THE following Despatch has been addressed by the Marquess of Salisbury, K.G., Her Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, to the Marquess of Dufferin and Ava, K.P., G.C.B, &c., Her Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at Paris:—

The Marquess of Salisbury to the Marquess of Dufferin and Ava.

My Lord, Foreign Office, January 15, 1896.

I HAVE to-day signed, together with the French Ambassador, an agreement chiefly concerning the affairs of Siam, which I enclose. I had hoped to have sent it to you before Christmas; but the signature of it was accidently delayed. The most important provision which it contains is that which marks out for special treatment, as between the two Powers, that portion of Siam which is comprised within the drainage basin of the Menam, and of the coast streams of a corresponding longitude. Within this area the two Powers undertake that they will not operate by their military or naval forces, except so far as they may do it in concert for any purpose which may be required for maintaining the independence of Siam. They also undertake not to acquire within that area any privileges or commercial facilities which are not extended to both of them. In transmitting this Agreement to your Excellency, I am anxious to say a few words in explanation of it, in order to avoid a misinterpretation to which it might be exposed at the hands of those who are not familiar with recent negotiations. It might be thought that because we have engaged ourselves, and have received the engagement of France, not under any circumstances to invade this territory, that therefore we are throwing doubt upon the complete title and rights of the Siamese to the remainder of their kingdom, or, at all events, treating those rights with disregard. Any such interpretation would entirely misrepresent the intention with which this arrangement has been signed. We fully recognize the rights of Siam to the full and undisturbed enjoyment, in accordance with long usage, or with existing Treaties, of the entire territory comprised within her dominions; and nothing in our present action would detract in any degree from the validity of the rights of the King of Siam to those portions of his territory which are not affected by this Treaty. We have selected a particular area for the application of the stipulations of this Treaty, not because the title of the King of Siam to other portions of his dominions is less valid, but because it is the area which affects our interests as a commercial nation. The valley of the Menam is eminently fitted to receive a high industrial development. Possibly in course of time it may be the site of lines of communication which will be of considerable importance to neighbouring portions of the British Empire. There seems every prospect that capital will flow into this region if reasonable security is offered for its investment, and great advantage would result to the commerce and industry of the world, and especially of Great Britain, if capitalists could be induced to make such an application of the force which they command. But the history of the region in which Siam is situated has not in recent years been favourable to the extension of industrial enterprise, or to the growth of that confidence which is the first condition of material improvement. A large territory to the north has passed from the hands of the Burmese Government to those of Great Britain. A large territory to the east has passed from the hands of its former possessors to those of France. The events of this recent history certainly have a tendency to encourage doubts of the stability of the Siamese dominion; and without in any degree sharing in those doubts, or admitting the possibility, within any future with which we have to deal, of the Siamese independence being compromised, Her Majesty's Government could not but feel that there would be an advantage in giving some security to the commercial world that, in regard to the region where the most active development is likely to take place, no further disturbances of territorial ownership are to be apprehended.

I must add that we already have a very considerable trade with Siam which passes almost

I must add that we already have a very considerable trade with Siam which passes almost entirely through this region, and that any alteration of ownership which should carry with it Tariffs of a highly restrictive order would be a heavy blow to our commerce in that part of the world.

Her Majesty's Government hope that the signature of this Agreement will tend to foster the

Her Majesty's Government hope that the signature of this Agreement will tend to foster the industrial growth of all these extensive districts; and they have been sufficiently impressed with this belief to be willing to attest it by admitting the French claims to the ownership of the Möng Hsing district of Keng Cheng, a triangular portion of territory on the eastern side of the Upper Mekong. Its extent and intrinsic value are not large, and, on account of its unhealthy character, it has no

great attractions for Great Britain, though her title to it as formerly tributary to Burmah appears to us evidently sound; but its retention by her might prove a serious embarrassment to the cheap and effective administration by France of her possessions in that neighbourhood.

Declaration.

THE undersigned, duly authorized by their respective Governments, have signed the follow-

ing Declaration : -

I. The Governments of Great Britain and France engage to one another that neither of them will, without the consent of the other, in any case, or under any pretext, advance their armed forces into the region which is comprised in the basins of the Petcha Bouri, Meiklong, Menam and Bang Pa Kong (Petriou) Rivers and their respective tributaries, together with the extent of coast from Muong Bang Tapan to Muong Pase, the basins of the rivers on which those two places are situated, and the basins of the other rivers, the estuaries of which are included in that coast; and including also the territory lying to the north of the basin of the Menam, and situated between the Anglo-Siamese frontier, the Mekong River, and the eastern watershed of the Me Ing. They further engage not to acquire within this region any special privilege or advantage which shall not be enjoyed in common by, or equally open to, Great Britain and France and their nationals and dependents. These stipulations, however, shall not be interpreted as derogating from the special clauses which, in virtue of the Treaty concluded on the 3rd October, 1893, between France and Siam, apply to a zone of 25 kilom. on the right bank of the Mekong and to the navigation of that river.

