ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering Name of Union and Places:-

Parish of Great Farringdon and Township of Little Farringdon.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Farringdon Union;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes and Townships comprised in the said Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876," it is enacted as follows:—

"The Local Government Board may, when "they see fit, by their Order change the name of any Union, and direct how such change of name shall be published; no such change of name shall affect any rights or obligations of, or securities given by or to, the said Union, or render defective any legal proceedings instituted by or against the said Union; and any legal proceedings may be continued or commenced by or against the said Union by their new name which might have been continued or commenced by or against the Union by their former name."

And whereas by an Order dated the let day of

And whereas by an Order dated the 1st day of January, 1835, the Poor Law Commissioners declared that the several Parishes and Places specified in the margin thereof should be united for the administration of the laws for the relief of the Poor, and the Union so constituted has since been known by the name of the Farringdon Union;

And whereas two of such Parishes and Places were described in the said Order in the following manner:—

"Great Farringdon,"
"Little Farringdon."

And whereas in pursuance of an Order of the Poor Law Commissioners dated the 1st day of January, 1836, a certain other Parish was added to the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that the name of the said Union should be changed, and that the first above-cited Order should be altered, as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as

ARTICLE I.—From and after the seventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, the name of the said Union shall be changed to the Faringdon Union, and the Guardians of the Poor thereof shall be described as the Guardians of the Poor of the Faringdon Union.

ARTICLE II.—From and after the said date the said Order dated the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, shall be altered by the substitution therein of "Great Faringdon,"
Little Faringdon"

for the names by which those Parishes or Places

are designated in that Order.

ARTICLE III.—The said Guardians shall cause this Order to be published for two successive weeks within one month from the date hereof in some

newspaper circulating within the Union.
