To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty. May it please Your Majesty,

WE, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ramsgate, venture to approach Your Majesty with hearts full of joy and thankfulness, and dutifully and loyally tender our congratulations on the completion of the Sixtieth Year of Your Majesty's Reign.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 1ST SEPTEMBER 1897.)

(Swine-Fever Infected Area.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penálty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of September, one thousand eight

bundred and ninety-seven.
