The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presenta-tion cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200

at each Drawing Room.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

1N pursuance of the powers conferred on me by "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894," and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Dorset, I hereby make the following Order: -

The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following Wild Birds, namely:—

Dabchick, or Little Grebe, Chough, Common, Lesser, and Arctic Terns, Common Sandpiper, Coot, Curlew, Heron, Oyster Catcher, Pipits, Pochards, Raven, Redshank, Ringed Plover or Dotterel, Sheldrake, Stonechats, Water Rail, Wheatear, is prohibited within the following

areas, namely:-

The district or area on the east of Wareham, bounded by the main road leading to Blandford as far as the junction thereof with the Poole and Dorchester main road, thence westwards, bounded by the said Poole and Dorchester main road for about three-quarters of a mile to a point at right angles to Stroud Bridge, on the Bere and Wareham main road, thence through Cold Harbour to Wareham, and also the district or area known as The Chesil Bank, together with the West and East Fleet, the coast of Portland Roads, from Portland Castle to Sandsfoot Castle, Lodmoor,

The cliffs from White Nose to Lulworth Cove, the cliffs from St. Alban's Head to Swanage, Studland Bay, Little Sea, and the coast from Studland to the entrance to Poole Harbour, and in each case a distance of two furlongs inland from the nearest point of highwater mark.

Foole Harbour, and an area situate within the following boundaries: -A line drawn from the coast opposite Little Sea, past Quay, to within one furlong of Neas Point, and thence to Wych, the road to Corfe Castle, through Wareham to Stroud Bridge, thence to Morden Mill, the road over Sherford Bridge to Sandford Bridge, thence to Keysworth and East Holton, thence to Lytchett

Minster, through Upton to Bushels Mill, the main road to Longfleet and Poole, thence along the main road to the county boundary at Bournemouth, and along such boundary to the coast.

The above areas are shown in pink on a map deposited with the County Council and scaled with the seal of this office.

ORDER OF THE LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL RE-ARRANGING THE RE - ARRANGING WARDS OF THE PARISH OF ST. MARY, ISLINGTON, APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

To the Vestry of the parish of St. Mary, Islington;

And all whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by section 15 of the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1893, as amended by the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1895, section 42, it is enacted that the London County Council may from time to time for the purpose of Elections of Vestrymen, upon the application in writing of the Vestry, or of not less than five hundred rated householders of a parish mentioned in Schedules A and B to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, by order under their seal, re-arrange the wards in such parish, and determine the number, extent, limits, and boundary lines of the new wards, but so nevertheless that no ward shall contain less than five hundred rated householders, and the Council shall, in making any such re-arrangement apportion among the several wards the number of Vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and shall in assigning the number of Vestrymen to each ward have regard so far as practicable as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and the number of Vestrymen assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three; and it is also by the said London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1893, enacted that any such Order may contain such provisions with reference to the election, rotation and retirement of Vestrymen (whether elected prior or subsequently to the date of the Order) as the Council may think necessary for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Order.

And whereas the parish of St. Mary, Islington, is a parish mentioned in Part I of Schedule A to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, the said

parish was divided into eight wards.

And whereas the vestry of the said parish hath applied to the London County Council to rearrange the wards of the said parish pursuant to the provisions of the said 15th section of the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1893, as amended by section 42 of the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1895.

And whereas it appears from the rate books of the said parish prepared in the month of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, that the said parish contains forty-one thousand five hundred and sixty-eight rated householders, and that the ratable annual value of property, exclusive of the public companies, in the said parish is one million four hundred and eighty-six thousand one hundred and sixty-five pounds.

Now the London County Council having considered the said application, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each proposed new ward of the said parish, and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the wards of the said parish of St. Mary, Islington, be, and the same are hereby re-arranged in manner following, that is to say, that the said parish be divided into eleven wards instead of eight wards; that the eleven wards be distinguished by the numbers and names mentioned in the first column of the first Schedule hereunder written, that the extent, limits and boundary lines of such wards be those described in the second column of the said Schedule, and that the number of Vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards be the number mentioned in the third column of the said man en min skapen i de Schedule.

And whereas the London County Council thinks it necessary that this Order should, for the purpose of carrying out the foregoing provisions, contain the following provisions with reference to the election, rotation and retirement of Vestrymen.

Now the said London County Council doth hereby further order as follows, that is to say—

(1) That at the time appointed for the annual election of Vestrymen, the number of Vestrymen retiring, the number to be elected, and the number of years for which they shall respectively be elected, shall be as follows, that is to say—

In the year 1896 the numbers stated opposite the names of the several wards in the column headed. "1896" in the Second Schedule hereunder written.

In the year 1897 those similarly stated in the column headed "1897."

In the year 1898 those similarly stated in the column headed "1898."

In the year 1899 those similarly stated in the column headed ".1899." -

(2.) That the Vestrymen who are respectively to be elected in the years 1896, 1897 and 1898, for less than three years shall be determined according to their place on the poll at the election, those Vestrymen who were lowest on the poll going out of office first. If at any election there shall have been no poll or a question shall arise in consequence of an equality of votes between two or more Vestrymen, the Vestry shall at some meeting before the time of the next annual election, determine by lot which of the Vestrymen elected at such election shall be the ones to go out of office at the end of two years and one year respectively.

HEREAS the infectious disease known as Swine Fever at present exists in Ireland and other parts of the United Kingdom:

And whereas, in order to prevent the introduction of the said disease, it is deemed advisable to make orders for regulating the importation of swine into this Island:

Now, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two Members of the Council, under the powers conferred by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, do hereby order as follows:

- 1. Any person desiring to import swine into this Island from the United Kingdom shall make an application to the Lieutenant-Governor at least seven days before the date on which it is intended to import such swine, for permission to
- 2. Such application shall contain a statement of the ages, colour, sex, appearance, and condition of the swine which it is so intended to import.
- 3. Such application shall be accompanied with an affidavit, duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace, from the person or persons whose property the swine have been during the three months immediately preceding, that they have not been in contact with any swine affected with Swine Fever during the six months immediately preceding the date of such affidavit.
- 4. On receipt of these particulars, it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor to sanction the importation of such swine, or any of them. But no swine shall be imported unless such permission has been given by the Lieutenant-Governor in writing.

5. The person importing such swine shall give at least twenty-four hours' notice, in writing, to the Collector of Customs and the Chief Constable of the port at which he proposes to land such swine, and of the boat by which he proposes to import them.

6. No swine shall be permitted to be so landed which do not appear to be included among those for whose landing the Lieutenant-Governor's per-

mission has been obtained.