II. Nothing in the foregoing clause shall hinder any action on which the two Powers may agree, and which they shall think necessary in order to uphold the independence of the Kingdom of Siam. But they engage not to enter into any separate Agreement permitting a third Power to take any action from which they are bound by the present Declaration themselves to abstain.

III. From the mouth of the Nam Huck northwards as far as the Chinese frontier the thalweg of the Mekong shall form the limit of the possessions or spheres of influence of Great Britain and France. It is agreed that the nationals and dependents of each of the two countries shall not exercise any jurisdiction or authority within the possessions or sphere of influence of the other.

The police of the islands in this part of the river which are separated from the British shore by a branch of the river shail, so long as they are thus separated, be entrusted to the French authorities. The fishery shall be open to the inhabitants of both banks.

IV. The two Governments agree that all commercial and other privileges and advantages conceded in the two Chinese provinces of Yünnan and Szechueneither to Great Britain or France, in virtue of their respective Conventions with China of the 1st March, 1894, and the 20th June, 1895, and all privileges and advantages of any nature which may in the future be conceded in these two Chinese provinces, either to Great Britain or France, shall, as far as rests with them, be extended and rendered common to both Powers and to their nationals and dependents, and they engage to use their influence and good offices with the Chinese Government for this purpose.

Les Soussignés, dûment autorisés par leurs Gouvernements respectifs, ont signé la Déclaration suivante:—

I. Les Gouvernements de Grande-Bretagne et de France s'engagent mutuellement à ne faire pénétrer, dans aucun cas et sous aucun pretexte, sans le consentement l'un de l'autre, leurs forces armées dans la région comprenant les bassins des Rivières Petchabouri, Meiklong, Ménam, et Bang Pa Kong (Rivière de Petriou) et de leurs affluents respectifs, ainsi que le littoral qui s'étend depuis Muong Bang Tapan jusqu'à Muong Pase, les bassins des rivières sur lesquelles sont situées ces deux villes, et les bassins des autres rivières dont les embouchures sont incluses dans cette étendue de littoral; et comprenant aussi le territoire situé au nord du bassin du Ménam entre la frontière Anglo-Siamoise, le fleuve Mékong, et la limite orientale du bassin du Me Ing. Ils s'engagent en outre à n'acquérir dans cette région aucun privilège ou avantage particulier dont le bénéfice ne soit pas commun à la Grande-Bretagne et à la France, à leurs nationaux et ressortissants, ou qui ne leur serait pas accessible sur le pied de l'égalité. Ces stipulations, toutefois, ne seront pas interprétées comme dérogeant aux clauses spéciales qui, en vertu du Traité conclu le 3 Octobre, 1893, entre la France et le Siam, s'appliquent à une zone de 25 kilom, sur la rive droite du Mékong et à la navigation de ce fleuve.

II. Rien dans la clause qui précède ne mettra obstacle à aucune action dont les deux Puissances pourraient convenir, et qu'elles jugeraient nécessaire pour maintenir l'indépendance du Royaume de Siam. Mais elles s'engagent à n'entrer dans aucun arrangement séparé qui permette à une tierce Puissance de faire ce qu'elles s'interdisent réciproquement par la présente Déclaration.

III. A partir de l'embouchure du Nam Huok et en remontant vers le nord jusqu'à la frontière Chinoise, le thalweg du Mékong formera la limite des possessions ou sphères d'influence de la Grande-Bretagne et de la France. Il est convenu que les nationaux et ressortissants d'aucun des deux pays n'exerceront une juridiction ou autorité quelconque dans les possessions ou la sphère d'influence de l'autre pays.

Dans la partie du fleuve dont il s'agit, la police des îles séparées de la rive Britannique par un bras du dit fleuve appartiendra aux autorités Françaises tant que cette séparation existera. L'exercice du droit de pêche sera commun aux habitants des deux rives.

IV. Les deux Gouvernements conviennent que tous les privilèges et avantages commerciaux ou autres, concédés dans les deux provinces Chinoises du Yünnan et du Setchuen soit à la Grande-Bretagne, soit à la France, en vertu de leurs Conventions respectives avec la Chine du 1er Mars, 1894, et du 20 Juin, 1895, et tous les privilèges et avantages de nature quelconque qui pourront être concédés par la suite dans ces deux mêmes provinces Chinoises soit à la Grande-Bretagne, soit à la France, seront, autant qu'il dépend d'eux, étendus et rendus communs aux deux Puissances, à leurs nationaux et ressortissants, et ils s'engagent à user à cet effet de leur influence et de leurs bons offices auprès du Gouvernement Chinois.

