I HAVE the honour to forward inclosed herewith a translation of a copy of a Departmental Order which has been received by the Collector of Customs here from the Direction-General of Customs in Madrid, and which is already being carried out by the Barcelona Custom-house.

The Order throws upon the captain of each vessel, British or foreign, the responsibility of proving that he has paid the proper Consular dues to the Spanish Consul at the port of loading, and authorizes the Collector of Customs to charge them on the arrival of the vessel here if proof be not presented in the shape of a receipt from the Consul or a note by him on the manifest of the steamer, stating the amount of fees paid.
