It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that

there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities &c. of the Urban District Council of Dukinfield, in the county of Chester, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Acts 1882 and 1885" it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the Urban District of Dukinfield in the county of Chester have petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council.

And whereas it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the said Charter and Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Council was pleased to approve the grant of a Charter so doing.

And whereas under and by virtue of a Provisional Order of the General Board of Health dated the twelfth day of February one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven made in pursuance

of "The Public Health Act 1848" and confirmed by "The Public Health Supplemental Act 1857" a Local Board of Health was created of and for so much of the township of Dukinfield as was not included within the limits or boundaries of the town of Stalybridge, and was invested with various powers and duties.

And whereas under and by virtue of "The Local Government Act 1894" the Local Board of Health became the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Dukinfield.

And whereas the said Urban District Council is an Urban Sanitary Authority under "The Public Health Act 1875" and the said district is an Urban Sanitary District.

And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the tenth June one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four the said Local Board of Health was constituted a Burial Board for the said district.

And whereas under and by virtue of the provisions of the Ashton-under-Lyne Stalybridge and Dukinfield (District) Waterworks Acts 1870 to 1892 and of a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the eighteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 5) Act 1883" powers were given to the inhabitants and ratepayers of the township of Dukinfield to demand and obtain a copious and sufficient supply of good water for household and trade purposes at certain fixed charges in such Acts specifically defined together with privileges in such Acts contained.

And whereas by Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the ninth May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 13) Act 1894" the Urban Sanitary District of Dukinfield and the borough of Stalybridge were formed into a united district to be called the Stalybridge and Dukinfield Joint Sewerage District for the purpose of making and maintaining a joint main or intercepting sewer for the reception and disposal of the sewage from sewers of the constituent districts and for the purchase of land and the erecting maintaining and working of such works plant and machinery as might be required for conveying the sewage of the said united district to the said land so to be purchased as aforesaid.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board, dated the nineteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 11) Act 1898 the boundaries of the borough of Ashton-under-Lyne and the Urban District of Dukinfield were altered as set forth in the said Provisional Order.

And whereas under and by virtue of the provisions of the Dukinfield and Denton Local Boards (Gas) Act 1877 and the Denton and Haughton (Gas) Act 1880 as amended by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the fifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 8) Act 1884"; a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the twenty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 6) Act 1886," a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, confirmed by "The Local

Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 11) Act 1886," and by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 13) Act 1889," the said Urban District Council are the owners of certain gas works and the plant thereon and have certain powers and liabilities of making and supplying gas to the inhabitants and ratepayers of the township of Dukinfield at certain fixed charges in such Acts defined together with privileges in such Acts contained.

And whereas the said Urban District Council of Dukinfield and the School Board for the district of Dukinfield are local authorities within the meaning of Part XI of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1832" and it is expedient that all rights, powers, property and liability vested in or attaching to the said Urban District Council so far as the same relate to the area of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter, should be transferred to and vest in the Council of the borough in manner hereinafter provided, and that provision should be made for the constitution of a School Board for the said borough.

And whereas the said Urban District Council have adopted "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act 1889" and "The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act 1890" (except sections 9, 10 and 12 respectively) "The Public Libraries Acts 1892 and 1893" and "The Private Street Works Act 1892" and it is expedient that the provisions and sections of those Acts should be in force within the borough as if they had been adopted by the Council of the borough.

And whereas it is intended that arrangements shall be made for the consolidation of the Police Force of the borough of Dukinfield when constituted by Charter with the Police Force of the county of Chester.

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made containing the provisions hereinafter contained.

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf the said Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby order and declare as follows:

1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Dukinfield Scheme 1899.

