THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following information respecting quarantine in the Danish Antilles, viz. :-

1. All arrivals from Europe and the United States of America will in future be subjected to fourteen days' quarantine, counting from date of

sailing. 2. The importation from Europe and the used clothing not belonging to passengers is prohibited.

3. Passengers' luggage will be inspected before it is allowed to be landed.

4. Linen and used clothing which belongs to passengers' luggage will be disinfected.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Notice issued by Her Majesty's Representative at Malta, whereby the following paragraph is substituted for paragraph 4 of the Government Notice No. 123, of the 6th August, 1892, viz. :--

4. The importation of cattle from the Black Sea, or Sea of Azov, not otherwise prohibited, may be permitted subject to the undermentioned conditions, provided that in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer such cattle are not affected with disease, so that they may be admitted in the lazaretto without detriment to cattle already in the island.

(a.) Such cattle shall only be admitted to the enclosures which may be assigned or approved for that purpose at the lazaretto, or at such places as the Government may select, and they shall be subjected to isolation and observation for three months.

(b.) Application must be made for leave to import, and permission is to be obtained in writing from Government in each case before shipment, stating the number of the animals intended to be shipped. No cattle shall be allowed to be landed unless the consignee has obtained such leave from Government, and agreed to abide by any regulations which may be established.

(c.) The application referred to in the preceding Article shall imply that the applicant has consented to pay the usual fees for entrance into the lazaretto and for guards and extraordinary

expenses on each head of cattle, besides 2s. 6 d on each head of cattle per month or part thereof in cases in which it is found necessary to keep cattle in the lazaretto for a longer period than fifteen days.

(d.) The importation of cattle from Syria, Roumelia, and Thessaly may be permitted under the following conditions :- That on arrival such cattle be not found suffering from idiopathic fever; that such cattle be exclusively imported for public consumption and slaughtered at the lazaretto, subject to the regulations which may from time to time be made by the Port Authorities.

(e.) The owners of cattle in the lazaretto shall be subjected to such regulations as to slaughtering of cattle, disposal of offal, blood, &c., as may from time to time be made by the Port Authority.

The importation, however, of horses, mules, and asses from Odessa is prohibited.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, from Her Majesty's Representative at Constantinople, reporting that the quarantine on arrivals from the Mediterranean ports of France with passengers on board has been increased to ten days, and if without passengers to five days in the case of departures on and after the 8th instant; also that the quarantine on arrivals with passengers from the coast between Trebizond and Ordu (inclusively) has been reduced to five days, to be performed either at Sinope or Kavak, and to twenty-four hours' detention at Kavak if without passengers.

Health Dues.

Art. 36. To meet the expenses of the department the following tariff is fixed.

Quarantine Dues.

I. All vessels of whatsoever class which are under special contract with the Mexican Government shall pay as dues and for the whole time they may be in quarantine, either under observation or in fixed quarantine, \$200.

II. All other vessels shall pay eight cents per ton daily whilst in quarantine under observation or fixed quarantine.

Lazareth Dues.

III. Vessels under contract with the Government shall pay, over and above the \$200 mentioned in paragraph I, \$2 a day for each sick person left in the lazareth, either passenger or of the crew.

IV. Every person from all other vessels shall pay for residence daily-

Quarantined vessels shall pay separately for disinfecting and hygienic measures they may have to observe : for these measures every facility will be afforded, and no expenses shall be incurred without the knowledge of the captain or owner in the case of vessels, and of the consignee in the. case of cargo.

VII. Persons in quarantine in the lazareth shall pay the expenses they incur, as the dues for residence only include medical attendance, medicines, and food.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sophia, enclosing the following quarantine notice, viz. :-

Sofia, October 13, 1892.

THE Ministry for Foreign Affairs has the honour to bring to the notice of the British Diplomatic Agency the measures adopted up to the 30th September (old style) by the Sanitary Board of the Principality and which are actually in force as regards travellers and goods arriving in Bulgaria, whether from contaminated or noncontaminated countries.

1. Travellers arriving from contaminated places have to undergo a quarantine of eleven days and their luggage is disinfected by means of a stove.

2. Travellers arriving from Roumania have to undergo a quarantine of eight days.

8. Goods from contaminated towns and districts are given up after a quarantine of twenty days; they are disinfected piece by piece according to the instructions of the Health Office.

