COLINTON (MIDLOTHIAN) DISTRICT SWINE-FEVER AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1897.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extension of District to which the Colinton (Midlothian) District Swine, Fever Order of 1897 applies.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the District described, in the Schedule to this Order shall be deemed to be substituted for the District described in the Schedule to the Colinton (Midlothian) District Swine-Fever Order of 1897 dated the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and that Order shall be read and have effect accordingly.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

3. This Order may be cited as the Colinton (Midlothian) District Swine-Fever Amend-MENT ORDER of 1897.