In this Scheme "the Charter" shall mean the said Charter creating the Municipal Borough of Dukinfield. The expression "the Borough" shall mean the said Borough of Dukinfield created by the said Charter. The expression "the Dukinfield Sanitary Authority" shall mean the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Dukinfield, acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough. The expression "the Local Government District" shall mean the Local Government District of Dukinfield, as it existed at the date of the said Charter. The expression "Urban District Council" shall mean the Urban District Council of Dukinfield as constituted by the Local Government Act, 1894, and as it existed at the date of the said Charter.

"Property" wherever mentioned in the Scheme means and includes all property whether real or personal, and all rights and interests, legal or equitable connected therewith, or in respect therewith, and all cases in action and all gas and water rates, and all other rates, and all rights, legal or equitable connected therewith, or in

respect thereof, and all charters, deeds, books, writings, and documents, and all rights and claims to any legal or equitable relief.

2. This Scheme when confirmed shall be deemed to have come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter; and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting; and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

3. The Urban District Council of Dukinfield and all existing local authorities within the said Urban District of Dukinfield and their powers, duties rights obligations liabilities and privileges shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the Charter or the creation of the said borough and the said Council and authorities shall from the date of the grant of the Charter until the commencement of such Scheme be deemed to have continued and continue to enjoy, be subject to, and exercise the said powers duties rights obligations liabilities and privileges as if no such Charter had been granted, and all their acts from the date of the grant of the Charter until the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been as valid and effectual as if no such Charter had been granted.

From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Urban District Council of Dukinfield shall cease to exist.

4. All the powers, authorities, duties, obligations liabilities, privileges, rights, property, whether within or without the borough, held, possessed, enjoyed, or acquired by, or attaching to, or vested in, or belonging to the said Urban District Council under the Technical Instruction Acts, the Public Libraries Acts, the Ashton-under-Lyne Stalybridge and Dukinfield Waterworks Acts 1870 and 1875, the Dukinfield and Denton Local Boards (Gas) Act 1877 and the Denton and Haughton (Gas) Act 1880 and the Acts (if any) amending the same and the said Provisional Order dated the ninth May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, shall pass or be transferred to, be exercisable or enforceable by or against, vest in, or attach to, and be held and enjoyed by or against the Dukinfield Sanitary Authority, and every reference in the said Acts or Orders to the Local Board or Urban District Council shall be deemed and construed to be a reference to the Dukinfield Sanitary Authority and the Dukinfield Sanitary Authority shall be substituted in the said Acts and Orders, and the Contracts thereto scheduled for the Urban District Council for all purposes and every reference or incorporation by the said Acts to or of any provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1875," or the Acts amending or extending the same, applicable in the case of an Urban District Council shall be deemed and construed to be a reference to or incorporation of the corresponding provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1875," and the Act amending the same applicable in the case of an Urban Sanitary Authority of a Municipal Borough and the Dukinfield Sanitary Authority shall be substituted for the said Urban District Council therein. Every contract or contractual engagement entered into by or with the Urban District Council under or by virtue of the said Acts or Orders, or any of them, shall be deemed to have

been entered into by or with the Dukinfield Sanitary Authority.

5. All rights, property, liabilities, or obligations vested in or attaching to the Urban District Council under the Public Health Acts, "The Local Government Act, 1894," or any Act amending or extending the same or incorporated therewith shall pass to be exercisable by or against, vest in, or attach to the Dukinfield Sanitary Authority.

6. The district fund and the general district rate of the borough of Dukinfield shall take the place of and be substituted for the district fund and general district rate respectively of the District Council, and all sums of money respectively payable to, from or out of, and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the district fund or general district rate of the Urban District shall be paid to, from or out of, and shall be charged upon the said district fund and general district rate of the said borough respectively.

7. The Town Clerk of the borough of Dukinfield shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the Clerk to the District Council.

8. Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any property, obligation, debt, liability, or forfeiture vested in, or attaching to, or due to, or incurred by, or on behalf of the Urban District Council, before the commencement of this scheme, may be continued, prosecuted or enforced by or against the Dukinfield Sanitary Authority.

