The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said Majesty chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the first day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty-three have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the rural deaneries or some of them which are within the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas there are at present three archdeaconries within the said diocese of Manchester to wit the archdeaconry of Manchester the archdeaconry of Blackburn and the archdeaconry of Lancaster.

"And whereas the statutory schedule (prepared under the provisions of the hereinbefore lastly mentioned Act) of the rural deaneries within the said two archdeaconries of Manchester and of Lancaster respectively is dated the first day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five.

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the thirteenth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven and published in the London Gazette on the seventeenth day of that month the said archdeaconry of Blackburn was formed out of the said archdeaconry of Manchester and certain rearrangements of the rural deaneries within the said diocese of Manchester were authorized.

"And whereas it has been represented to us by any other archdeacon or rural dean the intent the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said of these our recommendations and proposals being

diocese of Manchester that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the rural deaneries or some of them within the said diocese are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect.

"And whereas the said arrangements involve certain alterations of the areas of certain of the rural deaneries within the said diocese and the division of the rural deanery of Bolton-le-Moors in the said archdeaconry of Manchester into two rural deaneries one to be called the rural deanery of Bolton North and the other to be called the rural deanery of Bolton South thus involving the extinction of the said rural deanery of Bolton-le-Moors as such and the formation of two rural deaneries in place thereof in the same arch-

deaconry.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (in testimony whereof he hath set his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said archdeaconry of Manchester the said archdeaconry of Blackburn and the said archdeaconry of Lancaster respectively shall comprise and consist of those rural deaneries the names of which are set down in order under the name of each of the said archdeaconries respectively in the schedule to this scheme annexed and that the name which in the said schedule is given to any rural deanery shall be the name thereof and that every parish or cure or church the name of which is set down in numbered order in the first column of the said schedule under the names of any one of the said archdeaconries respectively and under the name of any specified rural deanery in any one of the said archdeaconries respectively shall belong to and be and form a part of the archdeaconry and of the rural deanery under the respective names of which it may appear as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the archdeacon of the same archdeaconry and of the rural dean of the same rural deanery and shall not belong to or be or form a part of any other archdeaconry or rural deanery nor be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other archdeacon or rural dean the intent

that the said schedule to this scheme annexed shall as to the first column thereof be (in so far as the same legally can or may be) as from the day aforesaid substituted for the hereinbefore mentioned statutory schedule of rural deaneries within the said diocese of Manchester as aforesaid and for the schedules referred to in the said Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the thirteenth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven as aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them under or by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.