4. Goods arriving from towns and districts free from cholera but situated in contaminated States, and goods which come from non-contaminated States but pass in transit through contaminated States, will be submitted to a quarantine of

eleven days and will be given up after the disinfection of their packings only. | of two Royal Decrees of the King of the Belgians, dated 5th September, 1892, issued in accordance

(These goods must be accompanied by a certicate stating the sanitary condition of the locality whence they come at the moment of sending.)

5. Goods coming direct from non-contaminated States (such as Great Britain, Italy, &c.) are given up without undergoing either quarantine or disinfection.

6. Travellers and goods arriving from contaminated States can enter Bulgaria by the ports of Bourga, Varna, Lom, and Roustchouk only, and by the Tsaribrod quarantine station.

7. With the exception of groups of money, the entry of every kind of postal parcel into Bulgaria is prohibited.

8. The importation into Bulgaria of the following articles and effects is prohibited :---

(a.) Body linen and bed linen as an article of commerce (all linen, clean or dirty, in travellers' luggage undergoes disinfection).

(b.) Worn clothes, rags and remnants of all kinds of woven stuffs, samples of old canvas (taile), used sacks, ropes, and waste paper.

(c.) Raw skins, furs, articles made up with fur (worn out as well as those worn by travellers), bladders, fresh or dried sausage skins, unwashed wools and waddings.

(d.) Dairy produce, such as milk, butter, cheese, fat and cream (Kainiak).

(e.) Every kind of fresh fruit.

(f.) Fish, whether fresh, salted, or smoked, sardines, preserved goods, and caviare.

(g.) Meat, whether salled, fresh, or smoked, small sausages (sauassons), hams, and sausages (saucesses).

(h.) Oils in skins.

(i.) Horsehair and cow hair (except painted horsehair material for sieves), pigs' bristles and camels' hair, all kinds of feathers, including those employed in making up any description of article.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, from Her Majesty's Representative at Athens, reporting that eleven days' quarantine is imposed on vessels with passengers, which on and after the 11th October left the Danube, Roumanian or Bulgarian ports of the Black Sea as far as Basiliko exclusive, and an observation of five days only for vessels without passengers, from the same ports. The eleven days against arrivals from the Black Sea ports between Batoum and Ordou is for the ports between Trebizond and Ordou inclusive reduced to five days' observation.

of two Royal Decrees of the King of the Belgians, dated 5th September, 1892, issued in accordance with Articles 2 and 8 of the Belgian Law of 1891, which relate to sea fishing in the territorial waters of that country, and the taking of undersized fish. An abstract of these Decrees, so far as they affect British fishermen, is subjoined :--

All foreign fishing vessels navigating or anchoring in the territorial waters of Belgium are required to comply with the following regulations, namely:---

1. Every foreign fishing vessel when in Belgian waters must have all her fishing gear and implements inboard, and must fly her national flag.

2. Every such vessel must comply with the same regulations as are imposed upon Belgian vessels with respect to lights, signals, marks, and acts of navigation and anchorage.

3. Each vessel must have on board her certificate of registry or other proper official document, establishing her nationality, her number and letters, and stating the name of the owner and of the master. These documents must be produced on the demand of any competent officer.

4. Neither the vessel nor her crew shall in any way obstruct the navigation at the entrance to any port or anchorage, or the fishing operations of any Belgian fishing boat. It is therefore incumbent upon every foreign vessel to immediately comply with any request to withdraw which may be made by the Belgian Authorities.

5. The penalties for any breach of these regulations are set forth in Articles 4, 7, 9, and 10 of the Belgian Law, dated 19th August, 1891.*

The following regulation has been made respecting the size of fish which may be landed or sold in Belgium.

Turbot, brill, ray, halibut, cod, or haddock, measuring less than 25 centimetres (10 inches), or sole, dab, plaice, or whiting, measuring less than 18 centimetres ($7\frac{1}{5}$ inches) in extreme length, may not be landed, transported, sold, or exposed for sale in Belgium. The penalty for a breach of this regulation is fixed at from 26 francs (£1 0s. 10d.) to 100 francs (£4), or in aggravated cases at double those amounts, and any such fish will be seized.


