Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that

there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

**T**HE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities &c. of the Urban District Council of Bridlington, in the East Riding of Yorkshire, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Acts 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

And whereas in the month of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven certain inhabitant householders of the Urban District of Bridlington, in the East Riding of Yorkshire, petitioned Her Majesty the Queen, praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation:

And whereas the said petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the Charter and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof:

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Acts, 1858 and 1861, the Local Board for the district of Bridlington (hereinafter called "the Local Board") was in the year one

thousand eight hundred and sixty-three constituted and became invested with various powers and duties, and the Local Board was constituted the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Local Government District of Bridlington :

And whereas by a Provisional Order dated the sixteenth June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and confirmed by "The Local Government Supplemental Act, 1865," the Local Board were empowered to put in force within the said Local Government District the powers contained in "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," and "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860," with respect to the purchase and taking of certain lands otherwise than by agreement for the purpose of enabling the Local Board to improve existing and make new streets and promenades and a sea wall and promenade thereon, and for other purposes connected therewith respectively, and the said Local Board exercised some of the powers contained in such Order, and improved the then existing streets and promenades, and constructed a sea wall and promenade thereon :

And whereas by an Indenture bearing date the thirtieth June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four (duly enrolled in the office of Land Revenue Records) and made between the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty of the first part, and the Honourable Charles Alexander Gore of the second part, and the Local Board of the third part, for the consideration therein stated the said Charles Alexander Gore as Commissioner of Her Majesty's Woods, Forests, and Land Revenues, granted and conveyed to the Local Board, their successors and assigns, for ever, certain foreshore lands between high and low water marks for the purposes of the several Local Government Acts, 1858 and 1851 :

And whereas, by a Provisional Order, dated the tenth April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and confirmed by "The Local Government Supplemental Act, 1866," the Local Board were empowered to borrow for the execution and completion of works of a permanent nature a sum or sums altogether not exceeding in the whole two years' assessable value of the premises assessable under the said "Local Government Act, 1858," within the said Local Government District, and the said Local Board thereupon exercised such borrowing powers :

And whereas by a Provisional Order, dated the tenth May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Bridlington, &c.) Act, 1877, the area of the said Local Government District was extended by including therein portions of the parish of Bessingby, and the township of Hilderthorpe, and a portion of the township of Sewerby-with-Martton :

And whereas by a Provisional Order, dated the twenty-ninth March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1887, the Local Board were empowered to put in force with reference to certain land required for the construction of a public walk or promenade and for the erection of a sea wall in connection therewith the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, and the said Local Board thereupon exercised and put in force the powers contained in such Provisional Order :

And whereas by the Bridlington Local Board Act, 1889 (in this scheme referred to as "the Act of

1889") the Local Board were empowered amongst other things to make charges for admission to the said sea wall and promenade (in the said Act referred to as "the Prince's Parade") ; to pay for a band for the performance of music within the district ; to maintain, lay out, improve, and extend the Prince's Parade ; to make provision for regulating street traffic, and to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding ten thousand pounds for the purpose of extending and improving the said Prince's Parade and sea wall and promenade :

And whereas by the Bridlington Local Board Act, 1894 (in this Scheme referred to as "the Act of 1894") the Local Board were empowered to take conveyances of and hold the properties mentioned and described in the first and second Schedules to the said Act and to borrow money for certain purposes defined by that Act, and the said Act defined more clearly the boundary of the district seawards ; and contained other provisions in connection with the better government of the said Local Government District :

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Local Board became the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Bridlington (hereinafter called "the District Council") :

And whereas by an Order of the County Council of the East Riding of Yorkshire, dated the thirtieth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four and duly confirmed by the County of the East Riding of Yorkshire (Bridlington, &c.) Confirmation Order, 1894, the area of the said district was extended by including therein a further part of the parish of Bessingby, parts of the township or parish of Sewerby-cum-Martton, and other parts of the township or parish of Hilderthorpe, and the parts of the townships or parishes of Sewerby-cum-Martton and Bessingby, included in the said district as so extended were united to and amalgamated with the parish of Bridlington, and the parts of the township or parish of Hilderthorpe included in the said district as so extended were united to form a separate parish to be known as the parish of Hilderthorpe.

