By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department, London, March 3, 1899.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Lourenco Marques, intimating that the entrance into any of the ports of the Province is forbidden to sailing vessels or dhows bringing cargo or proceeding from any country either infected with, or, even suspected of, plague, and that vessels without sickness on board, or those whose voyages had lasted for more than the maximum time of incubation of plague, are liable to thorough fumigation before admission. The following articles are liable to be denied admission, viz. :- Rags and paper, old newspapers, all secondhand clothing, sacking, wrapping cloth, carpets and mats that have been used, hides, hoofs, horns, bones, claws, and all refuse of animals, skins, silk in bulk and wool, and hair to be used by hairdressers or for other commercial purposes.

THE Board of Trade bave received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Washington, enclosing the following Quarantine Notice issued by the United States Government, viz.:-

Circular No. 8. Division of Customs and Insular Affairs. War Department, Was ington, February 1, 1899.

The following order of the President, relative to quarantine regulations for ports in Cuba and Porto Rico, is hereby published for the information and guidance of all concerned:

Executive Mansion, Washington,

January 17, 1899.

To prevent the introduction of epidemic disease, it is ordered that the provisions of the Act of Congress, approved February 15, 1893, entitled "An Act granting additional quarantine powers and imposing additional duties upon the Marine Hospital Service," and all rules and regulations heretofore prescribed by the Secretary of the Treasury under that Act, are to be given full

force and effect in the Islands of Cuba and Porto Rico, and the following additional rules and regu-

lations are hereby promulgated:-

The examination in ports of the islands of Cuba and Porto Rico of incoming and outgoing vessels and the necessary surveillance over their sanitary condition as well as of cargo, passengers, crew, and of all personal effects, is vested in and will be conducted by the Marine Hospital Service, and medical officers will be detailed by the Secretary of the Treasury as quarantine officers at the ports of Havana, Matanzas, Ciensuegos and Santiago immediately, and at other ports in the islands of Cuba and Porto Rico as soon as practicable necessary. Quarantine officers shall have authority over vessels, their wharfage and anchorage in infected seaports, in so far as is necessary to prevent the infection of vessels or their personnel, and all vessels, including vessels of the Army Transport Service and merchant vessels, leaving ports coastwise the islands of Cuba or Porto Rico for the United States or for other ports in the islands of Cuba or Porto Rico, vessels of the United States Navy excepted. Quarantine officers will enforce necessary measures on incoming vessels through col-lectors of customs at ports of entry, who will not permit entry without quarantine certificates, and bill of health shall not be given to an outgoing vessel unless all quarantine regulations have been complied with. All officers of the Army Transport Service and medical officers of the Army and Marine Hospital Service on duty on Army transports will use every precaution to prevent danger of exposure to infection of crews while in ports in the islands of Cuba or Porto Rico.

Since the quarantine service herein provided is for the protection of the islands of Cuba and Porto Rico as well as the protection of the United States against both, the expenses arising therefrom will be charged at present both against the revenues of these islands and the epidemic fund; said expenses will be divided equally against both, payments, however, to be made out of the epidemic fund and reimbursement made thereto from the revenues of the islands of Cuba and Porto Rico. - 1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Byelaws and Regulations.
- 2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.
 - 3. No passenger shall smoke inside any carriage,
- 4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.
- 5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
- 6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.
- 7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.
- 8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.
- 9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized officer of the Company, the fare legally demanded for the journey.
- 10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any: duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also, when required to do so, either deliver up his ticket, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.
- 11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.
- 12. Any passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, using any of the carriages set apart for the use of artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers, shall pay the regular fare.

13. Artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, who have previously provided themselves with the proper tickets may, at the discretion of the Company and at such times as may be advertised, be carried on any of the regular carriages of the Company provided they do not contravene Section 8 of these Bye-laws.

14. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

15. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

16. No person, except a passenger or intended passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein otherwise

than on a seat provided for passengers.

17. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

18. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a con-

spicuous position on the carriage.

19. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

20. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

21. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request of the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

22. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Company with loaded fire-arms.

23. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company.

24. The conductor of any carriage shall en-force or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and

Regulations to the best of his ability.

25. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty
