Presentations.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Ladies to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations at each Drawing Room is limited to 200.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levces.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Croydon) Order, February, 1899.
Dated 20th February, 1899.
WHEREAS by "The Wild Birds Protection

Act, 1880," the killing or taking of any kind of Wild Bird during the period between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in any year was prohibited:

And whereas, by an Order of the Secretary of State, dated the 6th day of July, 1898, this period was extended, so far as concerns the County Borough of Croydon, so as to commence on the 1st day of February and end on the 31st day of

August in every year:
Now, I, the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds

Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and for special reasons which have been placed before me in an application from the Council of the said County Borough of Croydon, do hereby make the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Croydon) Order,

2. During the period from the 1st September in any year to the 31st January following, the taking or killing of any kind of Wild Bird on Sundays is prohibited within the County Borough of Croydon.

THE Secretary for Scotland hereby gives notice that the following Order has been made by him under the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, upon the application of the County Council of Argyll :-

SCOTLAND .- NORTHERN DISTRICT. The Wild Birds Protection (County of Argyll)

Order, 1899.
WHEREAS by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, as applying to Scotland, it is, amongst other things, provided as follows:

Firstly.—Any person who between the first day of March and the first day of August in any year shall knowingly and wilfully shoot or attempt to shoot, or shall use any boat for the purpose of shooting or causing to be shot, any Wild Bird, or shall use any lime, trap, snare, net, or other instrument for the purpose of taking any Wild Bird, or shall expose or offer for sale, or shall have in his control or possession after the fifteenth day of March, any Wild Bird recently killed or taken, shall, on conviction of any such offence before the Sheriff, in the case of any Wild Bird which is included in the schedule hereunto annexed, forfeit and pay for every such bird in respect of which an offence has been committed a sum not exceeding one pound, and, in the case of any other Wild Bird, shall for a first offence be reprimanded and discharged on payment of costs, and for every subsequent offence forfeit and pay for every such Wild Bird in respect of which an offence is committed a sum of money not exceeding five shillings in addition to the costs. This section shall not apply to the owner or occupier of any land, or to any person authorized by the owner or occupier of any land, killing or taking any Wild Bird on such land not included in the Schedule hereto annexed.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Poor Law Unions Association (Expenses) Act, 1898 :-

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions in England and Wales; And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Poor Law Unions Association (Expenses) Act, 1898, recites that it is proposed that an Association of Poor Law Unions in England and Wales should be formed for the purposes of consultation as to their common interests and the discussion of matters relating to the poor law and other matters relating to their powers and duties;

And whereas by Section 1 of the said Act it is enacted as follows :-

"1. The guardians of any poor law union may, "when empowered by and subject to any regulations made by the Local Government "Board, which regulations the said Board is "hereby authorized from time to time to make, vary, or rescind, pay any sum not "exceeding live pounds in any one year as "an annual or other subscription to the funds " of the Association as well as the reasonable "expenses of the attendance of representa-"tives, not exceeding in any case two, at "meetings of the Association, and may "charge such payments to their common "fund, or if they have no common fund to "the fund under their control. Provided "that no payment shall be made by the "guardians in respect of the attendance of "any representative at a meeting of the "Association unless the attendance of such "representative at that meeting shall have "been expressly authorized by a resolution "passed at a meeting of the guardians held "after not less than seven days' notice in " writing that the proposal is to be considered "at such meeting of the guardians has been sent to each guardian. Any such repre-"sentative shall be either a guardian of the " poor law union or (without power of voting) "the clerk to the guardians of the union."

And whereas by Section 2 of the said Act it is further enacted as follows:-

"2. No payment shall be made in pursuance " of this Act until the Local Government "Board have certified that the Association has been established."

And whereas an Association called The Association of Poor Law Unions in England and Wales has been formed for the purposes referred to in the said Act, and it is expedient that the regulations hereinafter set forth should be made with regard to subscriptions by Guardians of Poor Law Unions to the funds of such Association, and the payment of the reasonable expenses of the attendance of representatives at meetings

of such Association:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government
Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, do, by this Our Order, certify that The Association of Poor Law Unions in England and Wales has been established for the purposes of consultation as to the common interests of such Unions, and the discussion of matters relating to the Poor Law, and other matters relating to their powers and duties.

And We do hereby empower the Guardians of the Poor of any Poor Law Union in England and Wales to pay any sum not exceeding five pounds in any one year as an annual or other subscription to the funds of the said Association, as well as the reasonable expenses of the attendance of repre- hundred and ninety-six.
