PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The County Courts Act, 1888" (fifty-one and fifty-two Victoria chapter forty-three), that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council, from time to time to alter the number and boundaries of the districts and places of holding of any Court, and to order the discontinuance of the holding of any Court, and the consolidation of any two or more districts, and the division of any district, and to order by what name and in what towns and places a Court shall be held in such district:

And whereas it is expedient that alterations should be made in the Court districts and Court towns in the Schedule to this Order specified with the view of bringing the Court districts into greater uniformity with the areas of Local Government and with the view of meeting the existing requirements of the localities concerned:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in that behalf by "The County Courts Act, 18×8," or otherwise in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as tollows:

1. This Order may be cited as "The County Court (Districts) Amendment Order in Council 1898."

2. This Order shall come into force on the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

3.—(o.) The County Court of Derbyshire held at Derby shall be held at Long Eaton as well as at Derby. The parishes of Stapleford and Toton shall cease to form part of the district of the County Court of Nottinghamshire held at Nottingham and shall form part of the district of the County Court of Derbyshire held at Derby and Long Eaton and the said districts shall consist of the areas in the Schedule to this Order specified.

(b.) The County Court of Durham shall cease to be held at Middlesbrough and the County Court of Yorkshire shall be held at Middlesbrough in addition to the places at which it is now held: The district of the County Court of Durham held at Stockton-on-Tees and Middlesbrough shall be divided into two districts viz.:—the district of the County Court of Durham held at Stockton-on-

Tees and the district of the County Court of Yorkshire held at Middlesbrough and those districts shall consist of the areas in the Schedule to this Order specified.

(c.) The County Court of Durham held at Hartlepool shall be held at West Hartlepool

instead of at Hartlepool.

(d.) The County Court of Essex shall be held at Grays Thurrock in addition to the places at which it is now held and so much of the districts of the County Court of Essex held at Brentwood and Romford and of the County Court of Kent held at Gravesend as is comprised in the Union of Orsett shall cease to form part of such districts and the districts of the County Court of Essex held at Brentwood, Grays Thurrock, and Romford and the district of the County Court of Kent held at Gravesend shall consist of the areas in the Schedule to this Order specified.

(e.) The districts of the County Court of Hampshire held at Christchurch and Bournemouth, and at Fordingbridge and Ringwood, and at Lymington shall consist of the areas in the

Schedule to this Order specified.

- (f.) The parish of Haydock shall cease to form part of the district of the County Court of Lancashire held at Warrington and shall form part of the district of the County Court of Lancashire held at Saint Helens and Widnes.
- (g.) The parishes of Burnage, Didsbury, and Withington shall cease to form part of the district of the County Court of Cheshire held at Stockport and shall form part of the district of the County Court of Lancashire held at Manchester, and the said districts shall consist of the areas in the Schedule to this Order specified.
- (h.) The district of the County Court of Monmouthshire held at Abergavenny shall comprise the whole of the Urban district of Blaenavon, and the said County Court shall be held at Blaenavon as well as at Abergavenny. The districts of the County Court of Monmouthshire held at Abergavenny and Blaenavon, Pontypool, and Tredegar and the district of the County Court of Brecknockshire held at Crickhowell shall respectively consist of the areas in the Schedule to this Order specified.
- (i.) The parishes of Great Weldon and Little Weldon shall cease to form part of the district of the County Court of Northamptonshire held at Oundle and shall form part of the district of the County Court of Northamptonshire held at Kettering and the districts of those County

to this Order specified.

(k.) The parishes and places now forming the district of the County Court of Northumberland held at Bellingham shall be consolidated with and form part of the district of the County Court of Northumberland held at Hexham and the said last named County Court shall be held at Bellingham as well as at Hexham.

(1.) The Urban district of South Blyth shall cease to form part of the district of the County Court of Northumberland held at North Shields and shall form part of the district of the County Court of Northumberland held at Morpeth and the said lest named County Court shall be held at Blyth as well as at Morpeth.

(m.) The County Court of Suffolk beld at Woodbridge shall be held at Felixstowe as well as

at Woodbridge.

(n.) The parishes of Cobham and Stoke D'Abernon shall cease to form part of the district of the County Court of Surrey held at Epsom and shall form part of the district of the County Court of Surrey held at Kingston and the said districts shall consist of the areas in the Schedule to this

Order specified.
(o.) The districts of the County Court of Carmarthenshire held at Carmarthen, Llaudovery and Llanelly shall consist of the areas in the

Schedule to this Order specified.

(p.) The district of the County Court of Glamorganshire held at Cardiff shall be divided into two districts viz. :- The district of the County Court of Glamorganshire held at Barry, and the district of the County Court of Glamorganshire held at Cardiff and the districts of those County Courts shall consist of the areas in the Schedule to this Order specified.

(q.) The district of the County Court of Glamorganshire held at Aberdare and Mountain Ash shall comprise the whole of the urban district of Mountain Ash, and the districts of the County Court of Glamorganshire held at Aberdare and Mountain Ash, and at Pontypridd, Ystradyfodwg, and Porth, shall consist of the areas in the Schedule to this Order specified.

- (r.) The district of the County Court of Radnorshire held at Rhayader shall comprise the whole of the urban district of Llandrindod Wells, and the said County Court shall be held at Llandrindod Wells as well as at Rhayader: The district of the County Court of Radnorshire held at Rhayader and Llandrindol Wells and the district of the County Court of Brecknockshire held at Builth shall respectively consist of the areas in the Schedule to this Order specified.
- 4. For the purposes of this Order the several areas and the towns and places described and named in the Schedule hereto shall be the Court Districts and the towns and places where the Courts shall be severally held therein, the first

Courts shall consist of the areas in the Schedule | column containing the names of the Court Towns and the second column containing the description of the Court Districts by reference to Unions or in the cases where the district is not co-terminous with one or more Unions by reference to parishes.

> 5.-(a) Each of the said Court Districts affected by this Order shall be deemed also to include all rivers, creeks, harbours, and waters included within the outer boundary thereof or thereunto adjoining which are within the body of any county of England and Wales. Provided that where any two Court Districts affected by or adjacent to any district affected by this Order shall be divided by a river, whether tidal or net ti 'al, the boundary line between the two districts shall be the mid-channel of such river.

(b.) Every place included within the outer boundary of a Court District affected by this Order shall be within the jurisdiction of the County Court for the county under which such place is mentioned in the description of the said several Court Districts hereunto annexed in like manner

as if it were part of such county.

(c.) Nothing in this Order contained shall affect the jurisdiction in Admiralty of County Courts or the Orders in Council assigning districts for or otherwise regulating the exercise of such jurisdiction and the districts so assigned shall for Admiralty purposes remain unaltered and attached to the same Courts as if this Order had not been made.

(d.) Nothing in this Order contained shall affect the Districts assigned to District Registrars by

Orders in Council.

6. In and for the purposes of this Order:—
"Court District" means a County Court

District.

Court Town" means the town or place in which Courts are to be holden in a County. in conjunction with a District.

" Parish" means a place for which a separate poor rate is or can be made, or for which a separate overseer is or can be appointed, and the boundaries of each such parish shall be those constituted and limited on the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and

ninety-seven.

Union" means a parish or union of parishes for which there is a separate board of guardians elected under "The Poor Law Amendment Act, 1834," and the Acts amending the same, and shall include a board of guardians or other body of persons performing under any local Act the like functions to a board of guardians under the said Acts, and the boundaries of each such Union shall be those constituted and limited on the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.