V. The two Governments agree to name Commissioners delegated by each of them, who shall be charged to fix by mutual agreement, after examination of the titles produced on either side, the most equitable delimitation between the British and French possessions in the region situated to the west of the Lower Niger.

VI. In conformity with the stipulations of Article XL of the General Convention concluded between Great Britain and the Regency of Tunis on the 19th July, 1875, which provides for a revision of that Treaty "in order that the two Contracting Parties may have the opportunity of hereafter treating and agreeing upon such other arrangements as may tend still further to the improvement of their mutual intercourse, and to the advancement of the interests of their respective people," the two Governments agree at once to commence negotiations for replacing the said General Convention by a new Convention which shall correspond with the intentions proposed in the Article above referred to.

Conformément aux stipulations de l'Article XL de la Convention Générale conclue entre la Grande-Bretagne et la Régence de Tunis le 19 Juillet, 1875, qui prévoit une révision de ce Truité "afin que les deux Parties Contractantes puissent avoir occasion de traiter ultérieurement et de convenir de tels arrangements qui puissent tendre encore davantage à améliorer leurs relations mutuelles et à développer les intérêts de leurs nations respectives" les deux Gouvernements conviennent d'ouvrir immédiatement des négociations en vue de remplacer la dite Convention Générale par une Convention nouvelle répondant aux intentions annoncées dans l'Article qui vient d'être cité.

M. LE MARQUIS, Londi es, le 15 Junvier, 1896.

LES deux Gouvernements de France et de Grande-Bretagne s'étant mis d'accord pour régler un certain nombre de questions qui ont donné lieu dans les derniers temps à des discussions entre eux, je suis heureux de pouvoir vous annoncer l'adhésion du Gouvernement de la République Française aux arrangements constatés par la Déclaration ci-jointe que j'ai été autorisé à signer avec votre Seigneurie.

Mon Gouvernement a la confiance que la conclusion de ces négociations, en manifestant la boune entente établie entre la France et l'Angleterre, sera de nature à exercer une influence salutaire sur les populations soumises à l'autorité des deux pays ou voisines de leurs possessions respectives. témoignera en particulier de leur commune sollicitude pour la sécurité et la stabilité du Royaume de Siam. Les assurances que les deux Gouvernements ont échangées impliquent en effet de la part de chacun d'eux le désir d'entretenir avec ce royaume les relations les plus amicales, et l'intention de respecter les Conventions existantes.

My Lord Marquis,

London, January 15, 1896.

THE two Governments of France and Great Britain having agreed to settle certain questions which have recently given rise to discussions between them, I am happy to be able to notify to you the accession of the French Government to the arrangements set forth in the annexed Declaration, which I have been authorized to sign with your Lordship.

My Government is confident that the conclusion of these negotiation, by giving evidence of the good understanding established between France and England, will be of a nature to exercise a salutary influence over the populations subject to the authority of the two countries, or dwelling in the neighbourhood of their respective possessions. It will, in particular, give evidence of their joint solicitude for the security and stability of the Kingdom of Siam. The assurances which the two Governments have exchanged imply, in fact, the desire on the part of each of them to maintain the most friendly relations with that Kingdom, and the intention to respect existing conventions.

I do not doubt but that your Lordship will share my opinion in this respect, and I take this ALPH. DE COURCEL. opportunity, &c. (Signed)

YOUR EXCELLENCY, I HAVE the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your note of this day's date, in which you announce that your Government accept the arrangements agreed upon between us for the settlement of various questions which have recently been the subject of discussion between our two Governments, and that you are authorized to sign the Declaration in which these arrangements are set forth.

I have received this announcement with much satisfaction, and shall be ready to sign the

Declaration with you at once.

You state that your Government feel confident that the conclusion of these negotiations, by giving evidence of the good understanding established between Great Britain and France, will be calculated to exercise a salutary influence over the populations subject to the authority of the two countries or dwelling in the neighbourhood of their respective possessions.

You add that the Declaration will, in particular, give evidence of the joint solicitude of the two Governments for the security and stability of the Kingdom of Siam, and that the assurances which they have exchanged imply the desire on the part of each of them to maintain with that kingdom the most friendly relations, and to respect existing Conventions.

I have pleasure in receiving and taking note of this statement of the views and intentions of your Government, and, in offering you the same assurances on the part of the Government of Her Britannic Majesty, I have, &c.,
