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to inquire to what extent, on what terms, and at what cost tithe rent-charge in England and Wales has been redeemed under the Tithe Commutation Act, 1836, and the Acts amending the same, and to report whether, under existing circumstances, any amendments in the law or the practice are required in order to facilitate and encourage the redemption of tithe rent-charge :

Now know ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these presents authorize and appoint, you, the said George, Baron Basing ; George Cubitt ; Henry Hartley Fowler ; Sir Henry Hussey Vivian ; Frederick Meadows White ; William James Beadel ; and Cornelius Neale Dalton ; to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission ; and also to call for, have access to, and examine all such books, documents, registers, and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject ; and to enquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do by these presents authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And We do further by these presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue ; and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in such matters We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved John Graham, Esquire, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

Port Walcott Approaches—Local Magnetic Disturbance of the Compass.

IN consequence of a report made by Staff-Commander Coghlan, Her Majesty's surveying schooner "Meda," in 1885, a close examination has been made by Commander W. U. Moore, of Her Majesty's surveying ship "Penguin," in November, 1890, of a spot in the neighbourhood of Port Walcott, in passing over which the compasses were found to be affected.

The "Penguin" has found that a centre of magnetic disturbance lies in 9 fathoms water, with the Beacon on Bezout Island bearing S. 79° W. $2\frac{1}{10}$ miles. When anchored precisely over this centre her compass was deflected as much as 55° , but the effect rapidly decreased as the ship was moved away, and at a distance of 3 and 4 cables in different directions was found to be small, while delicate magnetic instruments landed on Bezout Island were entirely undisturbed.

As the disturbance is probably due to masses of magnetic mineral in the bed of the sea, and as the "Meda's" report had reference to a spot a mile and a half farther to seaward on the same

direct line from Cape Lambert, it is probable that other local magnetic centres may exist on the line of the submarine extension of that basaltic point.

Mariners should be on their guard, but any effect on the compasses, while under way, will be confined to a temporary deflection whilst traversing the very small area of disturbance.

An area about 2 miles in width (east and west), and extending about $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles in a S. by W. direction from the south extreme of Rutland Island, was closely sounded, the depths found being in general agreement with those shown on the Admiralty Charts. The "Investigator" remained at anchor for 21 hours of daylight in the reported position of the rock above given, and although the tide ran about $1\frac{1}{2}$ knots an hour for the greater part of the time, no indications of shoal water were seen, and Commander Hoskyn was satisfied that no shoal ground exists in the immediate locality.
