A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

W HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to the fourth day of November next; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Tuesday, the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this twenty-eighth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, and in the fifty-sixth year of Our reign.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

T is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Wednesday, the fourteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, and the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Bucharest, containing the following information respecting quarantine in Roumania, viz.:—The actual duration of quarantine at Ungheni, Predeal, Verciorova, and Burdujeni, is five days, at Sulina, at Tcheatal of Ismal and at the Mouths of the Pruth, eleven days. The frontier points of Octioz (district of Bacan), and of Rin Vadulin (district of Vålced), have been closed.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Panama, containing the following Notice respecting quarantine:— Decree No. 87 of 1892 (of October 5).

Additional and Reformatory of the Decrees Nos.
78, 81, and 84 of 1892.

The Governor of the Department taking into consideration that according to official information from the Colombian Consul in New York, the sanitary condition of that port is excellent, and that prior to the sailing of the Colombia, there had been no cases of cholera there;

That the Consular employes of the Republic in England advise by cable that that country continues entirely free from the same epidemic;

That by official advice from Bordeaux it is known that if the sanitary condition there is good, as also at St. Nazaire and Marseilles, the cholera has not entirely disappeared in Paris nor in the north of France;

That the Departmental Board of Hygiene, consulted on the point, consider that the mails, passengers, and cargo coming from Europe, and which are at present detained in Jamaica and Martinique, where they have undergone quarantine and proper disinfection on shore, can be received in Colon;

. That the Government of the Republic has authorized that until further orders, necessary police and sanitary measures for the ports of the department shall be dictated here.

Decrees.

ART. 1. The steamer Colombia, detained in Colon during the last eight days, will be admitted tree from pratique after the visit of the Health Officer and the general disinfection of the mails and baggage which he may order, providing that since her departure from New York nothing has occurred.

ART. 2. From this date steamers proceeding from ports of the United States of America will be admitted under the following conditions:—

(a.) That the mails from European countries come properly funigated, which must be proven by a certificate from the New York Post Office.

(b.) That the passengers coming from Europe prove, by a certificate from the Colombian Consul in New York, that they have resided in the United States for at least eight days before continuing their voyage.

(c.) That they do not bring cargo from ports notoriously infected.

(d.) That they submit in Colon to the observation which the Sanitary Officer sees fit to impose, and afterwards to go through at their expense the disinfection necessary, if the said officer orders it.

ART. 3. The mails, passengers, and cargo from England, detained in Jamaica, will be received in Colon under the following conditions:—

(a.) That they come in steamers sailing from the West Indies.

(b.) That they bring a certificate from the Colombian Consul to verify the quarantine, disinfection, or admission into the Port of Kingston.

(c.) That on the arrival of the steamers at Colon. before coming alongside of the wharf, they undergo, at their expense and under the vigilance of the Sanitary Officer, the general disinfection advised by the Departmental Board of Hygiene.

ART. 4. Steamers sailing from England will be admitted in Colon from this date under the following conditions:—

(a.) That the mails from European countries come properly fumigated, which must be proven by a certificate from the English Post Office.

(b.) That the passeng rs coming from the Continent prove by certificate from Colombian Consular Agents their admission and residence in the British Isles.

(c.) That they do not bring cargo from places notoriously infected.

(d.) That they submit in Colon to the observation which the Sanitary Officer sees fit to impose upon them, and afterwards to go through at their expense the disinfection necessary, if the said officer orders it.

ART. 5. The mails, passengers, and cargo from France, and detained in Martinique, will be received in Colon under the following conditions:—

(a.) That they come in steamers sailing from the West Indies.

(b.) That they bring certificates from the Colombian Consul, and in his absence from that of some friendly nation, to prove the quarantine disinfection or admission in Fort de France.

(c.) That on the arrival of the steamer in Colon, before coming alongside of the wharf, they undergo at their expense and under the vigilance of the Sanitary Officer, the general disinfection advised by the Departmental Board of Hygiene.

ART. 6. The steamers coming from French ports will not be received in Colon, except after having been received at the other Colombian ports indicated in their itinerary and in case they are to be admitted, they will be strictly subjected to all the conditions a, c, and d, specified in Article 4 of the present Decree.

ART. 7. The Spanish steamers which come from New York and Havana will be admitted under the same conditions of Art. 2, it being well understood that if they accept transhipments in Havana they will be subjected to the general prescriptions of the Decree, except such transhipments are exclusively goods from Spanish ports.

ART. 8. If in any of the steamers which can be admitted in conformity with the preceding Articles 2 to 7 any case of cholera occurs, either during the voyage or during the period of observation which is indicated, the steamer will have to return, refused, to the port of sailing.

ART. 9. The closure decreed against Germany and Belgium and any other cholera infected country remains in force until further orders.

ART. 10. Under the above terms are amended Decrees Nos. 78, 81, and 84 of 1892.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Bucharest, containing the following Notice respecting quarantine, viz.:—

respecting quarantine, viz.:—
The introduction into Roumania of the following articles coming from Russia, Germany, France, Belgium, Austro-Hungary, Servia, Holland, and the Turkish ports of the Black Sea in Asia is prohibited.

(a.) Body and bed linen as a used but not washed article of commerce (the foul linen of travellers will be disinfected at the frontier), worn clothes as articles of commerce.

(b.) Samples of stuffs—of worn stuffs (tissues) not including specimens of stuffs not worn, all sorts of drills and rags of stuffs, whatever may be the tissue, paper scrapings, raw skins, bladders, and guts fresh and dry. salted guts.

(d.) Ox hair, horse hair, but not painted horse hair sieves, hogs' bristles not cleaned, camels' hair, raw feathers, excepting dyed or clean feathers, and feather cushions (the cushions of travellers will be disinfected at the frontier), wool unwashed and not disinfected, raw cotton (excepting cotton washed cleaned and repaired for dressings), and new wadding.

(e.) Furs not made up (garments lined with fur shall be disinfected), caviare, herrings, and other salt fish, dried, smoked, or pickled (but not preserved fish in hermetically sealed metallic cases).

(g.) Oil in casks and in leather bottles, ham, bacon, and other pork butchers' wares, suet, hogs' grease, patés, biscuits.

(h.) Milk, milk food, cream, butter, cheeses, hard or soft, fresh fruit, green vegetables, potatoes, used sacks, excepting sacks which have served for the transport of cereals, and which should be disinfected at the frontier.

The entry of the objects above is forbidden, whether they come from the countries indicated above, or whether they have passed through any of those countries after the appearance of cholera.

1. Turkey in Europe being considered as yet not contaminated by the cholera, arrivals from that country are exempted from quarantine and disinfection, in conformity with paragraph 5 of the Circular of October 1-13th.

2. The importation into Bulgaria of the article enumerated in paragraph 8 of the said Circular is prohibited, no matter from what country they may come

As an exception to sub-paragraph (2), the importation of lemons and oranges is allowed without their being submitted to any quarantine, after the coverings in which they are encased have been disinfected.
