THE following Address of congratulation from the Archbishops and Bishops assembled at the Lambeth Conference has been laid before the Queen by the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Bart., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department:-

May it please Your Majesty,

WE, the Archbishops and Bishops gathered together at Lambeth from every part of Your Majesty's Dominions, from the United States of America and from mission fields in all quarters of the world, desire to approach Your Majesty with every expression of heartfelt rejoicing, that it has pleased Almighty God to vouchsafe to Your Majesty the wonderful blessings of the last Sixty Years. We further desire respectfully to express to Your Majesty our gratitude for the continued manifestation of Your Majesty's interest and sympathy in the great work of this Conference, namely the furtherance of true religion and the closer knitting together of the hearts of all men in deeper love for our Heavenly Father and for each other.

Nine years ago Your Majesty was graciously pleased to express an anxious desire to promote all measures that might tend to maintain the spirit of true religion, and to pray that our labours for the increase of Christian Faith might receive the Divine Blessing. This year Your Majesty has not only manifested the same gracious interest in the work of the Conference, but has been pleased to invite the members of the Conference to Windsor, and to give to them that encouragement which Your Majesty's presence

never fails to impart.

That God may vouchsafe in fullest measure His Heavenly Blessing to Your Majesty and Your Royal House, and that a reign, alike beneficent and glorious, may by His Mercy be prolonged, is the earnest prayer of those who now subjoin their names to this Address:—

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Vienna, transmitting the following Quarantine Notice issued by the Austro-Hungarian Government:

Order of the Ministries of the Interior, Trade, and Finance, dated July 31, 1897, respecting the extension of the prohibition issued in the order of February 18, 1897 (Reichsgesetz Blatt No. 54), against the import and transport of certain animal raw products and waste from the ports of British India, and westwards as far as the Red Sea, and on the east coast of the Red Sea as far as the opening of the Suez Canal into the Gulf of Suez.

In consequence of the appearance of the bubonic plague at Jeddah, after consideration by the Supreme Sanitary Council in concert with the Royal Hungarian Government the order of the Ministries of the Interior, Trade, and Finance of February 18, 1897 (Reichsgesetz Blatt, No. 54), respecting the import and transport of certain animal raw products and waste from the ports of British India, and those lying westwards as far as the Red Sea, is extended to the territory on the east coast of the Red Sea as far as the opening of the Suez Canal into the Gulf of Suez.

This order comes into force on the day on which it is made known to the custom houses or Marine Sanitary Offices concerned.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extent and Enforcement.

1. This Order applies to and shall be in force in the District described in the Schedule to this Order, and hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, and shall, except where otherwise provided, be executed and enforced by the Local: Authorities of the City of London, the County of London, the County of Middlesex, and the Borough of West Ham, in their respective Districts.

Restriction on Movement of Cattle out of Registered Cowkeeper's Premises.

2.—(1.) No cattle shall be moved out of or from any premises of a Registered Cowkeeper situate in the Scheduled District except-

(i.) to a specified slaughter-house situate within. the Scheduled District for the purpose of: being there slaughtered, or

(ii.) to a specified place within the Scheduled District for purposes connected with the

with a Licence of an Inspector or officer of the Board, and in accordance with the conditions contained in such Licence.

(2.) Any such Licence may contain a condition prescribing and regulating the marking of the cattle to be moved thereunder and the slaughter within a specified time of cattle moved to a

slaughter-house.

(3.) In the case of any head of cattle moved to a slaughter-house with a Licence under this Article, the lungs shall remain attached by the windpipe to the carcase and the hide remain partially attached to the carcase until the carcase has been examined by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the Board for that purpose.

(4.) Provided that the provisions of this Article shall not apply in the case of movement of cattle for a distance not exceeding five hundred yards from premises to other premises in the same

occupation within the Scheduled District.

Prohibition to Move Cattle between 7 PM. and ŏ A.M.

3. No cattle shall be moved out of or from any premises of a Registered Cowkeeper situate in the Scheduled District between the hours of 7 P.M. and 5 A.M.

Restriction on Removal of Carcases out of Registered Cowkeeper's Premises.

4. No carcase nor any portion thereof shall be removed out of or from any premises of a Registered Cowkeeper situate in the Scheduled District except with a Licence of an Inspector or officer of the Board, and in accordance with the conditions contained in such Licence.

Restriction on Burial or Destruction of Carcases on Registered Cowheeper's Premises.

5. No carcase nor any portion thereof shall be buried or destroyed in or on any premises of a Registered Cowkeeper situate in the Scheduled District except with a Licence of an Inspector or officer of the Board, and in accordance with the conditions contained in such Licence.

Carcases of Cattle Affected with Pleuro-Pneumonia.

6. The carcase of a head of cattle in or on the premises of a Registered Cowkeeper situate in the Scheduled District that was when it died or was slaughtered affected with pleuropneumonia shall be dealt with in such manner as the Board may direct, and not otherwise, and the provisions of Article 7 of the Pleuro-Pneumonia Order of 1895 shall not apply to any such carcase.

Reservation of Power by Board to Grant Licences in Exceptional Circumstances.

7. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, a head of cattle may be moved in any circumstances with a Licence of the Board, which Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

8.—(1.) Any person in charge of a head of cattle or a carcase being moved, where under this Order a Licence for such movement is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer. Offences.

9.—(1.) If a head of cattle is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a head of cattle or a carcase being moved, where under this Order a Licence for such movement is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the

Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If a carcase is removed in contravention. of this Order, or is buried or destroyed in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the owner of the carcase, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the removal or burial or destruction, and the person removing or conveying the carcase or burying or destroying the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been removed in contravention as aforesaid, and the person burying or destroying the carcase, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(4.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order-

"Registered Cowkeeper" means any person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper who for the time being is registered under any Order of the Privy Council, or Local Government Board, or under any regulation or byelaw of a Local Authority made under the powers conferred by any Act relating to Dairies, Cow-Sheds, and Milk-Shops:

"Premises of a Registered Cowkeeper" means and includes any cow-shed, field, yard, farm, or other place in the occupation of a Registered Cowkeeper:

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture: "Cattle" means bulls, cows, oxen, heifers, and

"Carcase" means the carcase of a head of cattle, and includes part of a carcase, and the meat, bones, hide, skin, hoofs, horns, offal, or other part of a head of cattle, separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.
