By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

HEREAS one of the Shaw, Savill, and Albion Company's vessels, called the "Arawa," has lately arrived from the Brazils and has been directed to proceed to, and remain under quarantine at, the Motherbank, off the Isle of Wight, and during and in the course of her voyage from the Brazils, the Yellow Fever, being a dangerous and infectious disease, appeared on board the said vessel and attacked persons on board thereof, and the said vessel arrived under alarming and suspicious circumstances; and whereas the sick persons who were on board the "Arawa" on her arrival have since been ordered to be removed to the Quarantine Lazarette or Hulk called the "Menelaus," lying at the Motherbank:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the disposition of the other persons remaining on board the said ship:

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, in exercise of the powers vested in them, do hereby order,—

1. That the said vessel called the "Arawa" shall remain and continue at the Motherbank aforesaid until the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, or any two or more of them, shall make further order.

2. That the persons now on board the said vessel called the "Arawa," not ordered to be removed to the "Menelaus," shall be removed to the ship called the "Edgar," unless ordered to remain on board the "Arawa" by the Medical Superintendent of Quarantine at Ryde.

3. That all persons so removed on board the "Menelaus" Quarantine Hulk, or who shall hereafter be removed on board the said Hulk, or on board the "Edgar," and who shall have been on board the "Arawa," shall be kept and detained on board the said Hulk, or the "Edgar," until the Lords of the Council, or any two or more of them, shall make further order.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

Non-existence of Rocks Northward of Cape Nikolo. INFORMATION has been received, from the Austrian Government, that Captain W. Mörth, His Imperial Majesty's ship "Pola," reports, that the three small rocks above water, charted as lying about 11 miles N. by E. from Cape Nikolo. western side of entrance to Gulf of Kassandra, were not seen when the ship was near the position assigned them.

Consequent on this report and other information, these rocks have been removed from the Admiralty Charts.

Australia—North-West Coast.

THE following information has been received from Commander W. U. Moore, Her Majesty's surveying-vessel "Penguin," dated November, 1891,—the result of recent examination of the several localities off the north-west coast of Australia :-

1. Parry Shoal, composed of coral, extends within the 10-fathoms line 4 miles in an E. by N. and W. by S. direction, with a breadth of half a mile. The shoalest spot, with 5 fathoms water over it, lies one mile from its western end, in lat.  $11^{\circ} 9\frac{1}{2}'$  S., long.  $129^{\circ} 39\frac{1}{2}'$  E.

2. Flinders Shoal is circular in shape, and 11 miles in diameter, with a general depth of 6 to 8 fathoms over coral. The shoalest spot, with 5 fathoms water on it, is situated in lat. 9° 524' S.,

long. 129° 17' E.

3. Franklin Shoal is circular in shape, and 1 mile in diameter, with a general depth of 6 to 8 fathoms over coral. The shoalest spot, with 5 fathoms water on it, is situated in lat.  $9^{\circ}$   $52_{4}^{3}$  S., long.  $129^{\circ}$  19' E.

4. Blackwood Shoal is about 6 cables in diameter, with a general depth of 8 to 14 fathoms, coral bottom. The shoalest spot, with 7 fathoms water over it, lies in lat. 9° 53' S., long. 129° 25' E.

5. Evans Shoal extends 43 miles in a N.N.W. and S.S.E. direction, with a breadth of 3 miles, and has a general depth of 8 to 16 fathoms. shoalest spot, with 5 fathoms water on it over coral, lies 4 cables from the north extreme, in lat. 9° 53' S., long. 129° 323' E.

There are quantities of snakes and sea perch on

these banks.

Caution.—It is probable that many other hoals exist on or near the same parallel of latitude, both eastward of Evans Shoal and westward of Flinders Shoal. The four shoals above mentioned are probably part of a submerged barrier, lying along the edge of the bank. Northward of them the character of the bottom changes to globigerina ooze.

Note.—'The hill on the south coast of Bathurst Island, eastward of Cape Fourcroy, situated in lat. 11° 47′ 50″ S., long. 130° 8′ E., is conical and conspicuous, 420 feet in height, and forms a

good landmark in approaching the coast.

EASTERN ARCHIPELAGO.

Note.—The existing plan of Kulewatte Harbour, Damma Island, on Sheet of Harbours and Anchorages between Bali and Timor, No. 935, is misleading, the anchorage being much smaller than represented. The anchorage is in 20 fathoms water, fine black sand and coral, with the large hut on the point, close to the ruin of Watchhouse (now scarcely visible), bearing N.E. by N.,

distant 11 cables. The space admits of one vessel (about 1,000 tons burden) lying at single anchor, or two of that size moored.