And whereas under and by virtue of a Charter dated the sixth December, one thousand two hundred, granted by His Majesty King John, and subsequently by virtue of divers assurances in the law, and ultimately by an Indenture bearing date the sixth May, one thousand six hundred and thirty-six, the control and benefit of all Markets, Fairs, and Statute Hirings Rights "at Bridlington," were vested in thirteen inhabitants (tenants and freeholders of the Manor of Bridlington), who by the said Indenture were designated Lords Feoffees, and the same Indenture contained provisions for the appointment of successors to the said Lords Feoffees and the appointment of Assistant Lords ; for the levying of a rate upon the tenants and freeholders of the said Manor, for the purpose, amongst other things, of maintaining the port and pier of Bridlington with the haven thereof, for the public good, both of the said town and of the county thereabouts, and in discharging other common charges of the town.

And whereas by an Act of Parliament passed in the first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, cap. one hundred and ten, intitled "An Act for improving the Piers and Harbour of Bridlington in the East Riding of the county of York, and for rendering the same more safe and commodious as a Harbour of Refuge," all prior Acts relating to the said piers and harbour were repealed, and the right and property of and in the then present harbour and of and in the then present and future piers, jetties, and all other works in any

way appertaining to the said harbour, and of and in all offices and other property therein described, were thereby absolutely vested in the Commissioners for the time being executing that Act, and by sections seventy-three to seventy-seven, both inclusive, of the said Act, powers were conferred on the said Commissioners to make an annual assessment or rate of not less amount than four piers rates (as the same had been anciently and usually estimated) and to be laid upon and raised by the proprietors of hereditaments in Bridlington liable to contribute towards the repairs of the said piers and harbour; and it was enacted that the Justices of the East Riding of Yorkshire, in Quarter Sessions assembled, should make an order for the levying and raising of such rate, and direct the order to the Lords Feoffees for the time being, who were to collect such rate and pay the same to the said Commissioners, to be applied by them to the purposes of the now reciting Act; and provision was made for ascertaining what premises were liable to be rated, and for settling the amount of the rates, and it was provided that the rates were to be recoverable by distress:

And whereas the said Lords Feoffees and their Assistants still levy and collect from certain inhabitants of Bridlington the said rate, and pay the proceeds thereof to the present Commissioners acting under the said last-mentioned Act:

And whereas by a scheme for the management of certain charities in Bridlington, established by an Order of the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales, made under the Charitable Trusts Acts, 1853 to 1869, on the fourth February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, it was provided that one of the body of Trustees thereby constituted should be the Chairman for the time being of the Local Board for the District of Bridlington, and that in case the said Chairman should in any other capacity be or become a Trustee of the Charities, the said Local Board should elect some other member of such Board to be a Trustee as the case required.

And whereas by a scheme under the Endowed Schools Acts, 1869, 1873, and 1874, approved by Her Majesty in Council on the twenty-ninth January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, there were made into one Foundation under the name of "The Bridlington Grammar School," certain charitable foundations and funds in Bridlington, including an annual sum of fifty pounds, contributed by the said Lords Feoffees for five years from the opening of the school; and amongst other provisions in the said scheme is one enabling the Local Board to appoint two Representative Governors to assist in administering the said Foundation:

And whereas by a scheme established by an Order of the said Board of Charity Commissioners made under the Charitable Trusts Acts, 1853 to 1894, on the seventeenth May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, it was provided that the said Lords Feoffees and Assistants as the Trustees of the Charity known as the Town Trust or Lords Estate in Bridlington, should pay out of the endowment of the Charity to the Governors of the Bridlington Grammar School as a permanent grant in aid of the School—

- (a.) A yearly sum of sixty pounds; or
- (b.) In the event of the sale of the Market and Fair Tolls of the Manor of Bridlington belonging to the said Charity known as the Town Trust or Lords Estate, a capital sum of not less than one thousand eight hundred pounds:

