THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs received, on the 26th ultimo, from the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Costarican Republic a note, dated the 4th ultimo, denouncing Articles V, VI, and VII of the Treaty of Iriendship, Commerce, and Navigation between Great Britain and the Republic of Costarica concluded on the 27th of November, 1849.

This notice of denunciation, which is in conformity with the provisions of Article XV of that Treaty, has been accepted by Her Majesty's Government, and Articles V, VI, and VII of the Treaty will cease and determine accordingly on

the 26th of November, 1897.

All the other Articles of the Treaty will remain in force.