9. The accounts of the Urban District Council and their officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like powers duties provisions and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted; the provisions of sections two hundred and forty-seven and two hundred and fifty of "The Public Health Act 1875" as amended by "The District Auditors Act 1879" and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards or Urban District Councils and of their officers shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the Urban District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time extent character and operation to the purposes of such audit. Any sums certified at such audit to be due from any person by the District Auditor shall be paid by such person to the Borough Treasurer.

10. All the rights, interests, powers, property, obligations and liabilities whatsoever of the Urban District Council acting as the Urban Sanitary Authority of the district of Dukinfield by virtue of the following Acts, namely, "The Public Health Act, 1875," "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889," "The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890," "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890," and any Act amending or extending the same, the Sanitary Acts as defined by "The Public Health Act, 1875," "The Private Street Works Act, 1892," "The Public Libraries Acts, 1892 and 1893," and any local or general Act for purposes the same or similar, to those of the aforesaid Act shall be transferred to, vested in, devolve upon and be exercisable by and shall be enforceable against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Dukinfield.

Bye-Laws.

11. Any bye-laws made by the Local Board or Urban District Council and any regulations made

under the Dairies Cowsheds and Milkshops Order of 1885 and in force at the commencement of this Scheme shall be in force and have operation within the borough in like manner and with the like effect in all respects as if the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough and the borough were referred to therein instead of the Local Board or Urban District Council as the case may be and their district, and shall for the period of one year from the commencement of this Scheme or for such further period as the Local Government Board may sanction, unless repealed revoked or varied by other Bye-laws or Regulations duly made before the expiration of such period, be and continue in force.

School Board.

12. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the School Board of the District shall be the School Board of the borough in all respects to the same extent and in the same manner as if at the time of the formation of the School Board by the Education Department Dukinfield had been a Municipal Borough. All property shall vest and all liabilities shall be attached and everything in connection with the said Board shall be done had and construed accordingly.

Burial Board.

13. With respect to the Burial Board the following provisions shall have effect:—

- (a.) From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Burial Board shall be dissolved and cease to exist.
- (b.) The Council of the borough of Dukinfield shall be substituted for the said Burial Board, and all the rights property powers authorities duties and liabilities vested in devolving upon or exercisable by the said Board shall be transferred to vested in devolve upon and be exercisable by and shall be enforceable against the said Council of the borough and the Council shall be the Burial Board for and within the said borough.
- (c.) The clerk officers and servants of the Burial Board shall become the clerk officers and servants respectively of the Council of the borough acting as the Burial Board of the said borough.
- (d.) All regulations as to fees charges and payments made by the Burial Board and in force at the commencement of this Scheme, shall continue in force until the same are repealed or varied by the Council of the borough in the manner provided by law.

Compensation to Officers.

14. In case any officer of the Urban District Council, or of any other Local Authority for whom the Mayor, Aldermen and the Burgesses of the borough of Dukinfield or the Council of the said borough are respectively substituted who shall have been employed by the Urban District Council or by any such Local Authority, as the case may be, shall not be employed by the Council of the said borough, nor offered by the said Council a position in their employment of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him such officer shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of, or under the control of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury or any two or more of them to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position; and the said Lords Commissioners,

in awarding the said compensation shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of "The Superannuation Act 1859" to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his office provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act stating any special grounds for granting such allowance shall be necessary. Provided nevertheless that if any such officer be so employed by the said Council and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within two years of the first meeting of the Council he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Council. Provided also that the term "officer" shall include any person employed by the District Council or by any Local Authority whose salary or emoluments was, or were, payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other persons. Provided also that the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the sole judges as to the right title or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever and as to the amount thereof; and shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause, and further, every determination of the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them upon any such right title claim amount or question shall be absolutely final and conclusive, and every such officer shall have such rights only under this clause as the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them consider just and reasonable. Any determination of the said Lords Commissioners may be evidenced by writing under the hands of any two of them.