And whereas by a scheme established by an

Order of the said Board of Charity Commissioners made under the Charitable Trusts Acts, 1853 to 1894, on the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, altering the said scheme of the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, regulating the Bridlington Grammar School, it was provided that the payment of the said yearly sum of sixty pounds or of the said capital sum of one thousand eight hundred pounds should be in substitution for the aforesaid annual sum of fifty pounds for five years:

And whereas, in pursuance of a resolution passed at a meeting of the Vestry of the parish of Bridlington, Her Majesty's Secretary of State did on the ninth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, signify his approval under and by virtue of the powers contained in twenty and twenty-one Victoria chapter eighty-one (section nine), and thirty-four and thirty-five Victoria chapter thirty-three (section one), of the appointment of a Burial Board for a district in such parish consisting of the townships of Bridlington, Buckton, Easton, Hilderthorpe, Speeton, Wilsthorpe, and such part of Sewerby-cum-Marton as was then in the Ecclesiastical District of Christ Church Bridlington Quay, each of which townships maintained its own poor; and a Burial Board was duly formed accordingly:

And whereas no portion of the above-mentioned townships of Buckton, Easton, Speeton, and Wilsthorpe, are situate or included in the said Urban District of Bridlington:

And whereas, since the formation of the said Burial Board (namely by the hereinbefore mentioned Provisional Order of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and by the hereinbefore mentioned Order of the County Council for the East Riding of Yorkshire), portions of the beforenamed townships or parishes of Sewerby-cum-Marton and Hilderthorpe respectively, have been included in the Urban District, and the remaining portions of those two townships are in the jurisdiction of the Rural District Council of Bridlington:

And whereas by virtue of "The Local Government Act, 1894," section fifty-three (subsections two and three) the powers and duties of the said Burial Board or authority together with its property debts and liabilities were thereby transferred to and were thenceforth to be exercised by and credited and charged to a joint committee appointed by the District Council and the parish councils or parish meetings of the rural parishes wholly or partly comprised within the area of the said Burial Authority:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for continuing in the said Burial Authority all the powers and duties together with its property debts and liabilities heretofore exercised and held by the said Burial Authority as by this Scheme mentioned:

And whereas the Bridlington Gas Company under the provisions of "The Bridlington Gas Act, 1886" (forty-nine and fifty Victoria chapter thirty-five) are empowered to manufacture and supply gas within the District of the Local Board as existing at the date of the said Act:

And whereas under and by virtue of an Act for incorporating and conferring powers on the Bridlington Water Company fifty-eight and fifty-nine Victoria cap. one hundred and fifteen (hereinafter called "the Water Act of 1895") the Company so incorporated were empowered to maintain waterworks and to supply water within the limits defined in the said Act, and they have

accordingly maintained waterworks and have thereunder supplied water within their water limits: and by section ninety of the said Act power was reserved to the District Council with the consent of the Local Government Board to purchase, and the Company to sell, the Undertaking of the said Water Company on the terms and conditions therein appearing.

And whereas the District Council have in accordance with the terms of the Water Act of 1895, resolved to purchase the Undertaking of the said Water Company, and have given to the Company notice in writing under their Common Seal, of their desire so to purchase, and the consent of the Local Government Board to such purchase has been obtained as required by the said Act, but the negotiation for the sale and purchase of such undertaking has not yet been completed:

And whereas it is expedient that as from the time when the District Council shall have purchased the undertaking of the said Water Company, and taken and obtained a conveyance thereof together with all the property rights, powers and privileges of the Company, provision should be made for the continuance, transfer, vesting, and extension of the water undertaking of the said Water Company, and other the property, rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or acquired under the Water Act of 1895, as by this scheme mentioned:

And whereas under and by virtue of "The Light Railways Act, 1896," an Order entitled "The Flamborough and Bridlington Light Railways Order, 1897," has been made with the sanction of the Board of Trade (dated twenty-first March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight), authorizing the construction of light railways between Flamborough and Bridlington, whereby the District Council are empowered in conjunction with the company acting under the Order to expend moneys in and about certain street improvements in Bridlington: to make bye-laws regulating the user of such railways when constructed: and to purchase as therein stated the entire undertaking of the Company either solely or in conjunction with the Rural District Council of Bridlington, and after such purchase to work the said railways:

