Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to inquire into the conditions and circumstances under which land in Wales and Monmouthshire is held, occupied, and cultivated, and to report thereupon.

Now know ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these Presents authorize and appoint, you, the said Charles Robert, Baron Carrington ; Lloyd, Baron Kenyon ; Sir John Talbot Dillwyn Llewelyn ; David Brynmor Jones ; John Rhys ; John Morgan Griffiths ; Edwin Grove ; Richard Jones ; and Frederic Seebohm ; to be Our Commissioners for the said purpose.

And for the better effecting the purpose of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission, and also to call for, have access to, and examine, all such books, documents, registers, and records as

may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places in Our United Kingdom as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purpose aforesaid.

And We do further by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is, that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matter herein submitted for your consideration.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's*, the twenty-seventh day of *March*, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in the fifty-sixth year of Our Reign.
