THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch, dated 8th June, from Her Majesty's Representative at Copenhagen, reporting that the Danish Government have issued a Notice, dated May 21, raising the quarantine against arrivals from the Persian Gulf, the Spanish ports of the Mediterranean, and Naples; but that the precautionary measures of inspection, prescribed by chapter II, section 1, of the Law of 2nd July, 1880, against the introduction of contagious diseases into the kingdom, are still in force with regard to the following places, viz.:—Marseilles, Venice, all Egyptian ports, all Red Sea ports, all Japanese ports, all Syrian ports, Lisbon, and St. Petersburgh.