And whereas under and by virtue of the said "Light Railways Act, 1896," another Order entitled "The Flamborough and Bridlington Light Railways Order, 1898," has been made with the sanction of the Board of Trade extending the time for compulsory purchase of lands, increasing the capital of the Company, and other purposes:

And whereas under the provisions of "The Local Government Act, 1858," and Acts amending the same, the Local Board from time to time with the sanction of the Secretary of State for the Home Department being one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, made Bye-laws for the better Government of the Town in respect of the Making of New Streets and Erecting New Buildings (1st August, 1866), the Regulation of Slaughter-houses (18th February, 1864), the Regulation of Common Lodging-houses (13th February, 1864), with regard to the Prevention of Nuisances (1st August, 1866), as to the Cleansing of Footways, etc. (13th February, 1864), as to Public Bathing (13th February, 1864), and from time to time with the sanction of the Local Government Board made Bye-laws as to Pleasure-boats and Vessels (6th June, 1891), as to Hackney Carriages (6th June, 1891), as to Horses, Ponies, Mules, or Asses, Standing or Plying for Hire (6th June, 1891), and as to Control and User of the Prince's Parade (21st May, 1895):

And whereas the Local Board on the third of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, made Regulations under the Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops Order of 1885.

And whereas under and by virtue of "The Elementary Education Act, 1870," and the various Acts amending the same, a School Board was formed in the year 1878 for the United School District of Bridlington, comprising the parishes of Bessingby, Bridlington, Easton, and Hildorthorpe (hereinafter called "the Bridlington (United District) School Board"):

And whereas the area of the municipal borough created by the Charter contains a part of the district of the Bridlington (United District) School Board, namely, the parishes of Bridlington and Hildorthorpe, as constituted and defined by the hereinbefore mentioned Provisional Order of 1877, and by the hereinbefore mentioned Order of the County Council for the East Riding of Yorkshire and the remaining portions of the area in the jurisdiction of the District of the Bridlington (United District) School Board, namely, the present parishes of Bessingby and Easton are for all other than educational purposes within the jurisdiction of the Rural District Council of Bridlington, and it is expedient that in this scheme certain provisions should be made with respect to the Bridlington (United District) School Board and the said Rural District Council.

And whereas the District Council, the said Lords Feoffees of the Manor of Bridlington, the said Burial Authority, the Bridlington (United District) School Board and the School Attendance Committee of the said Rural District Council of Bridlington are Local Authorities within the meaning of the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885.

And whereas this scheme was before being settled by the Committee of Council referred for consideration to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to the Local Government Board, to the Board of Trade, and to the Committee of the Lords of the Privy Council on Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Education Department"):

And whereas it is expedient that the County Council of the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire should retain in and for the borough of Bridlington all the powers duties and liabilities in relation to the several matters set out in section thirty-nine of "The Local Government Act, 1888," which have heretofore been exercisable by or attached to the said County Council.

And whereas it is expedient that a scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order, and declare, as follows:—

This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Bridlington Scheme, 1899.

This Scheme when confirmed shall be deemed to have come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough created by the said charter, and this scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this scheme." So far as may be necessary this scheme shall operate retrospectively.

From and after the commencement of this Scheme the municipal borough, created by the said charter, shall be placed within the jurisdiction of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Bridlington, acting by the Council of the borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

The District Council, their powers, duties, rights, obligations, and privileges shall continue, and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said charter or the creation of the said borough, and the District Council shall from the date of the grant of the charter until the commencement of this scheme be deemed to have been continued and continue to enjoy be subject to and exercise the said powers duties rights obligations liabilities and privileges as if no such charter had been granted and all their acts from the date of the grant of the said charter until the commencement of this scheme shall be and shall be deemed to have been as valid and effectual as if no such charter had been granted. From and after the commencement of this scheme the District Council shall be and the same is hereby abolished.

