GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Workhouse and Infirmary Regulations: Altering: Appointment of Nurses:—
West Derby Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the West Derby Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said West Derby Union (among others), the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Regulations for the government of the Workhouse of that Union;

And whereas by Article 153 of the said Order provision was made for the appointment by the said Guardians of persons to hold certain offices in the said Workhouse, including the office of Nurse, and by Articles 155 and 172 of such Order it was further directed that every such appointment should be reported to the Poor Law Commissioners, and that the Guardians should pay to the Officers so appointed such salaries or remuneration as the said Commissioners might from time to time direct or approve;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made with regard to the appointment of persons to hold the office of Nurse at the Workhouse belonging to the said Guardians situated at Belmont Road:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers application to the Secretary, Board given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We 4. Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

hereby Order and Direct that, notwithstanding anything contained in the above-cited Order, if the Guardians of the Poer of the said West Derby Union shall submit to Us for Our approval a Statement showing the total number of persons which the said Guardians consider it necessary to appoint to hold the office of Nurse in the said. Workhouse at Belmont Road, and the salaries or scale of salaries to be assigned to such Nurses, and We approve such Statement, it shall not be necessary for the said Guardians to report to Us each appointment of a person to hold the office of Nurse at the said Workhouse under the abovecited Order, nor to obtain our approval to the remuneration of any such person, so long as the number of persons so appointed, and their salaries, do not exceed the number of persons and the scale of salaries shown in the said Statement and approved by Us.
