TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING
ROOMS.**

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200 at each Drawing Room.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families,

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, the accompanying Presidential Decree extending to Algeria the provisions of the French Law of August 8, 1893, respecting the sojourn of foreigners in France and the protection of national labour.

The text of the Law in question was published with a translation in the London Gazette of September 1, 1893:—

Vu la Loi du 8 Août 1893, relative au séjour des étrangers en France et à la protection du travail national ;

Vu les propositions du Gouverneur-Général de l'Algérie, le Conseil de Gouvernement entendu ;

Sur le rapport du Ministre de l'Intérieur et du Garde des Sceaux, Ministre de la Justice,

Décète :

ART. 1. La Loi du 8 Août 1893, relative au séjour des étrangers en France et à la protection du travail national, est rendue exécutoire en Algérie.

Sont néanmoins maintenues toutes celles des dispositions du Décret du 21 Juin, 1890, qui ne sont pas contraires à ladite loi.

ART. 2. Le Ministre de l'Intérieur, le Garde des Sceaux, Ministre de la Justice, et le Gouverneur-Général de l'Algérie sont chargés, chacun en ce qui le concerne, de l'exécution du présent Décret.

WITH reference to the Decree of June 21, 1890, relative to the sojourn of foreigners in Algeria ;

With reference to the Law of August 8, 1893, relative to the sojourn of foreigners in France, and to the protection of national labour ;

With reference to the proposals of the Governor-General of Algeria, after consultation with the Council of the Government ;

The President of the French Republic, on the report of the Minister of the Interior and of the Keeper of the Seals, Minister of Justice, decrees as follows:—

ART. 1. The Law of August 8, 1893, relative to the sojourn of foreigners in France, and to the protection of national labour, is rendered applicable in Algeria.

Such, however, of the provisions of the Decree of June 21, 1890, as do not conflict with the said Law, remain in force.

ART. 2. The Minister of the Interior, the Keeper of the Seals, Minister of Justice, and the Governor-General of Algeria, are each, in so far

as concerns them, charged with the carrying out of the present Decree.

LÉOPOLD II, Roi des Belges,
A tous présents et à venir, salut.

Revu les Articles 12 et 13 de l'arrêté royal du 17 Août 1831, sur la police sanitaire, articles stipulant comme suit:

ART. 12. Tout navire arrivant d'un port quelconque et quelle que soit sa destination, sera porteur d'une patente de santé, laquelle fera connaître l'état sanitaire des lieux d'où il vient et son propre état sanitaire au moment où il en est parti.

ART. 13. Tout navire belge ou étranger qui n'a point de patente de santé, est sujet, outre les mesures auxquelles son état sanitaire le soumet, à un surcroît de quarantaine réglé selon les circonstances, et qui ne peut être moindre de cinq jours.

Considérant qu'il n'est pas nécessaire d'exiger une patente de santé des navires venant directement de pays ou de circonscriptions territoriales non contaminés et que les formalités relatives à la production de ce document occasionnent des retards préjudiciables au commerce;

Vu l'avis de la commission sanitaire de l'Escaut; Sur la proposition de Notre Ministre de l'Agriculture, de l'Industrie et des Travaux Publics,

Nous avons arrêté et arrêtons:

ART. 1. Un deuxième paragraphe, ainsi conçu, est ajouté à chacun des articles susvisés:

ART. 12. Néanmoins, la production de la patente de santé ne sera pas exigée des navires venant des pays ou des circonscriptions territoriales non contaminés dont la désignation aura lieu par arrêté du Ministre de l'Agriculture, de l'Industrie et des Travaux Publics.

ART. 13. Le présent article n'est pas applicable aux provenances des pays qui seront désignés par des arrêtés ministériels, pris conformément à la disposition finale de l'Article 12.

ART. 2. Notre Ministre de l'Agriculture, de l'Industrie et des Travaux Publics est chargé de l'exécution du présent arrêté.

Mildenhall Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Mildenhall Union, in the Administrative County of West Suffolk;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said Union;—

WHEREAS by an Order dated the 11th day of July, 1893, We, the Local Government Board, directed that from and after the 29th day of September, 1893, no Paupers should be admitted to or retained in the Workhouse belonging to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Mildenhall Union, except such as were sick or infirm; and that the number of such sick and infirm Paupers accommodated in the said Workhouse should not at any time exceed twenty-eight, that is to say, sixteen male paupers and twelve female paupers; And whereas it is expedient that the operation of the said Order should be suspended for three months, and that other provision should be made with respect to the use of the said Workhouse during such period:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We hereby Order that for three months from the date hereof, or for such further period as We may approve, the operation of the said Order dated the eleventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, shall be suspended:

And We hereby further Order that during such period none but adult Paupers shall be admitted to or retained in the said Workhouse, and that no Ward of the said Workhouse shall be occupied otherwise than is mentioned in the Schedule to this Order nor by a number of Paupers larger than is fixed in such Schedule nor by Paupers of a class differing from that fixed in the said Schedule in respect of each Ward,

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order. Out-door Labour Test:—

Hemel Hempstead Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Hemel Hempstead Union, in the county of Hertford:—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said Union:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WE, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order, with respect to the relief of the Poor in the said Hemel Hempstead Union, as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.—Subject to the provisions of the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners dated the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in force in the Union, every able-bodied male pauper who receives relief within the Union, and is relieved out of the Workhouse, shall be relieved in the following manner; that is to say:—

Half at least of the relief given to such pauper shall be given in food, clothing, and other articles of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians, or any of their officers, or any Overseer of any Parish in the Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person; but every such pauper so relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2.—The Guardians shall, within fourteen days after the day when this Order comes into force, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board may require, report

to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers shall be so set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them shall be employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of such able-bodied paupers as the said Guardians shall deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board shall require.

ARTICLE 3.—If the Guardians shall depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and shall, within fifteen days after such departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board shall approve of such departure, then the relief granted in such particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

And whereas provision is made in a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in force in the said Union, for the appointment of an officer, to be termed a Superintendent of Out-door Labour, and for the continuance in office of such officer, and it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned;

We therefore further Order, that if at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief shall be so small as to render the services of a Superintendent of Out-door Labour unnecessary, the Guardians may dispense with the services of such an Officer.