Upon completion of the purchase by the District Council as hereinbefore mentioned, the water undertaking of the Bridlington Water Company, and every power, right, duty, capacity, liability, obligation, or property exercisable by, attaching to, or vested in the District Council by reason of such purchase under the Water Act of 1895 shall pass to, be exercisable by, attach to and vest in the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Bridlington, acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

No act or omission done or made or purporting to be done or made under the proposed purchase of the water undertaking for the borough between the commencement of this Scheme and the confirmation thereof by Parliament or Order in Council (as the case may be) shall be invalidated by this scheme, but such act or omission shall be and continue valid if the same would have been valid but for the retrospective operation of this scheme.

The said Burial Authority, their powers, duties, obligations and privileges, and their property debts and liabilities shall continue and be deemed to have continued until the commencement of this Scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the creation of the said borough, and immediately from and after the commencement of this scheme, the powers, duties, obligations and privileges exercised by, and the property debts and liabilities of the said Burial Authority so far as they are exercised and held by such Authority as representative of, or vested in the District Council shall pass to, be exercisable by, attach to, and vest in the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Bridlington, acting by the Council, as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

Under the scheme for the management of certain charities in Bridlington, established by the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales, on the fourth February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, the Mayor for the time being of the borough of Bridlington, shall, unless otherwise qualified to be a Trustee, be one of the body of trustees constituted by such Order in the place of the Chairman for the time being of the District Council, and every power, privilege, obligation and liability attaching to the said Chairman, and the said District Council, respec-

tively, as in such scheme is contained shall pass to, be exercisable by, and attach to, and vest in the Mayor, and the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Bridlington, acting by the Council of the said borough respectively.

All the rights, interests, powers, property, obligations, and liabilities whatsoever of the Local Board or District Council by virtue of the hereinbefore recited Provisional Orders and Acts of 1863, 1864, 1865, 1866, 1877, 1887, 1889, and 1894; the hereinbefore recited indenture of 30th June 1864; the Order of the County Council for the East Riding of Yorkshire of 30th July, 1894; the Scheme of the Charity Commissioners of 4th February, 1870; the Scheme under the Endowed Schools Acts of 29th January, 1891; and the Schemes of the Charity Commissioners of 17th and 27th May, 1895; the Authority of the Secretary of State of the 9th October, 1873; the "Bridlington Gas Act, 1886"; the Water Act of 1895; the "Flamborough and Bridlington Light Railways Orders, 1897 and 1898"; the Order of the Education Department of the 14th May, 1879, creating the Bridlington (United District) School Board; the said Acts or Orders, Schemes, Agreement, or Authority, as altered before the commencement of this Scheme by any General or Local Acts, Orders, Schemes, Agreements, or Authorities, shall be transferred to, vested in, devolve upon, and be exercisable by, and shall be enforceable against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Bridlington.

Any bye-laws made by the Local Board or District Council, and any regulations made under the Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops Order of 1885, and in force within the Urban District of Bridlington at the commencement of this Scheme, shall, for the period of one year from the commencement of this Scheme, unless repealed or revoked by other bye-laws or regulations before the expiration of such period be in force and have operation within the borough of Bridlington in like manner, and with the like effect in all respects, as if the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Bridlington, and that borough were referred to therein instead of the Local Board or District Council, as the case may be, and their district.

Only that portion of the borough of Bridlington which was comprised within the district of the Local Board at the date of "The Bridlington Gas Act, 1886," shall be deemed to be within the limits of that Act, but the whole of the said borough shall be deemed to be within the limits of the Water Act of 1895, and "The Water Act of 1895" shall apply and extend accordingly.

All rights, properties, liabilities, or obligations vested in or attached to the District Council under "The Public Health Act, 1875," or any Act amending or enlarging the same with respect to or for the purposes of the Urban District of Bridlington, shall pass to, be exercisable by or against, vest in or attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the borough.

Notwithstanding the creation of the borough, the district of Bridlington shall be and continue a United School District, and the School Board for the district of Bridlington shall continue to be the School Board for such district to the same extent, and in the same manner in all respects as if at the time of the formation of the district of Bridlington by the Education Department, the said district had been formed by uniting the said borough and the parishes of Bessingby and Easton not included in the said borough, and the said

School Board had been formed for a United School District formed as last aforesaid, and everything in connection with the said Board and district shall be done and had accordingly provided, however, that every act or omission done or made by the School Board of the district of Bridlington, or in respect of the district of Bridlington before the commencement of this scheme shall be valid and effectual for all purposes in the same manner as if the said borough had been created coincidentally with the commencement of this scheme, and any Bye-laws made by the School Board in force at the date of this scheme shall continue in force.

The Council of the borough shall not exercise any of the powers or duties or be subject to the liabilities under any of the Acts relating to the police force or other matters mentioned in section thirty-nine of "The Local Government Act, 1888," but all the powers, duties and liabilities in respect of such matters shall be exercised by and attached to the County Council of the administrative county of the East Riding of Yorkshire, and the area of the borough shall for all purposes of the Acts relating to the county police force or other matters mentioned in the said section form part of the county in like manner as if it were not a borough.

In case any officer of the District Council, who shall have been employed by the Local Board or District Council for a period of five years, shall not be employed by the Council of the borough, nor offered by the Council a position in their employ of a similar character, and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid, by way of compensation for the loss of his position, out of the funds of or under the control of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Bridlington, acting by the Council as the Urban Sanitary Authority for the borough, such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury or any two or more of them to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position, and the said Commissioners in awarding the said compensation shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of the Superannuation Act, 1859, to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his office. Provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act, stating any special grounds for granting such allowance shall be necessary or be made. Provided, nevertheless, that if any such officer be so employed by the said Council and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within two years of the commencement of this scheme, he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Council. Provided that the term "Officer" shall include only persons employed by the Local Board or District Council whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month, and no other persons. Provided also that the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the sole judges as to the right, title, or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever, and as to the amount thereof, and the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause, and further every determination of the said Lords Commissioners upon any such right, title, claim, amount, or question shall be absolutely final and conclusive, and every such

officer shall have such rights only under this clause as the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them consider just and reasonable. Any determination of the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them may be evidenced by writing under the hands of any two of them.

The accounts of the District Council and their officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner, and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions, and right of appeal, as if the Charter had not been granted; the provisions of sections two hundred and forty-seven and two hundred and fifty of the "Public Health Act, 1875," as amended by the "District Auditors Act, 1879," and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards, and Urban District Councils, and of their officers shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this scheme with respect to the District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character, and operation to the purposes of such audit. Any sums certified to be due from any person by the District Auditor at such audit shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the borough.

The District Fund and General District Rate of the borough of Bridlington shall take the place of and be substituted for the District Fund and General District Rate respectively of the District Council and all sums of money respectively payable to from or out of and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the District Fund or General District Rate of the Urban District shall be paid to from or out of and shall be charged upon the said District Fund and General District Rate of the said borough respectively.

*Saving for Rates, &c.*

Notwithstanding the incorporation of the borough and the provisions of this scheme all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things made, entered into or done before the commencement of this scheme, by, to, or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been made, entered into or done by, to, or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council and may be proceeded on and enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and been named or referred to therein.

**Carnarvonshire.**—An Area comprising the parishes of Llanwnda, Llandwrog, Llanllyfni, and Clynog, in the county of Carnarvon (8 April, 1899).

**Cheshire.**—An Area comprising the parishes of Odd Rode, Moreton-cum-Alcum Low, Newbold Astbury, Hulme Walfield, Buglawton, Eaton, North Rode, Bosley, and that portion of the parish of Somerford, formerly known as Radnor, in the county of Chester, and also comprising the borough of Congleton (21 March, 1899).

**Denbighshire.**—An Area comprising the petty sessional division of Isaled, and the parishes of Llangynhafal, Llanychan, and Llanyyns Rural, in the county of Denbigh, and also comprising the borough of Denbigh (16 January, 1899).
